 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority:
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Licensing Act 2003 – Representing from the Licensing Authority Premises: Buckingham Store, 28 West Street, Buckingham, MK18 1HE

I am submitting this representation on behalf of the Licensing Authority in respect of this application to vary the Premises Licence to extend the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

The premises is currently licensed to sell alcohol between 07:00 and 23:00 every day. The proposal is to extend the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol to between 06:00 and 01:00 on the day following, 7 days a week.

The premises is located in the centre of Buckingham, within the special Buckingham Town Centre 'Terminal Hours Policy' area. This policy states that applications to open beyond midnight will normally be refused unless the applicant satisfies the licensing authority that it can operate without harming the licensing objectives and any application to open beyond 1:30am will be refused. Applications to open until 12:00 midnight will be dealt with on their own individual merit.

While it is acknowledged that the premises can currently trade 24 hours, 7 days a week, without a licence, we are concerned that the availability of alcohol for the proposed extended hours presents additional risk to the promotion of the licensing objectives. Paragraph 4.7 acknowledges that there may be good reason to restrict hours in respect of 'off sales' at shops, stores and supermarkets in certain locations such as Buckingham Town Centre.

The premises is located in the centre of Buckingham. Buckingham Town Centre contain a mix of residential and business dwellings, with the residential element consisting of houses, flats and retirement flats catering for a wide range of ages and lifestyles. Among the business uses, are a sizeable number of licensed and 'late' licensed premises. The 'late' licensed premises are summarised below:

We are concerned that the availability of alcohol at the applicant's premises late at night will be attractive to patrons departing other locally licensed premises wishing to acquire more alcohol to prolong their evening. Furthermore, in general the availability of late night alcohol is likely to be of interest to local revellers, including members of the local sizeable student community. The increased availability of alcohol is likely to lead to a substantial increase in visitors to this premises late at night into the early hours of the morning, many of whom will be arriving by foot and/or will have already consumed alcohol. This will undoubtedly lead to an increase in nuisance and disorder types issues at the premises and in the immediate vicinity.

The applicant have acknowledged in their application that they are located in the central area of Buckingham and the purpose of the variation is to achieve higher sales. However, the applicant has not acknowledged or addressed the areas of concern raised in the Council's policy relating to Buckingham Town Centre. The applicant has proposed no additional measures or explained why they believe their proposal will not impact negatively on the promotion of the licensing objectives. We believe that it is likely that the late night offering of alcohol at these premises, will have an adverse impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

In accordance with paragraphs 4.5 and 4.7 and chapter 6 of the Licensing Authority's licensing policy, it is recommended that the application to sell alcohol to 1am be refused as I believe the proposed later hours are likely to have an adverse impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives. The applicant has presented no evidence to demonstrate consideration of, or proposals to rebut, the Licensing Authority's strict policy not to grant applications to sell alcohol beyond midnight in Buckingham Town Centre.

Furthermore, paragraphs 4.1 to 4.4 and paragraph 4.7 of the Licensing Authority's policy, sets out the Licensing Authority's general approach when determining licensed hours. The approach is to consider each application on its individual merit while respecting the right of residents to peace and quiet and taking a stricter approach to licensing hours in areas of higher residential density. Again the applicant has offered no evidence to demonstrate consideration of the licensing policy or proposals to mitigate the risks to the promotion of the licensing objectives as a consequence of the proposed extended hours. Accordingly it is recommended that this application be refused in its entirety for the reasons given to best ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives.



Application for a variation to the premise licence of Buckingham Stores. 28 West Street, Buckingham, MK18 1HE.

On Monday 17th September 2018 an application was submitted by Sabaratnam Sivananthan to vary the licensable activities for a premise known as Buckingham Store at the above address. The premises was previously known as West Street local and has been in operation since 2013.

The application.

This application is to extend the sale of alcohol every day to cover the hours 0600 to 0100 the following day, it does not apply to extend the opening hours of the premise.

What is in place now.

The licence as issued on the 22nd August 2013 to the previous applicant is for the sale of alcohol every day from 0700 to 2300hrs daily with opening hours of 0600 to 2300hrs daily. Besides the Mandatory conditions on the licence at the request of the police the previous applicant agreed to a number of conditions that would promote the licensing objectives.

General Licensing Objectives

- a) No ID, no sale for age restricted products
- b) Think 25 schemes to increase the number of checks and try to eliminate under age sale
- c) Increase staff awareness through regular training
- d) Posters and stickers to Highlight "Think 25" scheme

The prevention of crime and disorder

- a) CCTV operation with 30 day recording and burn discs when requested by authorities
- b) No sale to person under influence of alcohol or any other drug

Public Safety

- a) Ensure shop is free from any trip hazards
- b) Highlight any issues regarding trips

The prevention of public nuisance

a) No sale to person under influence of alcohol

The protection of children from harm

- a) No ID, no sale
- b) Staff training
- c) Think 25 Scheme operated

Non-standard timings

It was also agreed at the time to allow Non Standard timings for the sale of alcohol and extension of opening times on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve by one hour to 00.00hrs.

History of premise

The licence has been in existence since August 2013 and has operated incident free with no complaints.

Problems within Buckingham town associated with Alcohol

Buckingham over the years has suffered from late night early morning disturbance so much so that Aylesbury Vale District Council has introduced into their Licensing Policy a Terminal Hours Policy for Buckingham Town centre.

TERMINAL HOURS POLICY - BUCKINGHAM TOWN CENTRE

The Licensing Authority's Terminal Hours Policy for Buckingham Town Centre is as follows:

- 6.2 In Buckingham as shown on the map at Appendix 6, the following policies shall apply:
- 6.3 Buckingham town centre is characterised by the proximity of licensed premises and housing, which has caused disturbance to local residents, particularly those living near to licensed premises and on exit routes from the town centre. The Council's Environmental Health and Licensing services and Thames Valley Police have received a number of complaints from local residents from both the town centre and Nelson Street reporting disturbances caused by noise late at night.
- 6.4 To date Buckingham town centre has not been subject to any form of restraint policy. Licensing hours have been determined generally by way of disputed applications for material variations and resulted in a latest terminal hour for the sale of alcohol until 1.00 a.m. and closure at 1.30 a.m., although there are a range of licensed hours within the town. However, the Licensing Authority believes it important to set out in a transparent way its likely approach to applications to trade to later hours, for the benefit of residents and current and potential operators and investors.
- 6.5 Buckingham is home to an independent university with around 2000 students, most of whom live on campus (approximately 1300) but a significant number live in accommodation in and around the town. The university has become increasingly popular as it offers honours degrees in two years of intensive study.

6.6 The Council will take the following policy approach to contested licence
applications: ☐ Applications for a premises licence to open up to 12.00 midnight will be dealt with on their own individual merits having regard to other provisions in this Licensing Policy.
□ Applications to open beyond 12.00 midnight will normally be refused unless the applicant satisfies the Licensing Authority that it can operate beyond that time without harm to the licensing objectives.
□ The Licensing Authority's Policy is that applications to open beyond 1.30 a.m. will be refused.
☐ This policy is intended to be strictly applied so as to maintain a fair balance between the right of residents to sleep and operators and their guests respectively to offer and enjoy premises into the later hours.

Off sales in Buckingham now.

Buckingham has 14 premises that are permitted to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises these consist of Off Licences, petrol stations and stores .All but two close at 2300hrs the two that do not, one closes at midnight and is situated on the ring road away from the town and the other is Tesco on the London road with a twenty four hour licence.

It is true to say that all 14 have offered and have conditions that promote the licensing objectives.

This application.

The applicant has recently taken over the premises (April 2018.) It would appear that he has not sighted the Council Licensing policy as he would know that an hour's policy is in place for Buckingham for premises making application after 12 midnight.

The applicant describes the nature of the proposed variation "He would like the variation in order to achieve higher sales".

He asks for extended alcohol sales but not extended opening hours.

He does not offer any conditions to promote any of the licensing objectives.

The latest government guidance states=

- 8.43 While applicants are not required to seek the views of responsible authorities before formally submitting their application, they may find them to be a useful source of expert advice on local issues that should be taken into consideration when making an application. Licensing authorities may wish to encourage co-operation between applicants, responsible authorities and, where relevant, local residents and businesses before applications are submitted in order to minimise the scope for disputes to arise.
- 8.44 Applicants are expected to provide licensing authorities with sufficient information in this section to determine the extent to which their proposed steps are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives in the local area. Applications must not be based on providing a set of standard conditions to promote the licensing objectives and applicants

are expected to make it clear why the steps they are proposing are appropriate for the premises

Thames Valley Police would object to this application and ask that the hour's policy for Buckingham be invoked.

It would also object on the grounds that the applicant has offered no conditions to promote the licensing objectives and the application itself seeks to promote greater sales of alcohol.
