The number of incidents of Domestic Violence reported to Thames Valley Police in 2010/11 was **6,044**.

The estimated number of women affected by Domestic Violence in Buckinghamshire, according to the Home Office ready reckoner tool, is **16,504**. This tool is based on the female population aged 16-59, so a figure for the total number of people affected in the county (including older women and men) would be higher.

Domestic Violence can affect anyone, male or female, from any background. It can include physical violence and also psychological, sexual, financial and emotional abuse.
