

The current implementation of the testing process does not fully meet the recommendations from JESIP and, due to the ad hoc scheduling and implementation, is prohibiting officer participation. This has been raised with TVP, who will try to include officers in the test. Ultimately, the test needs to be run as recommended, which requires the participation of SWASFT. This has been raised with the JESIP strategic lead for discussion. It should be noted that Fire are not the lead agency for this activity, and the current arrangements have been put in place as an interim solution only
