Monthly Update – February 2004

Statement Information

As at 29th February 2004 Bucks LEA was responsible for **2673 statements** of Special Educational Needs, this represents **3.5% of the total school population**. This is 14 more than in February 2003 (2659) and 15 more than in February 2002 (2658)

1320 of these pupils are secondary school age, with 1068 attending primary schools. We currently have 73 statemented pre school pupils and 212 in post 16 education.

This is an increase of 6 in primary schools and 26 in post 16. There is a decrease of 14 in secondary schools and of 4 pre-school pupils compared to January 2003.

The main changes are a decrease of 80 MLD, 30 SPLD and an increase of 59 SLCN and 33 BESD from February 2003. The increase in PMLD pupils is due to the reclassification of statements following discussions with schools for PLASC data.

Referrals for Assessment

During February 2004 there were 21 referrals to the Formal Assessment Panel, 71% (15) of these were agreed.

Special Schools

Bucks currently have **13 special schools**, 6 MLD, 4 EBD and 3 SLD. For the academic year 2003/2004 these have a combined planned **place number of 1090**. At 29th February 2004 there were 1042 pupils on the rolls of these special schools, of which 29 pupils are from other Local Authorities.

9 of these schools are under number, added together this equals 66 spaces. 4 of the schools are over-number, equalling 18 places.

Out of County Placements

A total of 127 Bucks pupils are attending other Local Authority schools, as at 29th February 2004, 74 in mainstream and 53 in special schools

At 28th February 2004, these figures were 133 in total - 81 in mainstream, and 52 in special schools.

We have **147 pupils in independent or non-maintained schools**, with an estimated cost this financial year of 7 million. Compared with 163 in February 2003.

The majority of pupils placed in independent or non-maintained schools are male, making up 77% of these pupils.

Learning Support Assistant hours

At the 29^{th} February 2004 the expected cost of SSA for the 2003-2004 financial year stood at £3,646,344.45. This is 2.97% more than the year cost as at 31^{st} January 2004 (£3,541,061.90). and 17.51% more than at 31^{st} April 2003 (£3,103,096.99).

On the 29th February 2004 there were 780 pupils receiving a total of 11,568.75 SSA hours. This is an increase of 10 pupils and 189.25 hours from 31st January 2004.

Miscellaneous

Removals In and Out of Bucks - During February 2004, 6 statemented pupils moved out and 6 moved into Bucks. In February 2003, 2 pupils moved out and 4 moved in. For the current academic year to 29th February 2004, 23 have moved out and 30 pupils have moved in. During the same period 2002-2003, 31 pupils moved out and 22 moved into the area.

<u>Looked After Children with Statements</u> – In February 2004, 98 pupils with statements were, at some point in the month LAC and in February 2003 there were 84.
