Summary

The Governing Body of Aylesbury Grammar School have decided to a change of category from voluntary controlled to foundation status with effect from January 2008. According to the School Organisation (Prescribed Alterations to Maintained Schools) (England) Regulations 2007 (Schedule 3 Part 3 para.45), there is a requirement that the Council secure that the new Instrument of Government is made for the school by the implementation date of January 2008.

Recommendation

That the Cabinet Member formally confirms the following recommendation:

To approve the new Instrument of Government for Aylesbury Grammar School so that this is in place by January 2008.

A. Narrative setting out the reasons for the decision

As stated above in the summary, Aylesbury Grammar School is changing category from voluntary controlled to foundation status with an implementation date of January 2008. The Governing Body's new Instrument of Government needs to be in place for the implementation date, but the next Governance Panel meeting is not until Tuesday 12 February 2008.

The Cabinet Member is, therefore, asked to approve the new Instrument under the General Exceptions' Rule to meet the implementation date of early January 2008.
