<p><b>1 Helping people to speak up and to be active citizens</b></p>	<p>That statutory organisations and 3<sup>rd</sup> sector organisations are effectively assisting disabled people to make their views known effectively within engagement forums in Bucks</p> <p>That statutory organisations are fulfilling their Equality Duty requirements and are taking active action to address discrimination and inequality against disabled people</p> <p>That the priorities for disabled people are being addressed within the development and implementation of the Prevention Matters – building community capacity development programme,</p>
<p><b>2 Supporting Carers</b></p>	<p>That the joint carers commissioning strategy have a focus on carers of disabled</p>

	<p>people and disabled carers, including the identification of such carers and the accessibility of information for such carers</p> <p>That the priorities for carers are being addressed within the development of integrated health and social care teams, including joint services for carers</p>
<p><b>3 Day and employment opportunities</b></p>	<p>That the priorities for disabled people and where 3<sup>rd</sup> sector organisations have a role are addressed within the implementation of the modernisation of day services programme</p> <p>That initiatives are undertaken to ensure disabled people are actively being assisted in work preparation and accessing employment</p>
<p><b>4 Housing and support</b></p>	<p>That there is a range of housing and supported living options available, including the offer of assistive technology, to meet the requirements of disabled people in the county</p> <p>That nursing and residential care homes address fully the needs of disabled people through the provision of training and developing good practice around</p>

	end of life care, palliative care & support for long term neurological conditions
<b>5 Improving Health &amp; Well-being</b>	<p>That the priorities for disabled people are addressed within the future commissioning of neurology and neuro-rehab services, including the development of long term stroke support services in the community</p> <p>That the priorities for disabled people are addressed within the development of a single point of access to an integrated discharge process and the development of integrated re-enablement services to support discharge from hospital.</p> <p>To advise and engage on the development of personal health budgets following the DH pilots ending in 2012</p> <p>That disabled people are given priority within the ‘Five Ways to Well-Being’ county-wide campaign</p>
<b>6 Personalisation</b>	<p>That initiatives on promoting and protecting safeguarding, including Dignity in Care, has a focus on achieving outcomes for disabled people</p>

Outcome	Priorities
	<p data-bbox="757 199 2049 304">That disabled people have access to effective brokerage services and a social care market to buy services from using direct payments or individual budgets</p> <p data-bbox="757 395 2087 501">That statutory organisations have a strategy in place to support disabled people who may be disadvantaged by the impact of the planned welfare benefit reforms.</p>
