**REPORT ON APPLICATION FROM THE
QUEENS HEAD, CHACKMORE UNDER THE
LICENSING ACT 2003 FOR CONVERSION AND
VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE**

1. THE APPLICATION

Applicant(s): My Kinda Pub Limited

Premises: The Queens Head, Main Street, Chackmore

1.1 Conversion Application

No representations have been received from Thames Valley Police in respect to this application to convert the existing permissions to a Premises Licence. Therefore in accordance with the transitional provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 the application to convert the existing permissions has been granted under delegated powers subject to any existing statutory restrictions and conditions and any other conditions which currently apply.

Attached as Appendix 1 is a copy of the completed application form, the designated premises supervisor consent form and a copy of the justices' licence. A plan of the premises will be made available at the Sub-Committee hearing.

This application to vary the premises licence does not represent a fundamental change in the way in which the premises has already been trading under its existing licences. The operator has carefully considered the risks and benefits associated with the additional hour(s) applied for and believes that the way in which the premises currently operates adequately addresses all the licensing objectives. The following additional steps will also be taken:

The operators of the premises will continue to ensure that all staff receive training to a high standard and certainly to those required by the relevant legislation

The premises voluntary closure policy for the operation is 30 minutes after the approved closure time for the supply of alcohol.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The operator of the premises will monitor requirements for door monitors and will take into account any advice offered by the police

The operator of the premises will ensure that there will be no promotions that encourage illegal, irresponsible or immoderate consumption.

c) Public safety

The operator believes that the proposed variation will not lead to any increase in risk to public safety. The existing policies be extended to cover the increase in opening hours.

The premises health and safety policy and incident reporting system will operate during the additional hours.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The style and nature of the operation will not differ significantly from the existing trading operation during the extended hour(s). The operator anticipates that the grant of additional hour(s) will support the promotion of licensing objectives as stated in paragraph 3.29 of the GUIDANCE, in allowing customers to emerge from the premises at a more gradual rate.

Reasonable steps are taken to recognise the rights of local residents and to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly.

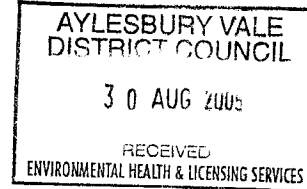

**Queen's Head Public House, Chackmore
Objection to Application for Extended Licensing Hours**

By way of background, the Queen's Head is a typical country pub within a conservation area and is the only such premises in a small village. It is situated in Main Street which has a continuous row of residential properties on both sides of the road. The pub is located near the centre of the village within a row of period cottages.


As a Parish Council we have a duty to protect the interests of our parishioners, particularly in this instance those who live within 100 metres or so of the pub.

Our primary objection is the noise created by people leaving the pub at closing time (shouting, singing, slamming of car doors and loud exhausts). The noise can continue for a least an hour beyond the call for last orders. By extending the licensing hours this noise will become totally unacceptable as by this time most people in the vicinity will certainly have their sleep disturbed.

Furthermore, it is our understanding that licensing hours may well be extended in the town centre of Buckingham which is only a mile and a half from Chackmore. Given that this is the case, then surely any potential demand for drinking later should be met by town pubs and thus protect outlying villages such as Chackmore for unnecessary disturbance late at night.

We trust that the above will be taken into account and that the status quo can be maintained in our rural community.

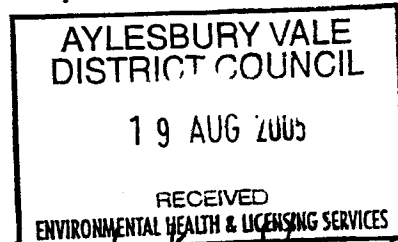

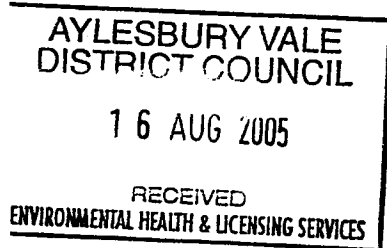

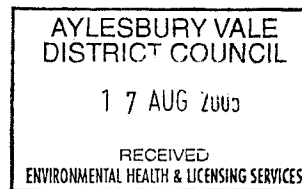

Further to the above application for extending hours, I would like to appose the application.

My property is adjacent to the Queens Head in Chackmore and I have lived in the property since 1987. During this time, the pub has been a very popular venue for visitors from Stowe National trust, the school, Silverstone and the hikers and cyclists as well as the village people.

My reasons for apposing the application to extend until midnight on a Friday and Saturday is as follows:


- 1) There is not a separate car park for the pub and therefore cars are parked outside houses. Most of the people who drink late in the pub are not village people and therefore they arrive and depart by transport, either their own or taxis. Noise carries in a small village especially during summer months when people are trying to sleep with windows open.
- 2) The majority of people who are the last to leave the pub do not eat in the pub and therefore the extra hour would be extending drinking time.
- 3) The forecourt of the pub is floodlit and these lights are due to go out at 1130pm (agreed with the management) but frequently it is gone midnight when this happens now, so with an extension, this would become 1.00am with people still leaving at this time.
- 4) There are two ventilation fans on the side of the pub situated approx 9ft from my bedroom window, which are constantly going as well as a cooler fan on the rear of the building. The vents extract noise, smoke, food fumes and you can hear a whole conversation from them. These fans should only been operated during put opening hours but extended hours would mean continuous noise, again most concerning at night when you wish to sleep.

- 5) The food trade to the pub tends to come and go within the existing opening hours and therefore apart from the parking, cause little inconvenience.

I have no objection to the pub opening at 1000, which is when a village pub would benefit with businessmen and passing trade for coffees and light refreshments. Also if they opened earlier (say 5.30pm) they would pick up walkers and trade from Silverstone and the National Trust. This trade has long gone at 1100 at night.

There has always been very few problems with living next to a pub and most of the management have been sympathetic to the neighbours and I feel that it should remain this way.
