The applicant is aware that the premises fall within a cumulative impact area.
The applicant believes that, due to the steps that it takes to promote the licensing objectives, the grant of the variation will not add to the cumulative impact referred to in the licensing policy.
b) The prevention of crime and disorder
1. A digital CCTV system will be installed, or the existing system maintained, such system to be fit for the purpose.
2. The CCTV system shall be capable of producing immediate copies on site. Copies of recordings will either be recorded digitally on to CD/DVD or other equivalent medium.
3. Any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days and shall be made available, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, to the police for inspection on request.
4. The precise positions of the cameras may be agreed, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, with the police from time to time.
5. The system will display, on any recording, the correct time and date of the recording.
6. The CCTV system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity.
7. If there is only one member of staff on duty between 0000 and 0500, the entrance door to the shop will be closed to customers and any sales between these hours will be made through the night pay window.
8. All cashiers shall be trained to record refusals of sales of alcohol in a refusals log/register. The book/register will contain:
- details of the time and date the refusal was made; - the identity of the staff member refusing the sale; - details of the alcohol the person attempted to purchase.
This log/register will be available for inspection by a police officer or other authorised officer on request.
9. An incident book/register shall be maintained to record:
- All incidents of crime and disorder occurring at the premises - Details of occasions when the police are called to the premises
This book/register will be available for inspection by a police officer or other authorised officer on request.

c) Public safety

The premises licence holder will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff. Such staff levels will be disclosed, on request, to the licensing authority and police.

- d) The prevention of public nuisance
- 1. Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers shall be provided in and immediately outside the premises.
- 2. The plan which accompanies this application indicates the proposed position for the display and storage of alcohol. The alcohol may be displayed or stored, from time to time, in different positions within the premises.
- e) The protection of children from harm
- 1. The premises licence holder will ensure that an age verification policy will apply to the premises whereby all cashiers will be trained to ask any customer attempting to purchase alcohol, who appears to be under the age of 25 years (or older if the licence holder so elects) to produce, before being sold alcohol, identification being a passport or photocard driving licence bearing a holographic mark or other form of identification that complies with any mandatory condition that may apply to this licence.
- 2. All staff engaged or to be engaged in the sale of alcohol on the premises shall receive the following training in age restricted sales:
- Induction training which must be completed and documented prior to the sale of alcohol by the staff member.

 Refresher/reinforcement training at intervals of no more than 6 months.

Training records will be available for inspection by a police officer or other authorised officer on request.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

Continued from previous page...

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Mandatory Condition - s19 of the Licensing Act 2003 - Supply of Alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

MANDATORY CONDITIONS SPECIFIED BY THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS) ORDER 2010 AS AMENDED BY THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS)(AMENDMENT) **ORDER 2014:**

Mandatory Condition 1

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a)a holographic mark, or .
 - (b)an ultraviolet feature.

- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(b).
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.—(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

3 Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hour means the hours set out on page one of this licence.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

4 **General Licensing Objectives**

- a) The plan which accompanies this application indicates the proposed position for the display and storage of alcohol.
- b) The alcohol may be displayed or stored, from time to time, in different positions within the premises.

5 The prevention of crime and disorder

- a) A CCTV system will be maintained which is fit for the purpose. The system will incorporate a camera covering the entrance door and be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard.
- b) The CCTV system will incorporate a recording facility and any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of one calendar month. A system will be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained.
- c) The CCTV system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity.
- d) The precise position of the cameras may be agreed with the police from time to time.
- e) The supply of hot food shall not be made through the night pay window.

6 Public Safety

a) The applicant will at all times maintain adequate levels of staff. Such staff levels will be disclosed, on request, to the licensing authority and police.

I am submitting this representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority in respect of this application to vary the Premises Licence to extend the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

The premises is currently licensed to sell alcohol between 08:00 and 23:00 and provide late night refreshment between 23:00 and 05:00. The proposal is to extend the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol to 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The premises is located approximately 300 metres from the centre of Buckingham on the south side of the A422. There are a significant number of residential dwellings within close proximity. The premises is located within the special Buckingham Town Centre 'Terminal Hours Policy' area. This policy states that applications to open beyond midnight will normally be refused unless the applicant satisfies the licensing authority that it can operate without harming the licensing objectives and any application to open beyond 1:30am will be refused.

While it is acknowledged that the premises can currently trade 24 hours, 7 days a week, without a licence, we are concerned that the availability of alcohol for the proposed extended hours presents additional risk to the promotion of the licensing objectives. Paragraph 4.7 of the Licensing Authority's policy acknowledges that there may be good reason to restrict hours in respect of 'off sales' at shops, stores and supermarkets in certain locations such as Buckingham Town Centre.

The premises is located a relatively short walking distance from the centre of Buckingham. Buckingham is home to a number of licensed and 'late' licensed premises. The 'late' licensed premises are summarised below:

We are concerned that the availability of alcohol at the applicant's premises late at night will be attractive to patrons departing other locally licensed premises wishing to acquire more alcohol to prolong their

evening. Furthermore, in general the availability of late night alcohol is likely to be of interest to local revellers, including members of the local sizeable student community. The increased availability of alcohol is likely to lead to a substantial increase in visitors to this premises late at night, many of whom will be arriving by foot and/or will have already consumed alcohol. This will undoubtedly lead to an increase in nuisance and disorder types issues at the premises and in the immediate vicinity. Given the close proximity of residential dwellings, it is inevitable that local residents will experience disturbance.

The applicants have stated that due to the proposed measures in their operating schedule the variation in hours will not add to the cumulative impact referred to in the policy. We respectfully disagree. We believe that it is inevitable that the late night offering of alcohol at these premises, which is located in a residential area, a short distance from Buckingham town centre, will have an adverse impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives. The applicants have only offered minimal additional measures, essentially the provision of incident and refusal books and a proposal to close the door to customers between midnight and 5am if there is one member of staff on duty. In terms of preventing public nuisance the proposed measures have been reduced, notably the requirement to display prominent 'respect the neighbours' type notices has been removed and no alternate measures have been proposed.

In accordance with paragraphs 4.3 and 4.4 of the Licensing Authority's policy, the Licensing Authority's approach to determining licensed hours is to respect the right of residents to peace and quiet and in general will take a stricter approach to licensing hours in areas of higher residential density. It is recommended that this application be refused for the reasons given to best ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives.

At the meeting of the Full Council on Monday 25th June 2018 Members considered this application, at the request of a resident. They voted unanimously to oppose the extension of hours, many being of the opinion that no petrol station should have an alcohol licence at all.

Buckingham is a very quiet town in the early morning, especially since Tesco started to close at midnight. There has been a noticeable drop in the numbers of alcohol-related incidents, and Members are very aware that - should there be a problem - we do not have the level of policing we used to have.

Concern was expressed that, if this was the only available outlet after midnight in the town and surrounding area, it would attract those desperate for alcohol, resulting in disturbance and extra traffic. At present, after the pubs have shut, they have nowhere else to go except home. Opposite the BP station are North End Court and Mary MacManus Drive, both VAHT sheltered housing complexes, and there is other housing surrounding the site.

Members were informed that the filling station is single-manned at night, and does not display a Pubwatch sticker, so the lone member of staff will have to be able to check whether the customer is under-age or already inebriated via the night-hatch, and has no back-up should the customer become troublesome if refused a sale.

The consensus was that Buckingham does not need the extended hours.
