





























Confused residents

46% of households place recyclable items in general rubbish bin.

47% place a non-recyclable item in their recycling.

7% - 13% using food waste collection service still place some food the general rubbish bin.

For example food still in its packaging; only half use the food waste service effectively,

35% - 41% do not take food out of its wrapping before placing it in the food waste collection or use the general rubbish bin.

Fighting Food Waste Programme Identify and set out rate of food waste recycling. Increase food waste participation in Buckinghamshire County Households from 25% to 40%. Reduce food waste tonnage per head by 15%. Increase awareness of various ways of food preparation and preservation, using Love Food Hate Waste (LFHW) campaign tools, by 25%.
