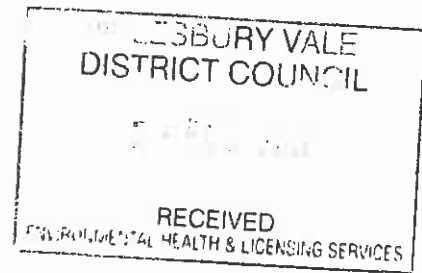

Reference: Burcott Lodge Farm Music Festival 11/00111/LAPRE

With regard to the above, as residents of Littleworth, Wing, please accept our objection to a licence being granted for the above event on the basis of both nuisance and safety.

The closest pub to the event is opposite our house, the route to the nearest shop is also outside our front door. Assuming the event is maintained at just 2000 people, pedestrian traffic will obviously be high. With adjacent open farmland presumably the organisers are not intending for festival goers to be penned in for three days. There will therefore, no doubt, be considerable nuisance to local residents as festival goers come and go.

Safety concerns relate to the high traffic volumes through Wing and the surrounding villages on minor roads for the set up, festival and removal. Aforementioned concerns regarding pedestrian traffic should also be noted as a safety issue for festival goers as the route to Wing facilities from Burcott is in part directly on the road where footpaths and pavements do not exist and there is no street lighting.

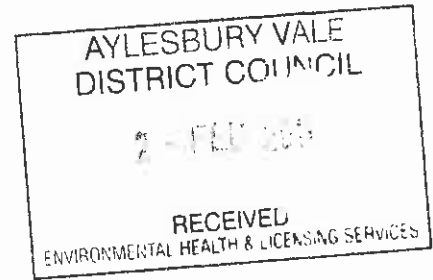

Dear Madam,

I wish to object to the license application by Messrs Dominey and Moore ("the Organisers") on land at Burcott Lodge Farm ("the Site") belonging to Mr Roger Carey for a musical event on the weekend of 15th to 17th July 2011. My wife and I are both in our seventies, and live about 500-600 metres from the site. Our land marches along part of the one lane farm track coming off the Soulbury Road, which is the only vehicular approach to the Site; and lies about 70 metres from our house.


We were introduced to the Organisers at the Wing Parish Council last week. It was evident that a project of the size intended- being up to 2,000 participants and staff; with car parking; bus transfers; and camping throughout the period, is on a scale hitherto never undertaken by the Organisers. Our impression was that they might have to do everything on a restricted budget. Due diligence would reveal their financial resources...

This lack of experience causes us to be apprehensive about their ability to implement the necessary discipline and control having regard to the prevention of crime and disorder: attention to public safety; and the protection of children, including teenagers- from harm or unhealthy influences.

- We are concerned that the noise levels, persisting through the early hours of two mornings, will be raucous and intrusive.
- We are anxious about the attendant litter of the venue being dispersed by any wind, which may reach our land.
- We do not think that the security proposed will prevent participants from strolling away from the site, to stretch their legs, relieve themselves, or indulge in less salubrious activities.
- Such possible "trespass" could endanger our livestock - in the event of discarded bottles, cans, needles, syringes or condoms and other detritu- and prove a potential hazard to our grandchildren.
- Moreover, there must be a potential danger of vandalism to our property, since we ourselves cannot patrol the boundaries.
- Traffic along the Soulbury Road will be a nightmare; and the farm track to the Site has no passing places and could become a horrendous traffic problem.
- Finally, there is a reputational risk involved by allowing such an event to take place in an area of outstanding beauty, since it could become the thin end of the wedge and alert others to follow the precedent created by granting a license.

We would like to thank you for considering our objections which we hope you will find neither vexatious nor frivolous.

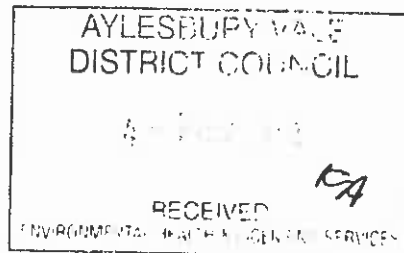

Dear Ms Ashton,

We would like to object to the license applications made by Mr Dominey and Mr Moore to hold a 2 day Music Festival event at Burcott Lodge Farm (owned by Mr Carey) from 15th-17th July 2011.

We live at Mount Pleasant Farm, High Street, Burcott which is adjacent to the site in question.

We were only made aware of the license application when a neighbour spotted a copy posted to a stile in a field near us. No effort had been made by the organisers to discuss or forewarn us about their plans. Insufficient notices were put up.....nobody in the area had heard anything about it.

We attended a Wing Parish Council meeting last week, where we were only allowed to ask the organisers a few questions. It was very apparent that they were very inexperienced (having only previously organised one one-day event last year) and they were unable to answer most of the questions put to them, satisfactorily.

- Obviously we object to the noise- loud music could be played until 2am Saturday and Sunday, and then again on Sunday until 11pm. This would disrupt our peace and our sleep (we have 2 young children) as well as upsetting our livestock.
- Security of our premises and land is a major issue, as there are 2 public footpaths running through our land- one leading directly to the proposed event site. As well as the public being able to access the event this way, we worry that attendees may wander out of the site and end up in our fields. Potentially this could lead to vandalising our property and again, upsetting our livestock
- Noisy revellers could potentially access High Street, Burcott and then into Wing via the footpaths
- We are worried that the people camping may pollute the stream with effluent and rubbish. This stream runs through our land into a pond, which supports many forms of wildlife- fish, birds and animals.
- Any litter on the festival site could easily be blown across to our fields. This could include items that could endanger our livestock and even our children.
- Traffic approaching Soulbury Road farm (where the cars are to be parked) will be very busy if 2000 people are to be expected to attend at any one time.

Finally, we moved to this beautiful, quiet part of the British Countryside for a peaceful, quiet life- not for 2000 noisy people to camp and party in our neighbourhood.

The organisers made it clear that if successful, they would make it a yearly event- getting larger and larger. And even if it did not prove successful for them, the fact that a license had been granted could well set a precedent, and entice others to do similar activities.

We thank you for reading our objections, and sincerely hope that you take them into consideration before making your decision.

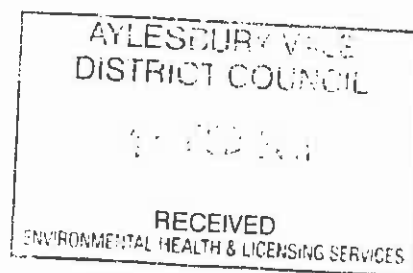

APPLICATION REF: 11/00111/LAPRE: PROPOSED MUSIC FESTIVAL

The proposed music festival will certainly be much welcomed by some of the adults in Burcott who fall within the targeted group. However, I have some reservations about the event:

1. SECURITY OF OUR PREMISES

A public footpath runs from the High Street of Burcott, past our cottage and through our six-acre fields and other neighbouring fields into Burcott Lodge Farm where the event is to take place.

I am concerned about the hordes of people who might gatecrash the festival using this public footpath. Public footpaths allow for right of access at any time and I don't know that they can be "guarded". I would like to know what specific measures the organisers are taking to control access to and return from the festival via this route. We have a flock of rare breed sheep in our property, and many young trees in our landscaped fields. If there is any rampage through our grounds by returning young adults high on alcohol and possibly drugs, we can foresee litter and considerable damage to our property, besides the threat to our personal security.

2. NOISE

We are also concerned about the extent to which we will be bombarded with loud music till late at night. I believe a trial test should be conducted to find out what the noise level will be for the surrounding houses.

I am sure that the proposed music festival, if well managed in terms of noise and crowd control, will be tolerated by the residents of Burcott who are accustomed to the peace and tranquility of our hamlet. However, I remain to be convinced as to how both noise and crowd can be properly managed given the specific location of the venue.

I understand that a Music Festival is being proposed at Burcott Lodge Farm on 16th and 17th July 2011 (reference: 11/00111/LAPRE).

As a close neighbour to this site, I have some concerns which I would like you to consider prior to any decision being made:

- **Loud Music** will significantly interfere with the peaceful hamlet environment in Burcott. We have been advised that there will be very loud music and staff will need to wear ear defenders until 2 am.
- **Traffic Flow** is likely to interfere with local activities, that of access to the very small hamlet of Burcott throughout the weekend of 16/17th July.
- **Animal Welfare** is likely to be affected by high levels of people, loud music and heavy volumes of traffic moving around the area of Burcott Lodge Farm. This may cause harm to sheep and horses as well as other wildlife and is something that I believe should be avoided.
- **Security** and protection of property is a concern as nothing has been mentioned of extra policing and closure of roads etc.

I wish to express my concern that the proposed music festival will be a visible & audible intrusion to the rural tranquility enjoyed by Burcott's residents.

Although the site is 0.7 miles from the Soulbury Road it is considerably closer to neighboring homes who cannot fail to hear music & people accessing & on the site

during the event. We will almost certainly suffer with light pollution arising from the tower & festoon lights in use for the event & the lights during the build process. In an area without street lighting additional external lighting is particularly noticeable.

The management plan states tickets will be sold both in advance & on the day until capacity is attained when "sold out" signs will be erected, as a local resident I am concerned that those turned away may remain in the local area & attempt to gain access via the public footpaths neighbouring the site. How will the event organisers ensure turned-away guests do not remain cause a nuisance to neighbouring households?

Anybody walking from the Wing or diverted from the footpaths is required to walk along Soulbury Road-where visibility is poor due to the dips & traffic passing at up to 60mph, to access the shuttle bus & then the site.

There appear to be anomalies in the application which is recorded as being received by AVDC on 12 January although it is dated the 14 January. Also, the management plan states public will arrive on site on Saturday 16 July yet applies for licenses implying public presence on the Friday evening.

A request for licensing until 5am suggests that some guests will be awake & demanding these services in the early hours of the morning, it can be assumed that this will result in associated noise.

All landowners should have the right to participate in activities on their own property as they wish without causing nuisance to their neighbors. As the application stands I cannot see how it will not disturb & prevent us from fully enjoying our own garden on that weekend.

1. There was insufficient posting of **Public Notices**, i.e. only on foot paths and farm track which are not likely to be seen by many 'passers by'
2. Access to this site is limited to a single track road from Soulbury Road, for all traffic, including emergency services, thus threatening **Public Safety**. The apparent planned emergency access is across farmland and totally impractical.

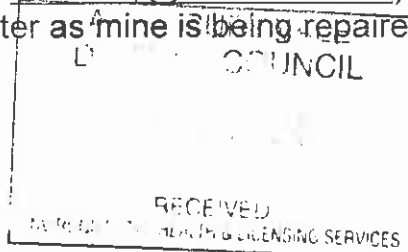

Crime and Disorder

Music and alcohol in this day and age are a dangerous mix, the area is open and cannot be secured. The site accesses a public footpath which the security staff cannot by law prevent festival goers access to - this leads straight onto Burcott itself. Whilst this is intended to be a ticket only event the risk of gatecrashing is high, and whilst the security staff may prevent access to any gatecrashers that conflict in itself will be a disorder.

Public Nuisance

Noise, smell and bright lights will affect livestock and wildlife as well as disturbing the local residents for a protracted period.

The risk of a large number of strangers, particularly where alcohol and potentially other substances typically found at music festivals are involved, with access by public footpath to local homes means that a) residents will stay at home to ensure no trespass or damage to property occurs and b) elderly residents will be concerned and distressed by the risk. This may impact vacation or other plans.

Public Safety

The significant additional traffic will route through Wing, Soulbury and Leighton Buzzard at the beck of Sat Nav disrupting traffic, horse riders and causing additional risk to pedestrians accustomed to normal levels of traffic.

The single track road to the site will be a bottleneck in an emergency, any blockage by a broken down vehicle or other disruption will significantly hamper access for emergency services.

I wish to object to the application for a premises licence needed to stage a music event over the period from 15th to 18th July 2011. The grounds for the objection are the prevention of public nuisance.

Burcott is a small hamlet of approximately 50 residential properties with no more than 150 residents, most of which are of, or approaching retirement age. The mere thought of holding a music event targeted to attract up to 1700 20-40 year old males in is completely out of character with this location, its resident's and the communities normal way of life. It is hard to imagine a more tranquil place, the expectation of rock and other music being played until 2am and other activities going on to 5am is beyond belief and conflicts with its residents human right of expecting a quiet and peaceful existence.

I also have concerns about the following consequences of the event:

Traffic - although efforts appear to be planned to direct traffic along the A418, one of the stated intentions of the event, is for it to be attractive to locals. These attendees are likely to be familiar with what were the main routes before the Stoke Hammond bypass was opened and will travel to the event through Wing and Burcott if approaching from Aylesbury and Soulbury if approaching from further north.

Anti-social behaviour - The availability of alcohol on site for 7 hours on Friday 15th July and 13 hours on both 16th and 17th July to an audience of 1700 20 to 40 year olds WILL create some anti-social behaviour. Drug taking is also likely to be prevalent. The ability to contain such behaviour within the confines of the site over a period of 65 hours is very questionable.

Trespass - Whilst there may only be public access to the site at two locations, there is ample opportunity for attendees to cross fields away from the site or deviate from the public footpath should they wish potentially causing damage and disruption. To expect an audience of 1700 to be contained on site over a three day period is beyond belief.

Livestock - some consultation with owners of nearby livestock is said to have taken place. Nevertheless, I am sure these animals will suffer some element of distress from the event, even if this is just from having to be kept in a stable for its duration.

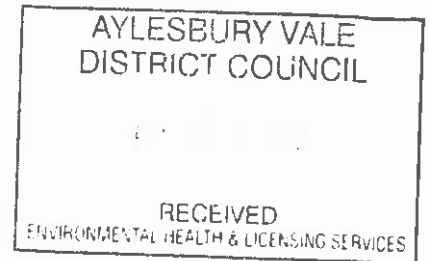
Light pollution - could also be a nuisance depending on the light show performers may choose to use.

We are extremely worried about this. For starters we are elderly and do not relish the thought of loud, or even not that loud, 'music' going on most of the night. In the summer one needs to have one's windows open and even if it is in a bit of a dip, as there are 3 music stations, it will have to be of a certain pitch or they will not be able to hear over the noise of the others.

There are more serious issues. There are 2 footpaths nearby on which people can still legally wander and can leave litter. Cans, plastic or even old syringes could do untold harm to livestock or children. Although we are told it is to be policed by the same security firm as Glastonbury, remember that money is no object in protecting Glastonbury and that Glastonbury is fenced all round and totally self contained.

The camping site is very close to us and the bus moving people about comes by our property and livestock.

Would this be a once off? I'm told if it should be a success, the organiser would hope to make it a regular event and increase in size.

I am writing to you to lodge my objection to the above referenced music festival. As you will see from my address I live on the High Street in the hamlet of Burcott.

I am objecting mainly as a resident but also in my capacity as an experienced events organiser.

My main reasons for objecting are listed below:

- **Nuisance to rural environment** - I have ponies grazing at Mount Pleasant Farm (next to the site) and I am fearful of the disturbance to them.
- **Noise** – The area is quite open and the excessive noise will undoubtedly travel.
- **Traffic** – I understand the traffic is to be guided from the local bypass missing the main routes through the villages of Soulbury and Wing. In my experience not everyone will follow the way they have been advised or directed, thus making Soulbury and Wing villages far busier than a usual weekend. If the festival goes are to be parked in a local farmers field, my concern is that there is nothing to stop them parking where they like down a small country lane in Burcott. If the guests are to be bussed to the site, there will undoubtedly be people who would like to walk; I am not aware of any non-vehicle access.
- **Rubbish** – As well as the rubbish that associates with 2000 people (visiting on a daily basis) I understand there is also to be camping on the site. My concern is that disregarded rubbish brought onto the site as well as purchased food wrappings will be spread or blown around the site during and after the event. If not removed quickly this will be a danger to wildlife and a nuisance to locals.
- **Wing Carnival** – There will be more traffic in the village of Wing due to the carnival on the same Saturday. This date is yet to be confirmed.
- **Security** – There are footpaths very close to the site, the festival goes and non paying guests will be free to roam at their leisure.
- **Numbers** – If properly managed 2000 people a day in one place is not a huge event, but if the event is licensed this time, my concern is that it will grow year on year to something bigger, and in my opinion our rural hamlet doesn't need it!

Thank you for reading my objections and I hope you will consider them when deciding to license this event.

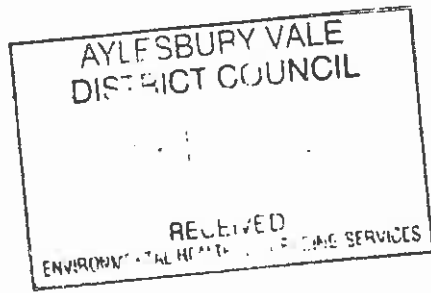

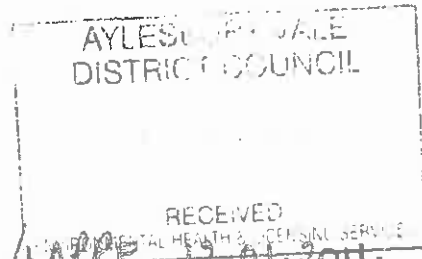

We own and reside in Homefield House, and have lived here with our family since 1991. We have seen the licence application referred to above, and we would like to raise some concerns that we have regarding the application. Knowing the area extensively, we have some valid concerns about the impact of the proposed event which any licence

A73

should consider and address. These concerns relate principally to public safety, potential crime and disorder and public nuisance issues.

Public Safety

The proposed access road is private and is a single track road, used only by the 5 residences and their guests. The licence application suggests measures to minimise the risk of extensive traffic congestion on the drive by suggesting shuttle buses. However we are concerned that this will not be effective: it is unlikely that, at the end of the proposed festival 1000-1500 people will wait in an orderly queue for a shuttle bus to their parking. They are more likely to walk, meaning a large number of pedestrians on the drive (blocking the shuttle bus access) and on the Soulbury Road, which clearly would compromise public safety.

In addition, both our and the other residents' access to our properties will be severely compromised during the event, since the only access route is the drive. This will impact us and our neighbours both personally and professionally; a number of residents run businesses from their properties involving other vehicles. In the event that traffic on the drive, and therefore access to our properties was limited to benefit public safety, this will result in a loss of earnings in addition to personal inconvenience.

Further, the significant additional footfall and vehicle usage of the drive is likely to cause damage to the surface. Currently although Burcott Lodge Farm own the drive, we have agreed in principal to share the cost of any repairs. Please can you confirm that Burcott Lodge Farm will undertake sole responsibility to ensure that the drive is maintained properly as a result of this event, and remains a safe access route for all residents.

We also have serious concerns relating to public safety regarding the proposed emergency access route. According to the maps submitted with the licence application, this appears to run through a hedge and two sewerage ditches, across a boggy and undulating field and onto the golf course. In the event of inclement weather conditions, this route would require extensive preparation to ensure that it is available for emergency access at all times. Any inability to use this route would potentially compromise public safety. In addition, the hedge which the access route goes through has been maintained by ourselves for the last 20 years. Currently this hedgeline does not have a gateway or gap. It is a flourishing hedgerow providing a habitat for a range of flora and fauna, and we are disappointed to see any proposal that it should be damaged for a weekend of usage.

From the maps, it appears that the proposed main area of the site is located directly underneath National Grid overhead cables. We trust that any impact of the cables on the location, and any consequent public safety issues, have been researched in full to the Council's satisfaction.

Crime and Disorder

As owners of the land which borders the proposed site, we are greatly concerned about potential crime and disorder during and after the event. A public footpath runs across our land, adjacent to the campsite. By climbing over our boundary fence, they would acquire access to the camping field. This could therefore result in a number of people crossing fields containing valuable livestock. We are concerned that campers may inadvertently trespass onto our land, and/or discard litter on the footpath, causing damage to our property or livestock. We are also worried that the passage of so many people across our land may compromise the security of our home during and after the event. If any crime or damage occurred, we would seek assurances that we would be compensated in full for any loss that we might suffer.

Further, in the event of a death or injury to any person on our land, either while using the footpath or otherwise, please can you advise whether any liability would fall to us? Our insurers have stated that they will not cover any such incident given that the event is in close proximity, with direct access across our land.

We are also concerned that, given that the footpath is public, it will be used as a route for ticket touts and people seeking entry without payment (gatecrashers). This may result in groups assembling on the footpath, with potential for disorderly behaviour in addition to any criminal activities. We would appreciate understanding how the organizers intend to regulate both the numbers of people attending, and the ticket sales, to limit this behaviour.

Public Nuisance

The noise generated by the event will not only be a nuisance but could also

potentially scare our livestock. Within the application it discusses minimising the noise disturbance by turning the speakers away from neighbouring property, however this seems impossible given that there are neighbours on each side. Further, with the size and scale of speakers used at public events, simply turning a speaker in an alternative direction is unlikely to make a significant impact on the noise generated. In addition to the event itself, there are likely to be extensive rehearsals / sound checks in the days before, which will cause public nuisance of themselves.

We understand that the tower lighting is necessary for safety reasons, however this will also cause public nuisance to all local residents.

Please can you confirm whether there will be limitations on the times of use of the sound and lighting equipment required, and how these will be enforced.

We hope that you can consider these thoughts in the manner intended: we appreciate that the applicants wish to run this event, and we seek only to ensure that it is done in a manner which maintains public safety, minimizes the potential for damage to property and the environment, and limits and crime and disorder.
