INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

- 1. The name of the school is St. Mary's Farnham Royal Church of England Primary School
- **2.** The school is a voluntary aided school.
- 3. The name of the governing body is "The governing body of St. Mary's Farnham Royal Church of England Primary School".
- **4.** The governing body shall consist of:
 - (a) 2 parent governors
 - (b) 1 LEA governor
 - (c) 3 staff governors
 - (d) 8 foundation governors, of whom at least 3 shall, at the time of their appointment, be eligible for election or appointment as parent governors.
- 5. The total number of governors shall be 14, except that, at any time when the head teacher has given written notice to the clerk to the governors that he/she chooses not to be a governor, the total shall be 13.
- **6.** The Oxford Diocesan Board of Education shall appoint 7 foundation governors.
- **7.** (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex officio: Priest in Charge of Farnham Royal.
 - (b) The Archdeacon of Buckingham shall appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex-officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that ex officio foundation governor is unable to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from the office under regulation 23 (2) of the Regulations, or where there is a vacancy in the office named in (a) above.
 - (c) The Archdeacon of Buckingham shall be entitled to request the removal of the ex officio foundation governor named at (a) above and to appoint a substitute foundation governor.
- 8. The original school buildings and land is held in trust,:"Farnham Royal Church of England Controlled Combined School Trust". The school has a trust deed dated 11th March 1875. In 1821 the first pupils were enrolled at the school.
- **9.** Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan levels. The school

aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

- **10.** This instrument of government comes into effect on 1st September 2007.

- 5) Total number of governors **20** except at any time when the head teacher has given notice under Regulation 5 of the Constitution Regulations that he chooses not to be a governor, when the total number of governors will be **19**
- 8) This instrument of government comes into effect on 1 September 2007
