THE COORDINATED SCHEME FOR **PRIMARY SCHOOLS** IN THE AREA OF BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL LOCAL AUTHORITY FOR 2008/2009 ADMISSIONS

Introduction

1. This scheme is made by Buckinghamshire County Council (BCC) in line with the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 as amended by the Education Act 2002 and the Education and Inspections Act 2006 and supported by the Education (Co-Ordination of Admission Arrangements)(Secondary Schools)(England) Regulations 2002.

Interpretation

3. In this scheme:

"the LA" means Buckinghamshire County Council (BCC) acting in its capacity as the local authority.

"the LA area" means the area in respect of which the LA is the local authority.

"home LA" means the LA in which the applicant is resident.

"primary education" "secondary education" "primary school" "secondary school" have the same meaning as in Section 2(1), 2(2), 5(1), and 5(2) respectively in the Education Act 1996;

"school" means a community, foundation or voluntary aided or controlled (but not a special school) which is maintained by the LA.

"foundation school" means those of the schools which are designated foundation schools.

"voluntary-aided school" means those of the schools which are designated voluntary aided schools.

"admission authority" in relation to a community or voluntary-controlled school means the LA and, in relation to a foundation or voluntary-aided school means the governing body of that school.

"the specified year" means the school year beginning at or about the beginning of September 2008.

"Admission arrangements" mean the arrangements for a particular school or schools which govern the procedures and decision making for the purposes of admitting pupils to the school.

"Casual admission" means any application for a school place in primary education that is received after 1 September 2008, including those received during the academic year commencing September 2008.

"Eligible for a place" means that a child has been placed on the school's ranked list at a position which falls within the school's published admission number.

The scheme

- 2. This scheme ("the scheme") relates to admission arrangements for pupils to all maintained primary schools in the LA area including transfers from infant to junior or combined schools at the end of Key Stage 1 (and, occasionally, later).
- 3. The scheme referred to in Paragraph 3 shall be determined in accordance with the provisions set out in Schedule 1 and processed in accordance with the timetable set out in Schedule 2.
- 4. The scheme shall apply to every primary school in the LA with the exception of special schools and shall take effect from September 2008.

SCHEDULE 1

PART 1: THE SCHEME

Buckinghamshire County Council will operate a co-ordinated scheme for primary school admission that takes into account the different admission rules operated by individual admission authorities for some primary schools. The scheme will be an **Equal Preference Scheme** with applied ranking at the stage of determining which shall be the actual offer when there is the potential of multiple offers.

- 1. There will be a standard application form known as the Common Application Form (CAF)
- 2. The CAF will be used for the purpose of admitting pupils into the Reception Year of primary schools and through the appropriate years of the Junior transfer.
- 3. All parents seeking entry for their child to a Buckinghamshire primary school, will be advised to obtain the CAF. This will be available in the Guide for Parents on Admissions (the guide).
- 4. There will also be the opportunity to complete an application on-line. Any reference to the CAF should also be interpreted as applying to the online application form.
- 5. The CAF will collect basic data such as name, address and date of birth of the child.
- 6. The CAF or online form must be used as the means of expressing a preference for a Buckinghamshire primary school for the purposes of the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 by parents seeking admission of their child to a maintained primary school in Buckinghamshire.

- 7. All preferences expressed on the CAF will be valid applications. Some foundation and voluntary-aided schools may require additional information to be provided on a supplementary form. Only parents applying to those schools may need to complete the supplementary forms, which will be supplied by the schools concerned. If the parents complete an online application, the schools may still require a supplementary form to be completed.
- 8. Parents who wish to apply to a school in the area of a different LA must complete that LA's form and return it to that LA.
- 9. The CAF and online application will:
 - a. Invite the parent to express up to three preferences for Buckinghamshire maintained primary schools in rank order of preference:
 - b. Invite parents to give reasons for each preference;
 - c. Explain that parents will receive no more than one offer of a Buckinghamshire place, which will be:
 - i. The highest ranking school at which their child is eligible for a place;
 - ii. If a place cannot be offered at any of the preferred schools and the child is a resident of Buckinghamshire, a place will be offered at the nearest Buckinghamshire maintained school with vacancies; and
 - d. Specify the closing date for applications and where it should be returned.
- 10. The LA will make appropriate arrangements to ensure:
 - a. that the CAF is available on request from the LA and from all primary schools in the LA area; and
 - b. every parent whose application falls within the category of a casual admission receives a copy of the CAF (and written explanation) on request.
- 11. Where a maintained school receives a supplementary form it will not be regarded as a valid application unless the parent has also completed a CAF and the school is given as one of the preferences. Parents are asked to return the supplementary forms directly to the foundation or VA schools and the school should notify the LA at latest by one week before the closing date so that the LA can make sure that the parent has also completed a CAF form or online application. Under the requirements of the scheme, parents will not be under any obligation to fill in an individual school's supplementary form where this is not strictly required for the governing body to apply their admission rules.
- 12. All completed CAFs should be returned to the **Admissions Team at County Hall, by 5.30 pm (paper copy applications) or midnight (online applications) on 16 November 2007.** Junior transfer parents may hand their forms to their child's current school by the close of the school day on 14 November 2007. Rising 5 applicants should return the forms direct to the Admissions Team, County Hall.

Processing the applications

- 13. By 12 December 2007 the LA will notify the admissions authority for each of the schools of every preference expressed for the school. The LA will only pass on ranking information to schools that need the information to apply their own admission rules.
- 14. Each admission authority will then apply its own admission rules to the list of applicants for the school. Buckinghamshire County Council will be doing this for its community and voluntary-controlled schools. The Governing Bodies for the foundation and voluntary-aided schools, who will return a list ranked on admission criteria by 15 January 2008 showing which rule each child as been placed at.
- 15. The LA will act as a 'clearing house' for the allocation of places by the relevant admission authorities. The LA will only make any decision with respect to the offer or refusal of a place in response to
 - any preference expressed on the CAF where it is acting in its separate capacity as an admission authority, or
 - if an applicant is eligible for a place at more than one school, or
 - where an applicant is not eligible for a place at any school that the parent has nominated.

Determination of the place to offer

The LA will allocate places in accordance with the provision set out as follows:

- 16. Where a child can be allocated a place at the school ranked first, this will become the firm offer. The pupil's name will then be removed from lists for other schools, and for each of those schools a child from the waiting list will be added to the offer list. Other children will move one place higher up the waiting list for those schools.
- 17. Where a child is not allocated a place at the first ranked school but is provisionally allocated a place at a school ranked second, this will be held provisionally pending further rounds in case the first preference place becomes available. Provisional allocations to the school ranked third on the parent's preference list will be withdrawn enabling other children to move up the list.
- 18. Where a child is provisionally allocated a place at his or her third ranked school but not at the first or second preferences, this will be held provisionally pending further rounds in case they lead to a higher preference becoming available, as in paragraph 15 above.
- 19. The above steps 16-18 will be repeated for all nominated preferences until it is not possible to offer any higher ranked school as a result of repeating the process.
- 20. Once all repetitions of the allocation round are complete, all allocations then in existence become the firm offer for each child.

- 21. Children who remain on the waiting list for a school will be treated as being refused a place by the admission authority.
- 22. Parents will have the right to appeal to an independent appeal panel if they so wish.

Children who have not been allocated a place in the iterative process

23. Buckinghamshire resident children will be offered a place at the nearest school with a vacancy. This will be based on the shortest designated route. Non–Buckinghamshire applicants will be referred back to their own LA.

Parents also applying to schools outside Buckinghamshire

24. The LA, which maintains those schools, will also be applying their scheme. If that LA can offer a place it will send an offer to the parent. The parents will then choose which offer to accept if they have also had an offer of a Buckinghamshire school.

The offer

- 25. The County Council will confirm with all Buckinghamshire schools details of the children who will be offered a place at the school, before the offer letters are sent, in line with the timetable in Schedule 2.
- 26. The County Council will send out all offer letters to Buckinghamshire parents who have applied for a primary school place. This will make clear where the offer is being made on behalf of the Governing Body of a foundation or voluntary-aided school.
- 27. Offers for school places will be posted on 19 February 2008 The offer letter and enclosed information will give details of:
 - The name of the school being offered.
 - The reasons why a place is not being offered at the other schools nominated.
 - The date by which the place must be accepted.

An enclosed leaflet will contain details of the statutory right to appeal and the steps to take if necessary. The acceptance of offers or the submission of an appeal should be notified to the LA by parents **within 14 days.**

Late applications

28. Late applications received after the **closing date of 16 November**, or in accordance with the timetable in schedule 2, will only be considered during the core processing time if they are received by a final date, which will be agreed each year. Applications received by this date will only be processed where there was good reason for the late application e.g. severe illness of single parent, or if a single parent can show they were not in the country during the relevant period.

29. Applications received after 31 December 2007 will not be processed until after 19 February 2008 when the timely applications have been allocated. They will then be processed in batches on a monthly basis.

Waiting lists

- 30. Children who have not been allocated a place at a preferred school may have their name placed on the waiting list for the school. The waiting list will be ranked in accordance with the school's admission rules.
- 31. The County Council will maintain waiting lists until the beginning of September 2008. After this time they will be handed over to be managed by the school and parents will be advised to contact the schools direct to remain on the waiting list.

Right to appeal

32. Parents who wish may appeal to an independent appeal panel for a place at different nominated school. These 'transfer appeals' will start in April and finish in July.

PART II – CASUAL ADMISSIONS: LATE TRANSFER PROCEDURE AFTER NORMAL DATE OF TRANSFER

- Common Application Forms (CAFs) will be sent out by the school approached by the parents or the LA within 5 working days of receipt of the request.
- 2. Where the child is identified as vulnerable, please refer to the vulnerable children policy (view at:

 http://www.buckscc.gov.uk/schools/documents/admissions/app_1_vulnerable_children.pdf

'Vulnerable children are those children who are at risk of social exclusion by being out of school, with associated risks such as substance abuse, offending and child abuse.'

If the child

- a) is a looked after child: then the admission will be managed in line with part 1 of the Vulnerable children procedure
- b) has been once permanently excluded: the admission will be managed in line with part 2 of the vulnerable children procedure
- has moved into the area or is required to move school due to social issues: the admission will be managed in line with part 3 of the vulnerable children procedure

All other children will be dealt with as follows:

Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools

- 3. Parents will be required to complete the CAF and return it to the LA.
- 4. Where the LA and the school agree that there is a vacancy, and there is no child on the waiting list with a higher priority, a place will be offered. If this is not possible schools nominated on the CAF form will be considered in preference order.
- 5. Where one or more schools nominated on the preference list is foundation or voluntary-aided school the LEA will liaise with the school and forward the application where appropriate.
- 6. If no place is available at a school on the preference list, and the child is a Buckinghamshire resident, then a place will be offered at the nearest appropriate school with a vacancy.
- 7. Children who have not been allocated a place at a preferred school may have their name placed on the waiting lists for the school. The waiting list will be ranked in accordance with the school's admission rules.
- 8. Parents will receive an offer letter detailing the place to be offered and the reasons why a higher nominated school could not be offered (where appropriate). Parents will be told of the right of appeal to the independent appeal process where appropriate.

Foundation or Voluntary-Aided Schools

- 9. Where a foundation or voluntary-aided school receives a direct application and there is a vacancy with no other child on the waiting list with a higher priority the place can be offered. The parent should be required to complete the CAF and receive an appropriate offer letter from the school.
- 10. Where the school does not have a vacancy or there are other children with a higher priority on the waiting list the parents should:
 - Receive an appropriate refusal letter explaining why a place was not offered:
 - Be referred back to the LA;
 - Be given information on the right to an independent appeal panel hearing; and
 - Be offered the option of a place on the waiting list.

The Buckinghamshire Admissions Policy for Community and Voluntary Controlled Primary Schools for September 2008

- 1. All applications must be made in accordance with the Buckinghamshire coordinated primary admissions scheme (the primary scheme).
- 2. All governing bodies are required by section 324 of the Education Act 1996 to admit to the school a child with a statement of special educational needs that names the school. These children will therefore be admitted prior to applying the admission rules.
- Once a child is allocated a place under the primary scheme the school will determine the date of entry in accordance with the policy of the school as published in the school prospectus.
- 4. Parents of children younger than five have the right to defer entry until no later than the term after the child's fifth birthday. This must be within the same academic year.
- 5. If a school has more places available than applications received then all children will be allocated a place.
- 6. If there are more applications received than the places available at a school then the places will be allocated within the primary scheme in accordance with the published admission rules for the school.
- 7. Details of the dates for timely applications and how late applications are handled are given in the primary scheme.
- 8. Where a child is admitted to a school's nursery or pre-school provision there can be no guarantee of a place in the main school as the coordinated admissions scheme is used to decide who should be admitted to the main school.

Admission rules for Buckinghamshire community and voluntarycontrolled primary schools

- 1. Children in public care for whom the Local Authority decides that the school is the most appropriate.
- 2. Children living within the catchment area of the school.
- 3. 'Siblings of children who are attending the school or a 'linked primary' school in Year R Year 5 at the time allocations are made or who have already been offered a place to start in the current academic year at the school (or a 'linked primary school').
- 4. (For voluntary-controlled schools only) Children whose parents have expressed a preference for a Church of England school supported by evidence that at least one parent has been a regular worshipper (an average of at least twice per month) at an Anglican church. You should

- ask your priest or minister to complete a 'supplementary form' as evidence.
- 5. Children who have exceptional medical, educational or social needs, which can only be met at that school, supported by written evidence from an appropriate professional person.
- 6. 'Children attending a primary school linked to the school named in the list of 'linked primary' schools at the time allocations are made. A list of linked primary schools is attached as Appendix 1.
- 7. Once the above rules have been applied, then any further places will be offered in distance order, using the distance between the family's normal home address and the school's nearest entrance gate, offering the closest first. We use the shortest appropriate route. (Details of how the distance is measured are set out below).
- 8. Where a school can take some, but not all, of the children who qualify under one of these rules, we will give priority to children taking account of the next rule in the numbered list.

Explanation of terms used in the admission rules.

Definition of Looked After Child

1. To qualify under rule 2 (the Looked after Children rule) there should be an agreement between a designated officer acting on behalf of the county council as corporate parent and a designated officer of the LA that the school will more appropriately meet the child's needs.

Definition of parent

- 2. This is as defined in law (the Education Act 1996) as either:
 - Both natural parents provided they were married to each other at the time of the birth or have married each other since;
 - Any person who has parental responsibility for the child or young person; or
 - Any person who has care of the child or young person.

Definition of sibling

- 3. A sibling is a brother or sister. For admission purposes this means 'brothers and sisters of whole or half blood, or any other child (including an adopted child) who permanently resides at the same address and for whom the parent also has parental responsibility'.
- 4. We will only consider a pupil in a primary school as a 'sibling' if he or she is attending the school or a linked primary school at the time of allocating, or has been formally offered a place at the school in the operation of the Coordinated Primary Admissions Scheme.

Multiple births – twins, triplets etc

- 5. In cases where there is one remaining place and the next child on the waiting list is one of a twin, triplet or other multiple birth group the following will apply:
 - 1) For admission to Key Stage 1

Only one child may be admitted. This will be the child who would have the first name alphabetically. Parents have the option of seeking an alternative school able to admit both (or all) of the children.

2) For admission to classes other than at Key Stage 1

Both twins would be admitted (or all the siblings in the case of multiple births) even if this goes above the admission number of the school.

Definition of home to school distance

- 6. The shortest appropriate route will be measured according to the Buckinghamshire County Council's Geographical Information System. The distance measured for the shortest appropriate route will be determined by using a combination of two databases:
 - The Ordnance Survey Integrated Transport Network (ITN) data, which is updated twice a year. This includes road types from Motorways to pedestrianised streets; and
 - ii. In addition, a data file of footpaths, where the County Council is satisfied that the routes have a proper made up surface such as tarmac or concrete. This can be viewed at: http://www.buckscc.gov.uk/bcc/get//assets/docs/schools/Footpaths_Nov2006.pdf

In each case the data will be fixed during the Autumn term prior to the allocations.

Primary School Catchment Areas

Nursery Admissions Policy for September 2008

Background Information

- 1. Prior to compulsory education, every child is entitled to receive free education from the start of the term following his or her 3rd birthday. This can be in a private nursery, independent school, child minder network or maintained school setting of the parent's choice
- 2. There are three types of maintained early years provision in Buckinghamshire schools at present. These are:
 - Nursery schools
 - Nursery classes in schools
 - Pre-Rising 5 classes in schools

Nursery Classes

- 3. Responsibility for admission to nursery classes has been delegated to governing bodies. There is no automatic admission into main school from these classes and this is stated in the letter offering a place in the nursery. These nursery classes accommodate 3 and 4 year-old children. Nursery age children do not count as part of the roll for the school and children will not be guaranteed a place in the main school. They must apply in accordance with the coordinated scheme and places are then allocated in line with the admissions rules for the school.
- 4. Parents can register their child with the school for consideration for a place in the nursery once the child has reached 2 years of age. Places are not allocated, however, on the basis of when the registrations were made. A child cannot normally be admitted until the term after he or she becomes 3 years old. If the number of applications exceeds the number of places then places will be allocated in the following order:
 - 1) Children who have a statement of special educational need which names the school.
 - 2) Children in public care for whom the Local Authority decides that the school is the most appropriate.
 - 3) Children who have exceptional medical, educational or social needs supported by written evidence from an appropriate professional.
 - 4) Children living within the catchment area of the school
 - 5) Siblings of children who are attending the school at the time allocations are made or attend a linked primary school at the time allocations are made.
 - 6) Once the above rules have been applied, then any further places will be offered in distance order, using the distance between the family's normal home address and the school's nearest entrance gate: offering the closest first. Details of how the distance is measured are set out below. Where a school can take some, but not all of the children who qualify under a particular rule, we will give priority to children by taking account of the next rule in the numbered list.

The terms used in these rules are as defined in the primary scheme. The catchment area used is also as defined in the primary scheme.

Nursery Schools

- 5. There are 2 schools Bowerdean and Henry Allen. They take children on a part time basis and the following admission rules apply:
 - a. Children who have a statement of special educational need naming the school.
 - b. Children in public care for whom the Local Authority decides that the school is the most appropriate.
 - c. Children living within two miles of the school according to the distance between the family's normal home address and the school's nearest entrance gate.
 - d. Any remaining places will be allocated on the basis of the child's date of birth, oldest first. If there is only one place left, and there is more than one child with the same birthday, the place will be allocated to the child living nearest to the school according to the distance between the family's normal home address and the school's nearest entrance gate.

Pre- Rising 5 admissions to schools

6. Schools which take the younger 4-year olds into reception at the beginning of the academic year, admit in line with the school's admission rules.

Co-ordinated Admission Scheme from 2008

- 7. Parents must apply for places in the main school under the coordinated arrangements. Therefore, until the allocation is public (after 19 February 2008) parents could not be assured of a place at the school. Schools may then determine at what point they will formally admit individual children. Schools will generally admit at 1, 2 or 3 entry points and some children will be admitted pre-rising 5 if that is the school policy but there could be no formal entry to the main school before the Buckinghamshire offer date under the coordinated admissions scheme.
- 8. Once parents are offered a place under the co-ordinated scheme they have the right to defer entry for their child. This deferment can be up to the point at which the child becomes a statutory 5 year old (i.e. the start of the term after the child's fifth birthday) and cannot be beyond the end of the normal academic year of entry for the child.
