Decision

That the Head of Highways: -

Approves the advertising of the permanent traffic regulation order.

Reasons for the decision

- The scheme aims to prevent obstructive parking, improve traffic flow and road safety and to improve the environment for local residents and others.
- Buckinghamshire County Council propose to implement:
 - Introduce, No waiting at any time,
 - Convert the No waiting Mon-Fri 10am-11am to Pay and Display Mon-Sat 8am-6pm 1 hour No return 2 hours,
 - Convert the Limited waiting Mon-Sat 8am-6pm 1 hour No return 1 hour to Pay and Display Mon-Sat 8am-6pm 1 hour No return 2 hours.
