I have completed the questionnaire so please let me know if you want to pick it up or for me to deliver it.

I have been here about 22 years and every day see people dog walking or just walking by themselves, cycling and using the footpath to the train station (I have done so myself). I was also on the green when a large crowd gathered to watch Sir Bradley Wiggins and fellow cyclists ride past the Shootacre Lane/Picts Lane junction during the 2014 Tour of Britain. There have also been a number of neighbours meetings on the green, some of which I have attended and quite often cyclists meet up on the green in preparation to cycle the Phoenix Trail.

The traffic is really not that bad through Princes Risborough, especially after 9 am when it then runs very smoothly. The only tail backs are caused by the pedestrian crossing opposite Marks & Spencer so why don't they build a bridge and save millions of pounds and avoid blighting our town. As I mentioned before, if all the affected households were to make a united claim for statutory compensation it could well reach in excess of 6 or 7 figures.







- 1 Based on the information provided it is not clear if the road realignment of Shootacre Lane which has taken place pursuant to the Section 278 agreement on planning application 06/05177/FUL has been taken into account on the submitted plan for the proposed Village Green. If the plan takes the realignment into account then there are no other trigger or terminating events on the land.
- 2 If this registration request were successful it could prevent an improvement to the Picts Lane Shootacre Lane junction as set out within the delivery plan for the expansion of Princes Risborough and for which funds have been agreed by Homes England. Given the phasing and viability challenges this would risk undermining the phased delivery of the Princes Risborough relief road and the delivery of community infrastructure necessary for the expansion area as set out in Local Plan Policy PR3 - Princes Risborough Area of Comprehensive Development including Relief Road.

Thank you for consulting the Strategic Planning and Infrastructure team. I apologise for not responding using your preferred method: our response did not fit in the provided box. I am unable to confirm whether a triggering or terminating event has or has not occurred on this piece of land. However, I have conducted some research into the matter to help you determine whether your authority can accept this application and our findings are as follows.

Buckinghamshire County Council (BCC) does not own the land in question, but this land was dedicated for road improvements in 1946 by Mr Goodearl of 'Treswell', Picts Road, Princess Risborough. The land therefore has highways rights/maintenance attached to it.

Secondly there are plans in the Princes Risborough Town Plan to expand the town, which include building a relief road and widening the road: Shootacre Lane is one of the focus areas for this growth in Princes Risborough and Wycombe District Council can advise on this further. It is therefore likely that BCC as the highways authority may need to reserve the right to access the ditches on the boundary of the land if they take highway drainage. It's possible that the land was secured for some future improvement project to the junction. There are gullies along Shootacre Lane which connect to a ditch that runs along the back of this verge, parallel with the field; maintenance access will be required to the ditch going forward.

I would therefore advise that it would be against the interests of the council to approve this application.



- 1.3. The Local Planning Authority is required to identify if the site has been subject to any trigger or terminating events as set out in Schedule 1A of 2006 Commons Act (as inserted by Schedule 4 to the 2013 Growth and Infrastructure Act).

2. Relevant Planning History


- 2.1. 06/05177/FUL - Erection of 1 pair of 3 bed semi-detached, 1 pair of 4 bed semi-detached and 1x 4 bed detached dwellings, 6 x 2 bed & 2 x 1 bed flats in two blocks, creation of new access & alteration to highway layout with associated landscaping and car parking on Land To Rear Of 46 To 52 Picts Lane Princes Risborough – application refused – appeal allowed - implemented

3. Issues and Policy considerations

- 3.1. The above planning application was subject to a S278 agreement which moved the line of the road. It is unclear from the plan provided with the application as to whether this re-alignment has been taken into consideration and whether part of the application forms part of the realigned roadway. If it does this would potentially be a trigger – although the road has been moved and all works would appear to have been completed.
- 3.2. There are no specific policies, specific site allocations or emerging Neighbourhood Plan documents which would result in a trigger.

- 3.3. The expansion of Princes Risborough by around 2500 homes forms part of the adopted Local Plan policy framework. Policy PR3 – Princess Risborough Area of Comprehensive Development Including Relief Road - sets out that as part of the planned expansion of the town a new relief road as a complete alternative to the existing A4010 shall be provided by the development.
- 3.4. Policy PR17 –Princes Risborough Delivery of Infrastructure – sets out how the infrastructure is to be delivered and phased. It states that the development will be assessed against the Council’s capacity and delivery plans for the area.
- 3.5. The Council published the capacity and delivery plans within the Princes Risborough Expansion Supplementary Planning Document (PRESPD) (Consultation Draft) for public consultation in June 2019. Further work and consideration of responses is being undertaken prior to adoption of the PRESPD.
- 3.6. There is a reference within the PRESPD to the land that is the subject of this application. This indicates that it will be necessary to phase the delivery of the relief road as the development progresses to avoid unacceptable impacts on the highway network whilst ensuring that the development remains viable. (The development has qualified for Housing Infrastructure Funds (HIF) as it is considered to be marginally viable.
- 3.7. The delivery plan sets out a phasing that demonstrates how this can be done. It includes a section of road between Picts Lane and A4010 known as the Culverton Link’ (shown on Figure 4 of the Indicative Phasing Plan in the PRESPD) that is to be provided early in the third phase of delivery, (anticipated by construction of 1396 homes).
- 3.8. Prior to the completion of the Culverton link it is proposed to access the expansion area from the south via Picts Lane and Shootacre Lane. An improvement to the horizontal alignment of the Picts Lane/Shootacre Lane junction has been proposed as part of phase one of the relief road in order to accommodate the expected additional vehicular movements, including, potentially some construction traffic, before the Culverton Link is completed.
- 3.9. £12m HIF has been secured from Homes England to progress phase one of the relief road. The business case put forward to Homes England for the funding included within its scope an improvement to the Picts Lane/Shootacre Lane junction.
- 3.10. Work on the design and planning application for phase one of the relief road is underway, led by Balfour Beatty under contract to BCC and this junction improvement is being considered as part of that process. The improvement would require some or all of the land subject to this registration request
- 3.11. If this registration request were successful it could well prevent an improvement to this junction as set out within the delivery plan and for which funds have been agreed by Homes England. Given the phasing and viability challenges this would risk undermining the phased delivery of the relief road and the delivery of community infrastructure necessary for the expansion area.



Dear Alex,

I have reviewed the correspondence pertaining to this matter which has reached sight of Legal services and note that it is evident that both the Highways Authority and the LPA WBC consider that there has been a "trigger event" in relation to the Village Green application site.

The evidence on site would also support the assertion that the land is Highway and whilst I have not been consulted on the application in terms of the matters required to be proven by the applicants, that evidence alone would suggest that they could not establish a claim "as of right".

The legal framework for such applications sets out clear responsibilities in dealing with a village green application and the very first requirement is to establish whether the applicants have a “right” to make an application at all. The Localism Act 2013 inserted new sections into the Commons Registration Act 2006 and in particular in relation to this issue s 15(c) Schedule 1 which excludes the right to apply under s15 (1) of the Act when a trigger event has occurred in relation to that land. Since there are no powers of investigation for the Registration Authority the burden of proof is on the applicant and the Registration Authority are obliged to consult the Planning inspectorate and the Local Planning Authority(s) and ascertain whether they consider there is a trigger event and indeed the guidance accompanying the Act makes clear that the Registration Authority cannot judge this issue without the respective responses. To aid this process the government have included in the guidance a Template letter is annexed for Registration Authorities to use and incorporates the 2013 and subsequent amendments.

The Court of Appeal have also handed down a significant judgement in relation to the scope of trigger events listed in the Act and quite clearly the PREA will be of considerable importance in respect of determining the presence of a trigger event and it is right and proper that the LPA (WDC) consider the issue fully and establish their reasoning in the response to the Registration Authority as this itself will trigger the challenge period and any such challenge will be directed at the Registration Authority. The Registration Authority are entitled therefore to rely on the basis upon which a trigger event has been identified and cannot make a decision on the question of validity of the application without this information. There is no discretion for the Registration Authority to determine validity as all the specific requirements are set down in the law.

The ability of the Registration Authority to “accept” an application for registration of a village green is therefore set down in statute and it appears to me that in the circumstances as known to me you are precluded from accepting the application as valid as firstly, you have not established the existence formally through responses from the LPA of a trigger event and secondly, you are fully aware that there is expected to be a response in the affirmative so that you could not register the application as a valid application.

Your email below suggests that you have “accepted the application” and in doing so acknowledge “validity” and with it the “right” to apply, neither of which can occur under s15(c) if there is a trigger event which you are on notice is the position. In such circumstances the acceptance is at best premature as you do not have the response from the LPA and at worst unlawful and to remedy this situation the application must be acknowledged as received but not “accepted” and if you have purported to “accept “ the application as being valid you will need to withdraw this and rectify the error immediately.

I am not in possession of the form of “acceptance” you have exercised however if it was by letter you will need to write again and notify the recipients that an error has occurred and that the Registration Authority is yet to receive the LPAs position on the existence of a trigger event which will extinguish any right to make an application.

Please provide copies of any relevant correspondence in relation to the purported “acceptance” and follow up communication to enable WDC to consider its position in relation to the existence of a trigger event and confirm that you have reversed by withdrawing the notification (if that’s what it is) of acceptance as a valid application.
