Better Care Fund Metrics

The Better Care Fund templates finalised in November 2014, set trajectories for a range of nationally set metrics:

- Rate of emergency admissions
- Permanent admissions to care homes
- Reablement (proportion still at home after 91 days)
- Delayed transfers of care
- Emergency readmissions after 28 days
- Patient Experience

The system was also required to agree some local metrics. Buckinghamshire added:

- Patients >65yrs old discharged to the same address from which they were admitted
- Occupied bed days

The key messages from the attached data (for quarter one) are:

- 1. Emergency admissions across all providers are up against plan
- 2. Admissions to care homes are very low
- 3. Reablement is improving

HOWEVER, other key pieces of information are necessary to provide further context:

- Emergency admissions are also, more significantly, up in terms of cost actual expenditure is £1.7m over plan in Q1
- Whilst admissions to care homes are low, the cost of care home placements is rising and the volume and cost of packages of care at home are also rising significantly

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TECHNICAL NOTES

Emergency Admissions: actual numbers of emergency admissions for all providers paid for by Buckinghamshire CCGs. The targets are derived from activity the same quarter the previous year, + growth, - the 1.6% target reduction.

Care Home Admissions: the number of clients aged over 65, permanently admitted to a residential or nursing care home funded by the local authority per 100,000 population.

Reablement: the proportion of people aged over 65, who are still at home 91 days after discharge from hospital to reablement services. It is measured as a snapshot in Q4 each year.

Delayed Transfers of Care: number of delayed transfers of care (NHS/Social care/Joint) as reported on UNIFY. All the days are added and then divided by the population to produce a rate per 100,000 population.

Patient Experience (health): the Friends and Family Test. The figure given is for Buckinghamshire Healthcare NHS Trust Inpatient Services and it is the 'recommended' percentage. The response rate remains low.

Patient Experience (social care): the monthly measurement of overall satisfaction of clients with their social services provision.

Patients Discharged to Same Address: local metric used to measure the impact of efforts to minimise the number of people being discharged to some kind of care facility straight from hospital without their needs being assessed in their home environment. It covers all providers for the 2 CCGs and is derived from SUS data. This information has only recently been looked at so further refinement may be necessary.

Occupied Bed Days: at present this metric has not been fully developed but discussions to confirm how it will be measured and with what target continues.
