

**REPORT ON APPLICATION FROM THE
HARROW, AYLESBURY UNDER THE
LICENSING ACT 2003 FOR CONVERSION AND
VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE**

1. THE APPLICATION

Applicant(s): Spirit Group Ltd

Premises: Harrow, 4 Cambridge Street, Aylesbury, HP20 1RS

1.1 Conversion Application

No representations have been received from Thames Valley Police in respect to this application to convert the existing permissions to a Premises Licence. Therefore in accordance with the transitional provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 the application to convert the existing permissions has been granted under delegated powers subject to any existing statutory restrictions and conditions and any other conditions which currently apply.

Attached as Appendix 1 is a copy of the completed application form, the designated premises supervisor consent form and a copy of the justices' licence. A plan of the premises will be made available at the Sub-Committee hearing.

1.2 Variation application

The application is for the variation of the Premises Licence during the transitional period under Schedule 8, paragraph 7 (1)(b) of the Act. 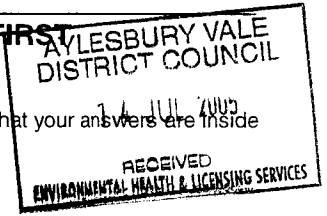

The style and operation of the pub will not differ significantly during the extended hours. Where this is appropriate, non-alcoholic refreshment will be available in the extended period.

The premises will respect Spirit Group's Approach to Responsible Drinking (a copy of which is enclosed in support of this application). Our policies change at regular intervals to reflect current trends and it would be inappropriate to standardise them on a permanent basis. b) The prevention of crime and disorder



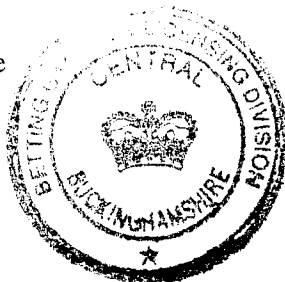

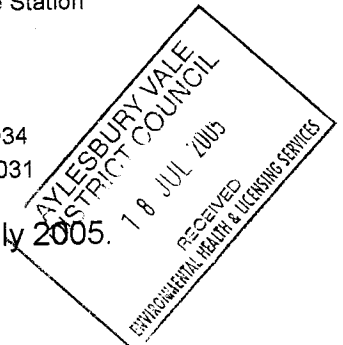

The premises are generally well run and cause few problems for the police.

The application is to vary the hours of sale of alcohol to midnight Sundays to Wednesdays, to 1am on Thursdays and to 1.30am on Fridays and Saturdays with an additional hour drinking up time.

The hours Sunday to Wednesday cause no problems to the Police but due to hours asked for on Wednesdays Fridays and Saturdays Thames Valley Police wish to make the following representations and ask that they be part of the conditions of the licence.

- Door staff be in operation from 8pm until closing on Wednesday Fridays and Saturdays.
- Fully operational CCTV system with recorder is in operation during opening hours.
- Doors and windows to remain closed during hours of operation.
- Management and staff to fully support the local Pub watch scheme.

Thames Valley Police ask for these conditions for the following reasons.

Door staff do operate on these premises on a Friday and Saturday at the present time with the late licence already in existence Thursday is now an additional day which we believe will need to be covered. Door staff will control persons entering and leaving the premises, this will ensure persons under age are not permitted and no drugs or offensive weapons are allowed into the premises.

CCTV is already in operation in these premises it will monitor the activities of patrons thus ensuring staff and customer safety. This will also support the police in any incidents that take place on the premises.

Closed doors and windows will alleviate any late night noise pollution.

The premises are part of the pub watch scheme but very rarely attend meetings. This is one of the larger town centre premises and we would ask that it be a condition that staff and management fully support the scheme. The pub watch scheme will ensure that barred persons are not allowed into the premises.

As stated earlier the premises cause little problems to the police, the conditions asked for will ensure these premises continue to be well run and will meet the licensing objectives.
