Summary

To bring to the Committee a statutory proposals relating to changes in standard numbers for St Paul's CE Combined School which have been consulted upon and for which the statutory objection period has now finished.

Supporting Information

The Statutory Notice relating to St Paul's CE Combined School was published by the governing body on 14 December 2001. The proposals relate to a change in standard number (and therefore the relevant admission arrangements) with effect from September 2003. The proposal is to change the standard number from 34 (4+) to 30. This will assist the school in the management of infant class sizes. The objection period closed on 14 February 2002.

No statutory objections to the proposals had been received at the time of the close of the objection periods.

Copies of the proposals were circulated to Members of the Committee in January.
