Where we are today?

Buckinghamshire County Council has a small but active Archaeological Service that provides a range of services:

- ❖ Maintains the County's Sites and Monuments Record (SMR), a public record of the county's historic environment
- ❖ An on-line SMR resource for schools and local community groups is being developed by the "Unlocking Buckinghamshire's Past" project
- ❖ Historic Landscape Characterisation techniques are being used to map the county's historic landscapes and inform future development, particularly in the growth areas around Aylesbury and Milton Keynes.
- ❖ Advice is given on 500 planning applications per year leading to many archaeological investigations being undertaken.
- ❖ Advice is given to farmers and landowners to help them secure grant aid for managing archaeological remains
- ❖ Community Archaeology events are organised to cater for a wide range of ages and interests and local groups are supported in developing their own activities.
