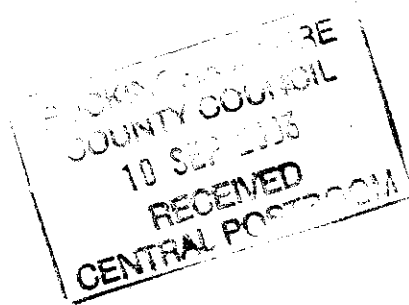
I think Bedgrave School is excellent. All the staff are very committed to the children and all the lessons are planned well in advance.

Dear Mr Popat,

I am writing to you as I have heard that Begrove Infant School is applying for Foundation Status, which would allow children to continue their education from the age of 5 through to 11 years of age.

I would like to take this opportunity to put my view to you, in that I feel that this would be extremely beneficial for the children at the school, and also for the children who may go to the school in the future.

My son has just started at the nursery at Bedgrove Infant School and it would be an incredible position for him to have the security of knowing that he would be staying at the school until the age of 11. Routines would be learnt, children settled and parents safe in the knowledge that their children's education is secured for that period.

We live on Watermead, and although a lovely area, it is possibly one of the worst places to live in Aylesbury with regards to schooling. Bedgrove Infant School would suit our son most closely, and if the school was effectively "combined" we would feel much more secure in our choice, knowing that our son's education would be safe until he was 11. We do not want to have to fight at every stage to ensure the best education for him so "combined" schools are a much more appealing choice.

Having continual education from the age of 5 through to 11 can only be a positive experience for the children and can only make them more confident and encouraged. The fewer disruptions to their schooling the better.
