1 Purpose

3 Supporting Information

- 3.1 The full Connected Knowledge Technology Strategy 2017-20022 was agreed at the 22 February 2017 Council meeting. Delivery of the strategy will enable AVDC to continue to be at the vanguard of innovative thinking, delivering excellent customer service, making savings in service delivery and generating income by both supporting general commercial opportunities, and providing consultancy services to other councils. Following agreement of the Strategy, Cabinet received a further report on 'Connected Knowledge Investment Proposal' on 11 April 2017 and approved funding so that work could continue on implementing the strategy.
- 3.2 The Strategy would be delivered over a five year period. Phase one covers the period up to the end of 2017. The learning from phase one will be factored into the proposals for subsequent phases.
- 3.3 Cabinet will be updated on the progress made in implementing the Connected Knowledge Strategy. The Council's Digital Strategy Manager will be attending the meeting to give Members a presentation and to answer questions on any technical aspects.
