Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- 1 No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when:
 - (i) there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence has been suspended.

- 2 Every supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- 3 Where the British Board of Films Classification, or the Licensing Authority upon objections to the licence holder, has classified a film exhibition as category 12A, 15 or 18, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with that classification.

- 4 Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 –Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

5 Licensable activities are only permitted in the hours set out above, with the following exceptions:

- a. On Good Friday, 10:00 to 00:00.
- b. On Christmas Eve, 10:00 to 00:00.
- c. On Christmas Day, 10:00 to 02:30 the following morning.
- d. On Boxing Day and December 27th, 10:00 to 00:00.
- e. On New Years Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

6 The Licensee may also provide and permit:

- (a) Entertainment by way of music and singing but only by the reproduction of recorded sound (this does not permit the use of Karaoke, Disk Jockeys, Comperes, etc)
- (b) Late night refreshment for a period of 30 minutes after the permitted hours for the sale by retail of alcohol set out above.

7 General Licensing Objectives

- (i) We will continue to train our staff to the standards required by relevant legislation.
- (ii) Fullers operate traditional high quality public houses selling award winning cask ale, good wine and excellent food. There is no intention to deviate from this during the extended hours of operation. The additional hours will themselves promote the licensing objectives particularly in relation to crime and disorder and public nuisance

as stated in paragraph 3.29 of the guidance by allowing customers to emerge from the premises at a more gradual rate.

8 The prevention of crime and disorder

- (i) We have carefully considered the risks and benefits associated with extra hours applied for and we believe that because of the character of the premises, and its location, no additional measures are necessary.

9 Public Safety

- (i) Our staff are fully trained on all safety issues, including fire safety. Regular inspections of the premises undertaken by the management.

10 The prevention of public nuisance

- (i) Bins are kept clean and emptied regularly to prevent smells.
- (ii) Staff and Management check outside the pub on a regular basis throughout the day for litter.
- (iii) Adequate bins are provided for when the garden is in use.
- (iv) Customers are asked to leave the premises quietly.
- (v) Taxis will be arranged for customers upon their request to assist in their safe, efficient and quiet dispersal of customers.
