6 REVIEW INTO THE MANAGEMENT OF EATING DISORDERS FOR 11-16 YEAR OLD CHILDREN IN BUCKINGHAMSHIRE

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In February 2007 a Task Group from the Public Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee published a review into the management of Eating Disorders for 11 to 16 year old children. The County Council Cabinet, the Children and Young Peoples Partnership Board, the Mental Health Trust and Primary Care Trust accepted all of the recommendations from the report. A Partnership Working Group was established to drive forward the key recommendations and this Group will report back to Committee on the progress achieved to date.

Partnership Working Group Update

Background

Following the review into the management of Care for 11-16 year olds with eating disorders in Buckinghamshire, the Mental Health and Well being Strategy Group agreed to take the recommendations forward. The group is a multi agency group, comprised of commissioners and senior managers who provide tier 1-3, mental health and well being services. The group welcomed the report and found that scrutiny into this specific diagnosis group has been useful to examine both prevention support and patient care pathways. Whilst those identified with the illness in Buckinghamshire is small the illness can be seriously and potentially life threatening, and have a large impact on families.

The group developed an action plan and agreed to report on it's progress to the committee in September 2007. The action plan and actions completed to date are included in Appendix One, they include:-

Eating Disorders Workshop

An initial workshop was held in May with over 70, multi agency and multi disciplinary representatives of professionals working with young people with eating disorders, parents, carers, young people, and representatives of the private and third sector. It was a very informative day where eating disorders were explored from both a national and local perspective. There were also presentations from a consultant psychiatrist, a psychologist, a family therapist and a dietician.

The workshops explored pathways of care, support for professionals and young people, early identification, and treatment approaches.

The actions developed at the workshop were integrated into the strategy group action planning.

Education / General Practitioner Awareness Pack

A pack has been developed in partnership with Oxfordshire to provide schools with a comprehensive package of prevention and awareness raising, to enhance early

identification. The pack will be lunched with Oxfordshire in November 2007. A further pack will be developed using this for General Practitioners.

Providing information about National services

The Young Bucks website has been informed of the contact details of the BEAT (beating eating disorders-formally The Eating Disorder Association) national helpline for parents, young people and friends, and their website. This information will also be placed on the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Mental Health Trust and Buckinghamshire PCT websites as an access portal.

Current service Review

A current service review of eating disorder services has been undertaken in the Aylesbury and Wycombe clinic. The services were also audited against the 2004 Nice guidelines for this service. The Aylesbury audit indicated that 32 clients were referred with an eating disorder between 1st April 2004 and 31st March 2006. The High Wycombe audit indicated that Wycombe CAMHS received 20 referrals for eating disorders between April 2005 and March 2006.

An action plan has been developed by OBMHT, which will be overseen by the Strategy Group.

The CASS service has also been audited.

Work yet to be completed

- 1. A further workshop to be held to develop the care pathways across all partner agencies, to ensure early identification.
- 2. Mapping to be completed of all support for young people with eating disorders across all agencies, including the private and third sectors.
- 3. Guidelines to be developed for General Practitioners, based on the Education/schools pack.

In conclusion there has been a tremendous amount of input into the action plans; the group recognises that completion of some actions is required. The group is willing to report further progress in six moths to the overview and scrutiny committee for public health services.
