


My neighbour at no. 65 Camborne Avenue, Mrs K. Hagerty, my husband, Mr RV Sharp, & myself wish to lodge an objection to the above, as follows:

- We wish the obligation on the Bucks Yeoman to employ a "Door Supervisor" at busy times to remain in place; the presence of a "Door Supervisor" will help keep disruption & disorderly behaviour to a minimum. We, living in close proximity to the Bucks Yeoman & paying £1989.39 per annum Council Tax on the above property, expect to be able to enjoy reasonable peace & tranquillity in our own home. If anything, a Doorman needs to be in attendance continuously, in our opinion. This Public House sometimes attracts a very rough noisy element, which may be appropriate to a town centre pub, but is not appropriate to a Residential Development where the homeowners/occupiers pay high Council Tax.
- We also object to the granting of permission to allow drinking in the Beer Garden after 11pm, again due to the anticipated noise implications.

I would go further and ask that not only should the beer garden be closed at 11.00 but also all windows in the pub be closed at 10.00.



Licensing Act 2003 - Application to Vary License Conditions Buckinghamshire Yeoman Public House - Bedgrove

In response to a letter written by my wife, Mrs D Gregson, of this address, I confirm that we have received your notification of the Hearing on 4 July 2007 concerning the above application. Neither she nor I intend to attend the Hearing in person. I would, however, like to add a few comments of my own as follows:

- a) Application to allow drinking in the "Beer Garden" (Car Park Area) after 11.00 pm. Can we all be honest and admit that this request has little to do with where and when alcohol may be consumed, and a great deal to do with the ban on smoking in public places to take effect in July. Assuming correct compliance with the ban, customers would, after 11.00 pm, have to interrupt their consumption of alcohol on the premises to partake of their nicotine inhalation outside. It is possible that this could affect bar takings to a very limited extent only, but not sufficiently to warrant the granting of free-for-all license conditions and unrestricted alcohol consumption outdoors. The smoking ban is intended to safeguard the health of customers, but not by inflicting extra noise pollution and later sleepless hours on local residents. I believe that this application should be refused. We are about to enter the season of heatwaves and night-time humidity again and it is highly unreasonable to expect residents to keep all windows closed to supress the noise from the pub grounds.
- b) On the subject of Door Supervisors, it is clearly reassuring to customers and residents alike when functions are taking place until the early hours, to have supervision in place. Not only can they prevent known trouble-makers from entering in the first place, they can usually nip any sign of a disturbance in the bud before it becomes serious. They also encourage noisy groups to disperse and leave at final closing time rather than congregate in the Car Park. I believe that supervisors should continue in attendance.

Hello.

I am writing with regards to the New Licence Application that the "Bucks Yeoman" public house has requested.

As a nearby resident with 4 children under the age of 6, I am very concerned about the planned changes to the pub. My main concerns are:

- By allowing drinking outside of the pub after 11pm, there will be a continued noise from the pub which may well disturb us and other local residents.
 During the summer months my children have to sleep with their windows open due to the temperatures and to have the levels of noise that we currently can hear extended further will cause unnecessary disturbance to them. I am also worried about the extra volume of alcohol that this may lead people to consume at the pub something which we often notice as people make their way home from the pub right past our house.
- By removing the need for a door supervisor may well cause extra noise and incident (along with the extra levels of alcohol that may be consumed). If such deterrents are removed then this may lead to incidents becoming more common and causing an extra disruption to local residents.

For these reasons I oppose the new licence application which the Bucks Yeoman are applying for.

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
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

Premises Licence - Variation - Orchid Pubs Operations Ltd: To remove the condition relating to the use of the beer garden after 2300 and to change the condition from the use of door staff every Saturday night to the use of door staff on Saturday nights when entertainment is being offered.

As a neighbour of the Bucks Yeoman I already have significant concerns about the level of noise that is generated by the beer garden and do not believe that it is anyway appropriate to extend the hours. Camborne Avenue is a residential area with many families and children, there is already considerable noise generated by the Bucks Yeoman, extending the hours during which people gather outside will only extend this noise into the night-time.


I, Mrs K. Hagerty, wish to lodge an objection to the above, as follows:
