Other implications / issues

- 2 The Pension Fund's Unaudited Statement of Accounts were presented to the Pension Fund Committee at its meeting on 30 May 2019 and the Regulatory and Audit Committee, as part of the Council's overall unaudited Statement of Accounts, on 21 May 2019. At that stage, the audit of the accounts had not commenced.
- 3 Subject to the satisfactory resolution of the normal audit processes, we anticipate that Grant Thornton will provide **an unqualified opinion** on the Pension Fund's financial statements. The Accounts are attached as Appendix 1, the changes since the draft document was presented to this Committee are highlighted in the



document. Representatives from Grant Thornton will provide an update on their findings at the meeting as detailed in the draft Audit Findings Report, see Appendix 2.

4 Note 18 – Actuarial Present Value of Promised Retirement Benefits has been updated to reflect the increased present value of defined benefit obligation and past service costs arising from the revised actuarial estimate to reflect the McCloud judgment. The Court of Appeal has ruled that there was age discrimination in the judges and firefighters pension schemes where transitional protections were given to scheme members. The Government applied to the Supreme Court for back to tribunal for remedy.
