Waste plans slower than other areas.

Poor public satisfaction with bus services in Chiltern and South Bucks

Accessibility in the county by rail and road links between Aylesbury and Wycombe.

People using more energy and also high levels of outcommuting – longer term plans to reduce.

Door step recycling behind other areas.



Delivery against objectives – Safer Communities

Impact of focus on reducing serious acquisitive crime

Resident's perceptions good

Reoffending low with good youth provision.

Road injuries high but decreasing with good focus on groups at risk .

Fire service improvements and home safety checks



Delivery against objectives – Safer Communities

Some mixed results on crime with levels in Wycombe in 08/09 of concern.



Delivery against objectives – Cohesive Communities

High resident satisfaction and generally people in communities get on well together.

Strong and active community spirit.

Narrowing the inequality gaps in some areas eg educational attainment.

Stronger joint working around 'place'

Progress on PREVENT and building capacity



Delivery against objectives – Cohesive Communities

Place survey results in Wycombe show lower scores on getting on well together.

Clear marker – area based plans and actions to reduce interlinked inequalities.

Red tag – prosperity among BME communities.



Delivery against objectives – Health and Well Being

Health significantly better than average

Children's health good

Improving independence for adults with good support

Homelessness falling and fewer empty homes



Delivery against objectives – Health and Well Being

Red tag – length of time some people wait for housing adaptations.

Red tag – delayed discharges of care

Clear marker – small number of people with learning disabilities still to leave NHS campus

Clear marker – delivery on extra care housing

Multi agency partners need to ensure concerns about adult safeguarding are referenced and completed.
