

PLANNING AREA 1 – BUCKINGHAM AND NORTH AYLESBURY VALE**1.1 AREA APPRAISAL**

This area covers a large rural area in the north of the County bordering on the neighbouring authorities of Milton Keynes, Northamptonshire and Oxfordshire. It also borders on Eastern and Western Aylesbury Vale and Aylesbury Town.

There are two main centres of population namely Buckingham and Winslow which have both experienced extensive housing developments in previous years.

1.2 PATTERN OF SCHOOLS

There are 19 primary schools in the planning area as follows:-

Page Hill Infant and Buckingham Junior schools amalgamated in September 2002 to become Buckingham Primary School, a 510 place combined school.

They feed mainly into Buckingham Upper School and the Royal Latin Grammar School.

1.3 MIGRATION OF PUPILS

There is little pupil movement in and out of the planning area in the primary phase although there is a small influx of pupils from Milton Keynes.

- 6 schools will have a school roll of **less than 30 pupils**

This is a predominantly rural area, Great Marlow town being the main urban centre. It borders on Wokingham, Maidenhead and Windsor, West Wycombe District, High Wycombe, East and South East Wycombe Districts.

14.2 PATTERN OF SCHOOLS

There are 7 primary schools in the planning area as follows:-

School Type	Age Range	Schools

Junior	(7-10)	1
Combined	(4-10)	5

They feed mainly into Great Marlow Upper and Sir William Borlase's Grammar schools.

14.3 MIGRATION OF PUPILS

There appears to be little movement in and out of the area. However, there is some evidence of movement out of Great Marlow to schools in surrounding villages. Danesfield School is in the vicinity of the Medmenham RAF site which would account for the pupil turnover at the school.

14.4 PUPILS FROM NEW HOUSING

There are no major housing developments within this planning area.

14.5 COMMENTARY

The appraisal shows a surplus capacity of 312 pupil places (16%) in April 2008.

In 2008 the projections show that:

- 2 out of 7 schools will have a **surplus capacity** of **over 25%** and at least 30 surplus places
- No schools will have a **deficit**
- No schools will have a school roll of **less than 30 pupils**.
