
A skilled and trusted workforce

Crime Levels for Violence Against the Person and Burglary Dwelling in comparison to All Other Offences


Aylesbury Vale From 1 November 2013 to 31 October 2016





Crime Levels for Violence Against the Person and Burglary Dwelling in comparison to All Other Offences


Chiltern & South Buckinghamshire From 1 November 2013 to 31 October 2016

- Reduce repeat demand


