- 16. The purpose of the new strategy is to encourage schools, with appropriate support, to be confident and competent in providing for and monitoring SEN. This will require both appropriate delegated funding and necessary LEA advice through designated support officers. It will ensure an entitlement for all SEN pupils focussed on raising their achievement and, therefore, the results of every school in the Authority.
- 17. The work programme needs to be seen in the light of the wish of the County Council to delegate to schools more funding directly to support SEN pupils in their local school. There is also a requirement by government to increase the percentage of money delegated to schools with 85% as the target. This programme will enable us to move towards these aims.
