### A. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. To inform the committee of current archaeological matters in Milton Keynes.

### **B. FIELDWORK BY CONTRACTORS**

- Attached is a list of excavations and watching briefs that have been undertaken in the Milton Keynes area between July and December 2000. Those marked with \* are not a result of a planning condition.
- 3. The desk based assessment at Lathbury has revealed a number of enclosures on the raised ground to the south of the River Great Ouse and to the north east of the village.
- 4. The research excavation at Gordon's Lodge, Hanslope is part of a programme of training excavations being undertaken by Pat Lawrence on a medieval/Roman site that has formerly produced part of an oven/furnace.
- 5. A significant bronze age find was made in Milton Keynes and will be reported at the committee meeting.

### C. PLANNING

- 6. The system of using archaeological notification maps to identify planning applications where PPG16 may be applicable has been augmented by routine scrutiny of the weekly planning list.
- During the period from 1 July 2000 to 31 December 2000 there were 969 planning applications of which 63 were commented upon in respect of PPG16. In addition there were a further 63 enquiries of which 16 were English Partnerships schemes and 11 were countryside stewardship schemes.
- 8. A large moated site in Sherington, known as Caves Manor, has been scheduled as an ancient monument.

## D. SITES AND MONUMENTS RECORD

- 1. 10 researchers have visited the Sites and Monuments Record between July and December.
- 2. 7 licences have been issued to archaeological contractors to use digital material from the Sites and Monuments Record.

- 3. The final tranche of material relating to Milton Keynes has been received from Buckinghamshire County Archaeological Service and incorporated into the systems.
- 4. A new "Events" database recording excavations, evaluations etc has been added to the Sites and Monuments Record.
