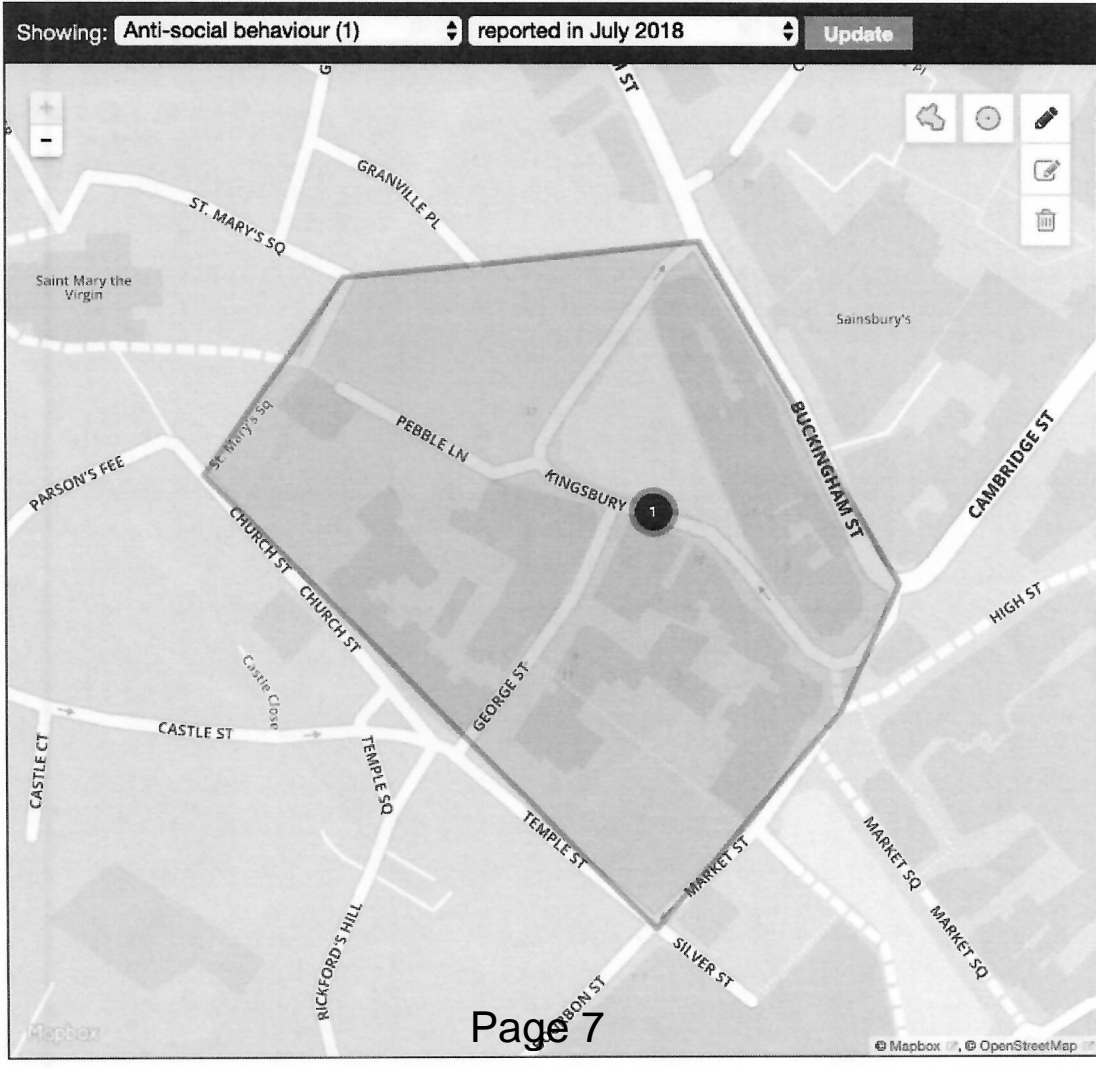
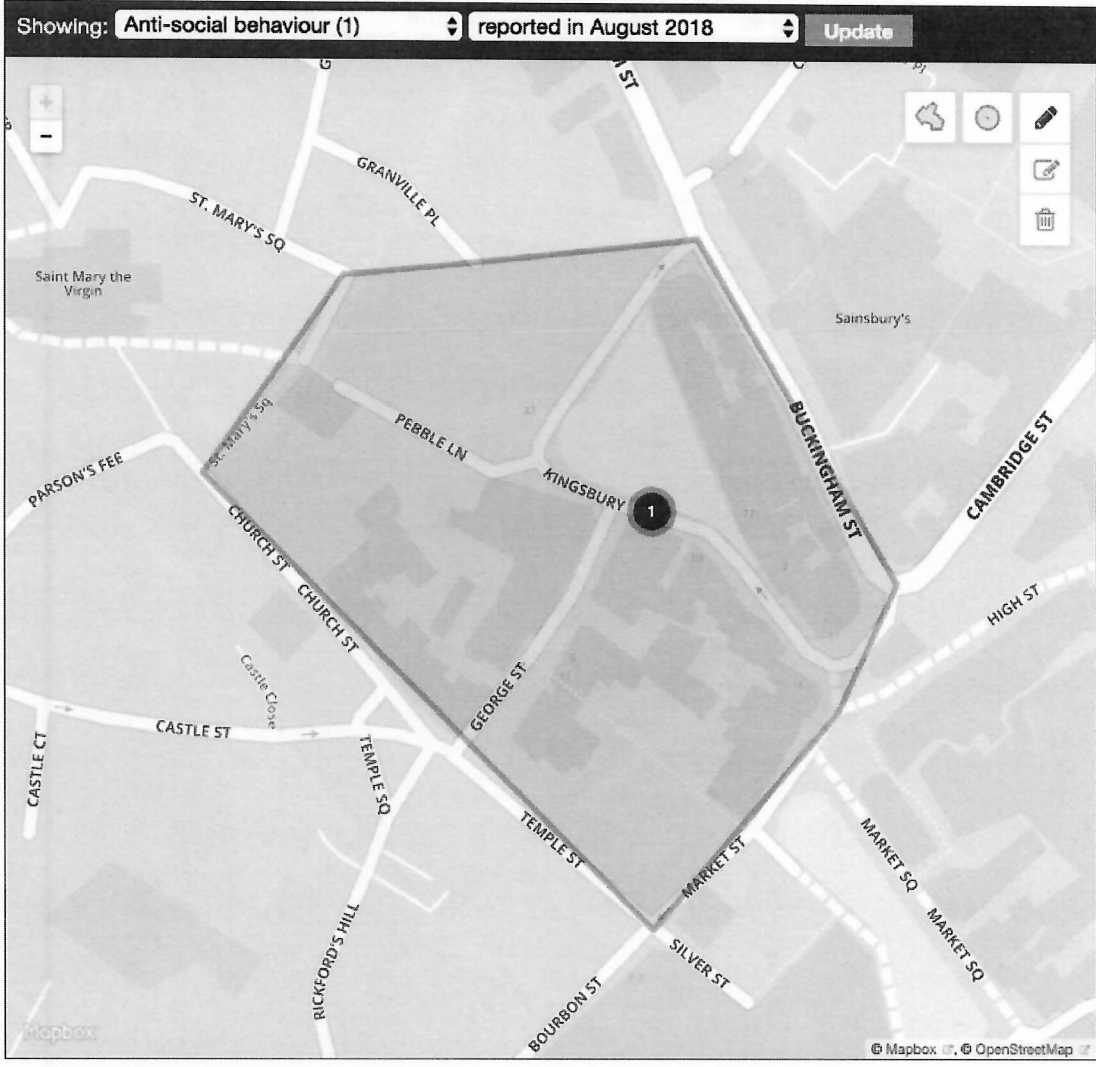


Showing: Anti-social behaviour (5) reported in October 2018 Update



Showing: Anti-social behaviour (6) reported in September 2018 Update

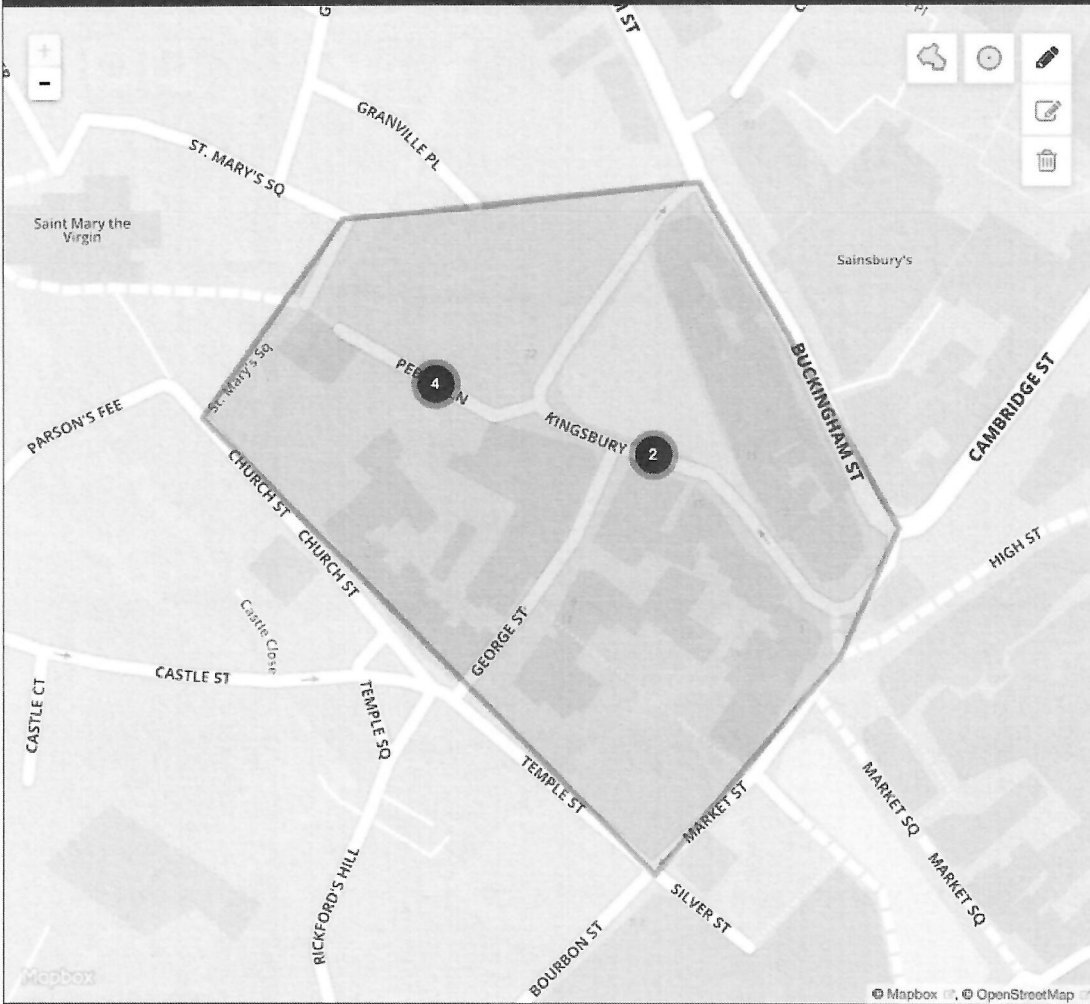




Showing: Anti-social behaviour (6)

reported in June 2018

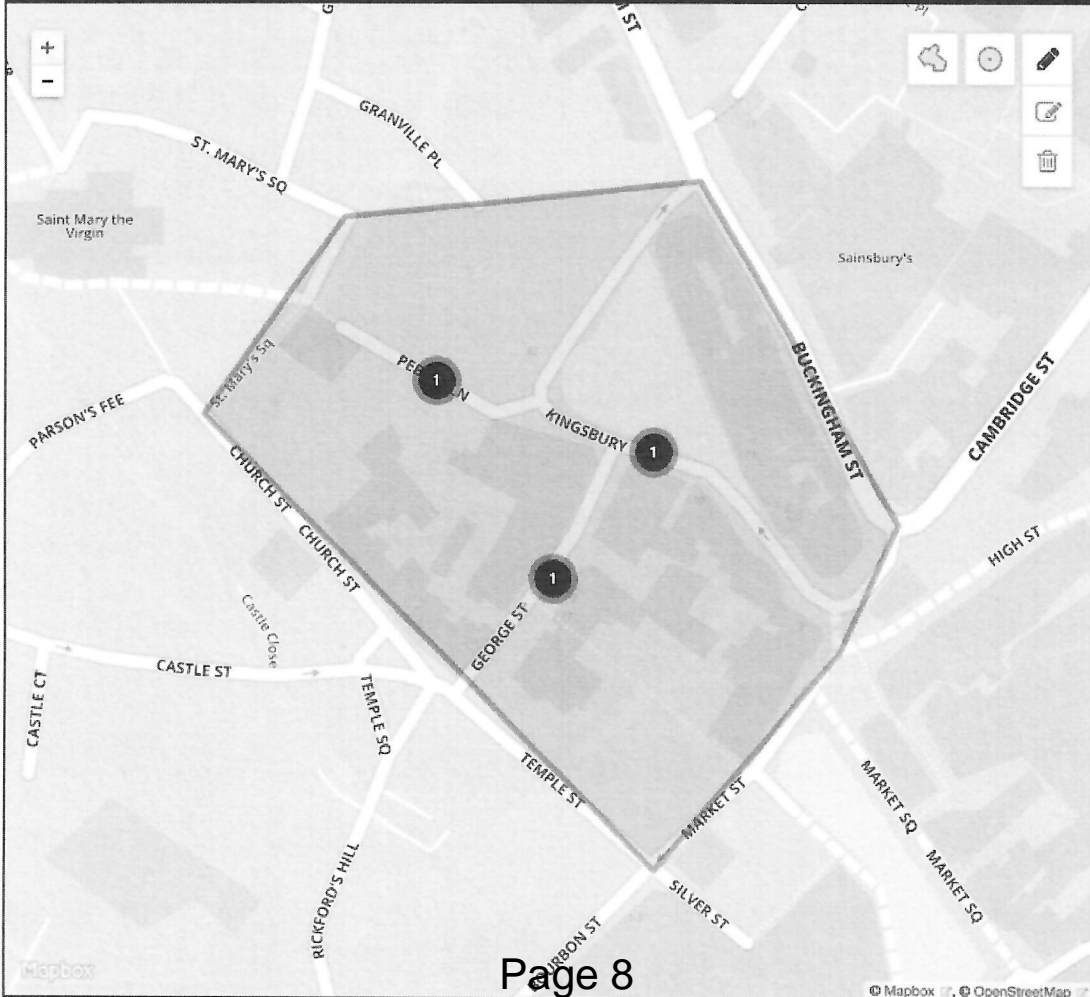

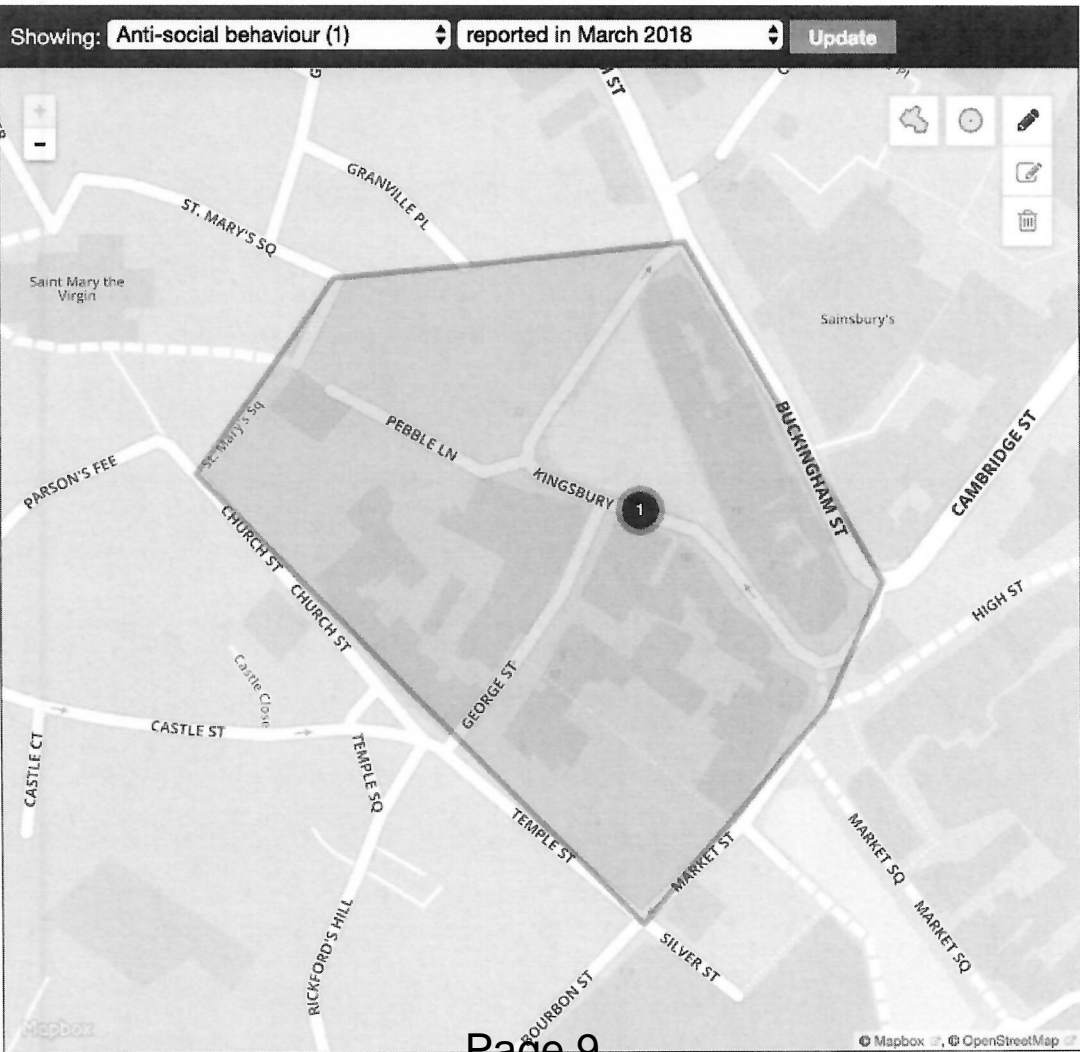
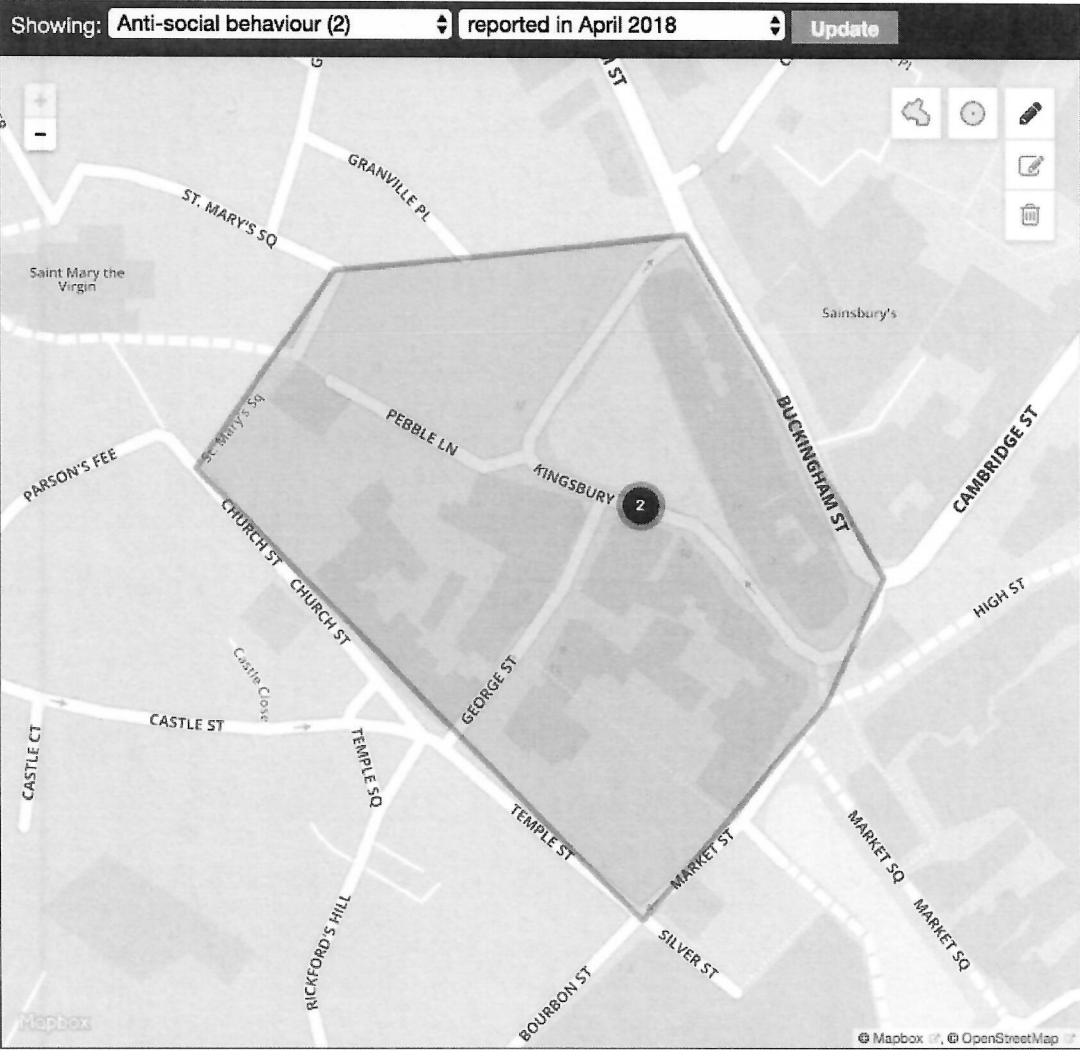


Showing: Anti-social behaviour (3)

File note

28 February 2019

I arrived in Aylesbury Town Centre at approximately 10:00am and walked to Kingsbury. On entering Kingsbury I observed 4 males congregated with a motorised scooter around a bench in the middle of the square. One of the males, who was wearing a black jacket, was holding a can of drink in his left hand (black can with red writing). One of the group held a black carrier bag which appeared to contain canned drinks. He placed the bag on a bench next to a rucksack. (Photograph 1).

The males were stood in close proximity to Kingsbury Newsagent. (Photograph 2)

I walked around the immediate vicinity and noted an empty can of cider had been discarded in George Street, a short distance from Kingsbury. The can was black with a red logo, labelled "Union Black" 8.4abv (Photograph 3).

I observed that one of the males (brown jacket) was now sat down and drinking from a can. There were now 5 males in total gathered. (Photograph 4)

I crossed Kingsbury and observed the males for a while. 3 of the males were now sat and 2 stood. I observed 2 of the males sat down drinking, one from a black can and one from a blue can. One of the males standing appeared intoxicated and he continued to drink from a can. He was swaying, talking loudly, including the use of expletives and he regularly spat on the ground. The fifth male produced a can from his pocket from which he began drinking. (Photograph 5).

I looked towards Kingsbury Newsagent which was open and trading. There was a sign clearly visible across Kingsbury which stated "off licence". As I walked past the shop I observed there appeared to be no alcohol on display. (Photograph 6).

I observed that the "off licence" signs protruding above the shop were clearly visible when travelling in either direction in the vicinity of the shop. (Photographs 7 and 8).

Hi,

Street drinking in Kingsbury is still frequent and occurring regularly. It goes without saying that this is worse in the sunshine/warm weather which we notice as the town centre neighbourhood team/PCSO's on patrol daily in the area. In terms of calls to us, we don't receive that many reports via 101/999 regarding this issue, but no doubt the businesses in the area notice it. We challenge/enforce this using the PSPO and try and keep street drinking to a minimum here, but it does, as ever, continue to be a hotspot.

I would add, that most of the regulars just sit there and don't usually cause too much issue, (apart from drinking alcohol) and discard alcohol/comply with our directions regarding breaching the no-drinking zone. However, they can display drunkenness which is not good in terms of public perception of this area.

Just to clarify, do you still want names of offenders to issue warnings to? (a lot are homeless however)

I saw a group of 6-8 males and females gathered around a bench by a tree near to the taxi rank outside of Fever and Cirque. A number of the group were holding and drinking from open cans of lager. A lady who was a part of the group was also scooting around the square on an adult size scooter. Those gathered in the group did not look like they were on a night out in Aylesbury town, they appeared scruffy and dishevelled in appearance. After visiting a premise in Kingsbury Square we left approximately 20 minutes later and the group were still gathered and drinking.
