The Ridgeway passes over the chalk hills of the Chilterns and North Wessex Downs AONBs. It is 87 miles long between Ivinghoe Beacon and Avebury. It is one of 15 National Trails in England and Wales.

Since its launch in June 2015, The Ridgeway Partnership oversees management. Partners include local authorities, Country Land and Business Association, British Horse Society, Ramblers Society, Chilterns Society, AONBs etc.

The National Trails workshop is based at Eynsham near Oxford. Routine maintenance of the Trail is done by Trail and partner

volunteers.

National Trails across England need your support. DEFRA funding to the Trails reduces by 5% in 2019-20, with potential for further cuts in future years - the Ridgeway grant is £64,025. It is now critical to fundraise and pool resources in order to provide a great Trail to the public.




- Opportunities for all Ridgeway user groups walkers, cyclists, horse riders.
- Experiences for the full range of abilities within these user groups, but the main focus should be upon easy to moderate.
- At least one walk and one ride in the Chilterns and in the North Wessex Downs AONB which could be considered 'easy access'.
- Inspires people to visit The Ridgeway and try areas they have not visited before.
- Provides positive visitor experiences throughout the year.
- Is convenient to travel to, e.g. train station, car parking.
- Promotes good quality and distinctive local businesses.
- Encourages sustainable and responsible behaviour.
- Meets or is close to National Trail standards.
- Strengthens The Ridgeway and National Trail brand.
- Recognises the assistance of partners and volunteers in the maintenance of the routes.
- Celebrates the highlights/landmarks on and very near The Ridgeway.
 Together these features must convey the full 'story' and local distinctiveness of the Trail in terms of range of natural and cultural heritage, local communities, great local services, sporting challenge etc.

Attractions to be incorporated:

- Great pubs, cafes, farmshops.
- Great viewpoints, especially scenic landscapes, striking landforms.
- Visible historic features and battlefields.
- Attractive historic buildings, churches and settlements.
- Innovative/unique visitor attractions including special shops, e.g. breweries, museums.
- Sporting challenges, e.g. county high points.
- Nature reserves open to the public.
- Spiritual and creative places,
 e.g. places in famous poems.

What does the Buckinghamshire stretch contribute to The Ridgeway's appeal?




Attractions to be excluded:
