Summary

Lower Shelspit Farm has been declared surplus and this report seeks consent for the disposal of the property.

Recommendation

To agree:

- (i) To the disposal of Lower Shelspit Farm, Thornborough, as set out in the recommendation in the Confidential Appendix to this report.
- (ii) In the event that Lower Shelspit Farm is not sold to the preferred bidder that authority is delegated to the Head of Property Services to offer the farm to another party, selected parties or to remarket the farm, and to approve the disposal price and other terms in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Resources.

A. Narrative setting out the reasons for the decision

1. Approval to the disposal is sought as Lower Shelspit Farm has been declared surplus and to raise a capital receipt to help fund the capital programme.

Description

- 2. Lower Shelspit Farm consists of a 3 bedroom detached farmhouse which requires full refurbishment and improvement. A small range of traditional farm buildings. In addition there are two pasture fields amounting to about 12.80 hectares (31.63 acres) which had previously been let separately from the farmhouse and buildings. The total area of the farm is about 13.29 hectares (32.84 acres).
- 3. It is situated just to the east of Thornborough off the Nash Road.

Planning

4. The farm has agricultural status and is considered to have no development potential.

Instructions and Marketing

- 5. Faulkners of Kings Langley were instructed to advise on the disposal of the farm.
- 6. They recommended disposal of the farm by private treaty with advertising in the local and farming press.
- 7. Following their marketing Faulkners' have reported the offers received and have made recommendations which are set out in the CONFIDENTIAL APPENDIX.
- 8. As with all disposals there is a risk the disposal to the preferred purchaser may not proceed. Should this happen authority is sought to delegate to the Head of Property Services:

authority to offer the farm to another party, selected parties or to remarket the farm, and authority to approve the disposal price and other terms in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Resources.

B. Other options available, and their pros and cons

- 9. Not to dispose of the farm although this is not recommended as it has been declared surplus and the capital receipt will help contribute to the future capital programme.
- 10. Not to accept the offer from the preferred bidder but this is not recommended by Faulkners.

C. Resource implications

11. There will be a capital receipt to help fund the capital programme.
