

Application for premises licence by Mrs. Magdalena Goska and Mr. Norbert Goska for 20 Buckingham Street Aylesbury HP20 2LH (Taste of Poland).

I am writing to register my objection to the application for a premises licence by Mr & Mrs Goska for 20 Buckingham Street, Aylesbury, HP20 2LH. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder, antisocial behaviour and protection of children from harm.

An Additional Off-licence in Buckingham Street is likely to add to existing notable levels of crime and disorder experienced in the area in relation to the night time economy and town centre drunks.

A new off licence has the potential to become 'flashpoint' for disorder and underage drinkers (in relation to this point one has to question if there is a need for an additional off licence in such close proximity to so many others and directly opposite an established off-licence)

Buckingham Street is already filled up with off-licences, restaurants, takeaways and nightclubs and enabling another premise to sell alcohol would be totally detrimental to its aims and objectives. The application proposes that alcohol will be sold for consumption off the premises between 6:00am and 11.00pm, seven days a week. Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises that crime, disorder and public nuisance have already reached problem levels for the local police.

A new off-licence opposite an existing off-licence will cause un-necessary price wars and this will lead to excess drinking and cause crime and disorder and nuisance to public.

I have have been working closely with Thames Valley Police to reduce the problems with Antisocial behaviour, town centre drunks, underage drinking and proxy buying (adults buying alcohol for under 18s).

I have worked very hard and have gained a lot of experience in the last 8 years and have put a lot of measures in place to achieve the 4 licencing objectives.

- •the prevention of crime and disorder;
- public safety;
- •the prevention of public nuisance; and
- •the protection of children from harm.

Booze Stop is licenced to sell alcohol from 8.00am however we open shop and serve alcohol after 11.00am to promote licencing objectives of PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER AND THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE.

When I bought Booze stop about eight years ago we use to open shop at 8.00am in the morning during that time our experience was that we were

getting the wrong customers wanting to buy alcohol to consume very early in the morning and they would get drunk and cause nuisance in the Town Centre. To help stop this we decided to open after 11am in the day so that we promote responsible drinking and uphold licensing objectives.

By allowing a new off-licence to open earlier the licensing committee will undermine the hard work we have put in to promote licencing objectives on this part of the street and the licensing authority will also undermine its own policy of upholding the objectives. For this reason I urge the committee that the application to be refused.

The protection of children from harm.

Mirage night club which is also based on Buckingham Street some time hold underage parties. At this time we have to be very careful so that we do not sever alcohol to anyone under the age of 18 or any adult who we think will pass alcohol or cigarettes to under 18s.

The protection of children from harm requires experience and trained staff. I have gained a lot of experience. Me and my trained staff confidently can handle the nights when there are underage parties in the nightclub. A new off-licence will not have the needed experience or the trained staff to be able to protect children from harm.

A new off-licence will give the underage another place to try their luck and could possibly buy alcohol or cigarettes. A new off-licence will also not have any experience to deal with busy and potentially disorderly evenings when there are underage parties in the nightclubs. By granting the application the licencing authority will undermine its objective of protecting children from harm.

In view of all the above, I would urge the Licensing Authority to refuse the application.

If for some reason the Licencing Authority decides to grant the application I would request that the following conditions to be attached so that the licencing objectives are upheld.

- The opening hours to be limited from 11am until 9pm.
- No alcohol to be displayed in front area of the shop.
- No posters or promotional posters to do with alcohol should be displaced on shop window.
- A colour CCTV must be installed with cameras covering the entrance, counter area, alcohol display area, car park. Recording must be kept for 31 days and made available to responsible authorities on request.
- A challenge 25 scheme to be installed and refusal register to be kept.
- Single cans of beer or cider must not be sold.
- There should be no buy 1 get 1 free offers on alcohol.
- No alcohol should be given free with any offers.
- Customers must not be allowed to drink alcohol in the car park adjacent to the shop.
- There should always be a personal licence holders present at the shop to authorize sales of alcohol and cigarettes.
- There should be a minimum of 3 or 4 staff present at the shop at all times.
- If the shop opens before 11am then alcohol display must be covered out of view of customers.


Finally again I urge the committee to refuse the application and I look forward to hearing from you.



I am writing to register my objection to the application for a premises licence by Mr & Mrs Goska for 20 Buckingham Street, Aylesbury, HP20 2NF. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder, antisocial behaviour and protection of children from harm.

An Additional Off-licence in Buckingham Street is likely to add to existing notable levels of crime and disorder experienced in the area in relation to the night time economy and town centre drunks.


A new off licence has the potential to become 'flashpoint' for disorder and underage drinkers (in relation to this point one has to question if there is a need for an additional off licence in such close proximity to so many others and directly opposite an established off-licence)


Buckingham Street is already filled up with off-licences, restaurants, takeaways and nightclubs and enabling another premise to sell alcohol would be totally detrimental to its aims and objectives. The application proposes that alcohol will be sold for consumption off the premises between 6:00am and 11.00pm, seven days a week. Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises that crime, disorder and public nuisance have already reached problem levels for the local police.

A new off-licence opposite an existing off-licence will cause un-necessary price wars and this will lead to excess drinking and cause crime and disorder and nuisance to public. A new off-licence will give the underage another place to try their luck and could possibly buy alcohol or cigarettes. A new off-licence will also not have any experience to deal with busy and potentially disorderly evenings when there are underage parties in the nightclubs. By granting the application the licencing authority will undermine its objective of protecting children from harm.

Finally again I urge the committee to refuse the application and I look forward to hearing from you.

- A challenge 25 scheme to be installed and refusal register to be kept.
- Single cans of beer or cider must not be sold. (minimum of 4 pack should be sold)
- Alcopops must not be sold.
- There should be no buy 1 get 1 free offers on alcohol.
- No alcohol should be given free with any offers.
- · Customers must not be allowed to drink alcohol in the car park adjacent to the shop.
- There should always be a personal licence holders present at the shop to authorize sales of alcohol and cigarettes.
- There should be a minimum of 3 or 4 staff present at the shop at all times.
- If the shop opens before 11am then alcohol display must be covered out of view of customers.
 - Only English ID's should be accepted (Driving licence, or Ids with the pass hologram). Foreign passports are acceptable form of ID.
 - All alcohol (including beers and ciders) to be marked with permanent stickers so it can be traced back to the shop if need be.

Finally i would like to request the committee members to walk the streets around the Aylesbury Town centre on Fridays and Saturdays evening to be able to understand why i am asking that there should not be another off-licence in the town.

Licensing Act 2003 - Prevention of crime and disorder

In recent weeks Aylesbury town centre and the surrounding area has been blighted by the activities of a small number of people who clearly have an alcohol dependency problem. Whilst we are attempting to engage the individuals with the appropriate authorities and services, we would seek your cooperation in dealing with the situation. Intelligence reveals that the individuals are obtaining alcohol from off sales as opposed to local pubs. If you are approached by any customer who is clearly under the influence of alcohol you must refuse to serve them. In fact section 141 of the Licensing Act 2003 makes it a criminal offence to 'sell or attempt to sell alcohol to a person who is drunk, or allow alcohol to be sold to such a person.'

When any individual is arrested for a drunken disorderly offence the police always ask where the alcohol was obtained from. Should any patterns of subsequent anti-social behaviour or criminality be linked to your premises, we will escalate the matter and consider the need for a review of the premises licence.

In the meantime we wish to work with your businesses and we are investigating producing photographs and other intelligence that may assist you and setting up protocols similar to the successful Aylesbury Pub watch. Whilst the majority of the public consume alcohol responsibly we are committed to addressing anti-social behaviour and under age consumption too. Thanks for your cooperation.

Within Aylesbury town centre the Police can confiscate alcohol from people drinking in a public area, where nuisance or annoyance to members of the public or disorder has been associated with the consumption of alcohol.

Please enjoy your alcohol but not in the town centre!





Dear Madame.



I am writing to you regarding the representation in respect of my premises license. As you are aware, we are a new business based on Buckingham Street, Aylesbury selling polish food. Our intention is to deliver polish people with food which reminds them of home and their families. We give them a taste of what they have been missing for a long time. We provide Polish as well as English speaking members of staff, who are experts in understanding our clientele, and also giving advice and guidance on our products to our English customers. In our first two weeks of operation, we experienced a lot of English customers willing to try our food. Our staff are always happy to help, translate and explain.

We are aware it may appear that we are the biggest competition to the shop (Booze Stop) opposite, who are selling a minor amount of polish food, and I believe this is the main reason for the objection you have received. This is not accurate, as we are a specialist in polish food, and we will be selling only traditional polish alcoholic drinks. Mr Vohra is running a typical off-license selling all kinds of alcohol and soft drinks popular with the general public and should not impact on his business.

After my meeting with the Licensing Officer of Thames Valley Police, Trevor Hooper, who suggested needed to change the hours of selling alcohol from 8.00 till 23.00. I agreed to this without any discussion or objection. I also showed Mr Hooper all the documentation I had prepared, including the Premises Age Verification Policy, Authorisation of selling alcohol – staff declaration, Register to show refusal of sale of age restricted products to minors, and posters including the Challenge 25 Scheme. Mr Hooper informed me that I have all the necessary documentation in place and he cannot see any objection regarding my premises license.

I have been awarded the BIIAB Level 2 Award for Personal License Holders on the 22 May 2012, which proves I have current and up to date information. With this in mind, my staff and I are fully trained and prepared to deal with the 4 licensing objectives which were raised:

- The prevention of crime and disorder
- Public safety
- The prevention of public nuisance
- The protection of children from harm

As mentioned previously, the following policies are in place to ensure my staff and I will achieve the above licensing objectives:

- Authorisation of selling alcohol under the Licensing Act 2003. staff declaration.
- No selling of alcohol to any under 18's (Age Verification Policy).
- No selling liquer chocolate to under 16's.
- No selling alcohol to drunk people.

- Challenge 25 Scheme.
- Warning notices displayed: It is a criminal offence to buy alcohol on behalf of a child, It is an offence for persons under 18 years of age to purchase or attempt to purchase alcohol.
- Selling will only take place within the hours specified on the premises licence (8.00 – 23.00). Outside of these selling hours, the fridge containing alcoholic drinks will be locked.
- A colour CCTV system capable of covering both inside and outside the premises.
- Good staff training and awareness (Employee Training Book will be signed by both employee and employer).
- Refusal to sell alcohol to any person is recorded and reasons provided.
- Regular reminders and training of staff if in doubt always ask for ID.

I believe that under the European Law, the objection made by any rival businesses should be rejected. In doing so, this will allow competition and ensure quality and customer service is delivered. Please note, that there are no objections raised by any other local business, so the points raised in the objection are not reflected in the general area. I request representation from Mr Vohra (Booze Stop) is not accepted by Aylesbury Vale District Council.

With regards to the second representation, received from a Mr Pathmaseelan, you will notice that the wording in both letters is identical. This would lead me to believe that Mr Vohra requested Mr Pathmaseelan to sign and submit this letter. As a person who currently operates an off-licence, Mr Vohra knew what to raise in his letter to hold up our premises license application.


Finally, I strongly feel that a hearing is unnecessary, and I urge the Aylesbury Vale District Council to refuse both representations allow our application to proceed.


