WASTE STRATEGY FOR BUCKINGHAMSHIRE - DRAFT OFFICER WORKING GROUP (OWG) RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BUCKS WASTE FORUM (BWF) MEETING TO BE HELD ON 26 JUNE 2001.

NB. To be read in conjunction with Appendix B which identifies what the proposed options referred to in some recommendations are.

Municipal and Household Waste Recommendations to 2010.

REC 01

Agree a formal "Memorandum of Understanding" between the partner authorities to deepen and strengthen this process of joint working to facilitate an effective implementation of the strategy.

REC 02

Further enhancement of waste minimisation initiatives in Buckinghamshire.

REC 03

The options (02-04 and 06-08) shown in table 4a relating to the County Council's HRWCs should be implemented in order to maximise the sites' contribution to overall recycling and composting within Buckinghamshire.

REC 04

Enhancement of existing District Council recycling schemes and the provision of more bring sites as an early priority.

REC05

Maximise the potential recycling of glass, paper, cans and plastics by introducing kerbside collection for these materials.

REC06

Continue to landfill to permitted levels whilst this remains costeffective.

REC 07

Not to introduce options 10, 11, 18 and 21 for the kerbside collection of Green Waste in Aylesbury Vale, Chiltern and South

Bucks districts as a means of meeting the 2003/04 and 2005/06 SPSs.

REC 08

To seek to secure, from the date of its opening (after 2005/06), capacity at the Colnbrook EfW facility to cater for a significant proportion of the household waste arising in South Bucks and Chiltern districts.

REC 09

If the scheme is implemented, to seek to secure, from the date of its opening (earliest mid-2004), capacity at the Newton Longville EcoDeco facility to cater for a significant proportion of the household waste arising in Aylesbury Vale district.

REC 10

Introduce options 24 and 25 for a wheeled bin kerbside Green Waste collection in Wycombe district.

REC 11

Introduce a central composting facility (option 05) at High Heavens to accommodate the composting of WDC's Green Waste collections.

Municipal and Household Waste Recommendations to 2021

REC 12

Agree a formal "Memorandum of Understanding" between the partner authorities to deepen and strengthen this process of joint working to facilitate an effective implementation of the strategy.

REC 13

Further enhancement of waste minimisation initiatives in Buckinghamshire.

REC 14

Further enhancement of existing County and District Council recycling schemes and the provision of more bring sites.

REC 15

Continue to maximise the potential recycling of glass, paper, cans and plastics materials by developing and improving kerbside collection schemes.

REC 16

Continue to landfill to permitted levels whilst this remains costeffective.

REC 17

Continue to secure capacity at the Colnbrook EfW facility to cater for all the household waste arising in South Bucks and Chiltern districts that is not recycled or composted.

REC 18

If the scheme is implemented, to seek to secure, from the date of its opening (earliest mid-2004), capacity at the Newton Longville EcoDeco facility to cater for a significant proportion of the household waste arising in Aylesbury Vale district.

REC 19

Establish a facility in the Wycombe area to transfer and bulk up household waste prior to its transportation to either Colnbrook, West Bletchley or to landfill at Gerrards Cross depending upon circumstances.

REC 20

Should the schemes at Colnbrook and West Bletchley not be implemented, to reconsider the implementation of options 10, 11, 18 and 21, as shown in table 4a above, for the kerbside collection of Green Waste in Aylesbury Vale, Chiltern and South Bucks districts as a means of meeting the Landfill Directive targets at 2013/14 and 2020/21.

Industrial and commercial waste recommendations to 2010

REC 21

To promote the county becoming more self-sufficient in the disposal of industrial and commercial waste by the means of minimisation, recycling and incineration with energy recovery.

REC 22

To support the reduction of Buckinghamshire's industrial and commercial waste sent to landfill to 85% of the 1998 total by 2005.

REC 23

To encourage a reduction in the amount of industrial and commercial waste being exported from Buckinghamshire to other regions.
