Item 3: Burnham Upper

Point 1

The developments included in the total referred to are for sites within Buckinghamshire that we have received notification of, from respective Buckinghamshire District Councils. The three postcodes mentioned are for developments located outside of Buckinghamshire and therefore would not be included in Buckinghamshire's SOP.

Point 2

The schools listed (Iver Village Junior, Iver Heath Junior and Stoke Poges) are actually located within Planning Area 10, which is why they are not shown within Planning Area 9. To try to clarify the situation a note has been added under Planning Area 10 stating that a number of schools from Planning Area 10 feed into Burnham Upper.

Feeder schools from outside of Buckinghamshire are not included in the pupil projections although an adjustment is made for the number of pupils coming into Buckinghamshire from outside the county. In particular a number of these pupils and those from other planning areas feed into Burnham's Upper or Grammar schools.
