# Consultation for new premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 Alldays Cuisine, 33 New Street, Aylesbury, Buckinghamshire

I have reviewed the above premises licence application and wish to make a representation regarding the application. I have concerns regarding the potential for public nuisance that the grant of the premises licence may allow.

The premises has recently been returned to use by the current operator and is operating as an eat-in and takeaway restaurant serving a variety of foods including curries, kebabs and pizza. I have visited the premises on several occasions since the new operator took it on to offer advice on structural and food hygiene requirements.

There are residential dwellings in Alexander Road in close proximity to the premises. During the day the background noise levels in this area will be fairly high because of the volume of traffic passing along New Street. At night-time the potential for noise nuisance to nearby residents from the premises becomes greater as the background noise levels drop. I am concerned that the grant of the extension of late night refreshment hours to 02.20 and 03.20 hours increases the likelihood of noise disturbance to nearby residents from the extraction and ventilation system at the premises and from people using the premises to purchase eat-in and takeaway food after the town centre pubs and clubs close.

There has been a recent complaint from residents in Alexander Road regarding noise from extraction and ventilation equipment situated at a neighbouring premises which was operating constantly and throughout the night. This demonstrates that there is a sensitivity to this type of noise in the area.

A written scheme specifying the provisions to be made for the control of noise from the extraction and ventilation system was requested as part of the planning application process for change of use from Class A3 café/restaurant to Mixed Class A3/A5 restaurant/takeaway use. As the planning application was refused this information has not been provided to the Authority.

In order to prevent public nuisance I recommend that the following conditions are considered by the applicant and Licensing Committee for inclusion on the operating schedule should the Licence be granted:

1. The premises shall not sell or supply hot food or drink past 23:00 hours until a scheme which specifies the provisions to be made for the control of noise from the extraction and ventilation system has been submitted to and approved by the Environmental Health Department. Details regarding the make, model and noise level output from the

fan as well as details regarding any silencer fitted to the extraction system shall be provided as part of this scheme.

- 2. All windows and doors at the premises which open to the external environment shall remain closed after 23:00 hours except for access and egress.
- 3. Signage shall be displayed at all exits from the premises asking customers to leave the premises quietly and to consider nearby residents.

I have reviewed the premises licence application validated on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2012 with regard to the above property and wish to make a representation regarding the application. I have concerns regarding the potential for public nuisance that the grant of the premises license may allow.

The premises is operating as a hot food takeaway use with a small amount of seating included. A planning application was received in September 2009 seeking planning permission for a change of use from Class A3 restaurant use to Class A5 hot food take away use, first floor rear extension and installation of extraction flue to side. This application was refused in November 2011 but the owner is operating the unit regardless of not gaining consent. This matter has been passed to the Enforcement Team to pursue. The applicant has not appealed the decision and has not approached the Local Planning Authority with a view to addressing any of the issues.

The application was refused for the following 3 reasons;

- 1. The Local Planning Authority consider that the proposed extraction flue associated with the proposed change of use, by reason of its size, position and design, would form an unreasonably prominent and intrusive feature on the building which would have a detrimental effect on the appearance of the existing building and street scene and which would be harmful to the visual amenity of the locality. It would therefore be contrary to policy GP 35 of the Aylesbury Vale Local Development Plan.
- The Local Planning Authority consider that the proposed opening hours associated
  with the new use would result in issues of unreasonable noise and disturbance to
  surrounding residents which would be contrary to policy GP 95 of the Aylesbury Vale
  Local Development Plan.
- 3. Owing to the absence of any available onsite parking, the proposed change of use of the unit to an A5 use (hot food takeaway) would cause customers to park on the adjacent highway which is a strategic route unreasonably disrupting the safe and free flow of traffic. This represents a danger and inconvenience to both vehicles in question and road users on New Street. The proposal therefore fails to accord with Planning Policy Guidance 13 – Transport and policy GP 24 of the Aylesbury Vale District Local Plan.

Of particular relevance to this licensing application is the second reason for refusal. No.33 New Street is located on the corner of Alexander Road which is a residential street. The planning application detailed the opening hours from 0700 until midnight on Mondays — Thursdays and from 0700 hours until 0200 hours on Fridays and Saturdays and from 1600

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hours until midnight on Sundays. I believe the licensing hours are in excess of those stipulated on the planning application. The proposed hours are in excess of any of those associated with the nearby commercial uses and therefore, it is considered that comings and goings of people using the premises to purchase food at the hours proposed would cause unreasonable issues of noise and disturbance and thereby public nuisance to nearby residents. In addition, the parking arrangements as noted in refusal reason 3 are not considered satisfactory; there is no stopping allowed on New Street which has double yellow lines and Alexander Road, is particularly narrow with angled parking bays on one side making manoeuvring particularly difficult. Vehicle movements taking place throughout the proposed opening times would also result in unreasonable levels of disturbance to occupiers constituting a public nuisance.

The first reason for refusal related to the appearance of the proposed flue which is required for extraction purposes. The positioning of it as shown on the plans is unacceptable in visual amenity terms but it is noted that a flue is required to deal with issues of odour. This flue has been installed regardless of the planning decision and I am also concerned that this solution is not acceptable in planning terms and therefore, another method of extraction is required and if not, this will result in issues of public nuisance for surrounding residents if it is not dealt with satisfactorily.

The use of the site for a take away is not suitable for these premises in its current form and is contrary to planning policy and therefore, it is recommended that the license application is refused.

However, should the Licensing Committee decide to grant the Licence, it is requested that a condition be attached to restrict the opening times of the premises to 2300 hours which is appropriate in a residential area to prevent issues of public nuisance. Details of the extraction equipment would also need to be supplied but which does not include the location of a flue in such a prominent position.
