# QUARRENDON SCHEDULED ANCIENT MONUMENT ACCESS MANAGEMENT & INTERPRETATION PLAN

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4 Funding

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### **Environmental Stewardship**

DEFRA's Environmental Stewardship replaces the Countryside Stewardship Scheme. It has two tiers of payment lower level payment is for a flat rate of £30 per hectare ould cover the whole. The rates for the higher level payments are yet to be announced, are for specific items such as hedgerow restoration and hay meadow management.

t is estimated that an annual payment of £ plus £30,000 for one-off capital items be received

## 4. Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF)

Officers have contacted the to see they could contribute towards the costs of the works. HLF will not give a definitive view on whether they would give funding without our going through the formal application procedure. However, they have expressed interest in the proposal and it does fit in with their objectives of supporting heritage, encouraging access, providing information. he elements of the Plan which support the heritage elements archaeological investigations and the access works

such as footpath creation and interpretation, plus the employment of a Community Engagement Officer.

The maximum period for a HLF project is five years and include both capital and revenue items. A bid to the HLF ould be in the region of £560,000.

## 4. Woodland Grant Scheme (WGS)

The Woodland Grant Scheme is operated by the Forestry Commission, and the rates are currently under review. However, an estimate of potential income has been made based on current rates. The WGS income could be supplemented by the Farm Woodland Premium Scheme which offers funding where agricultural land is taken out of production

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#### MDA contribution

The MDA developments are likely to yield, for mitigation work, Weedon Hill £90,000, Berryfields £319,000.
