LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISION) ACT 1982 STREET TRADING APPLICATION TO TRADE FROM HIGH STREET, CHESHAM. Contact Officer: Stewart Broome 01494 732063

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

Members are asked to consider the evidence provided by all parties, and determine the application using one of the options contained within section 8 of this report.

#### Background

- 1 On 17<sup>th</sup> June 2011 an application was made to the Licensing Authority for the grant of a street trading consent to sell Asian food from a mobile food van to be located on the High Street in Chesham. The applicant has not indicated a preferred location upon the High Street. The application and a map showing High Street in Chesham is attached at *Appendix 6.1*.
- 2 Following receipt of the application there followed a period of consultation. It is the Licensing Authority's policy to consult Thames Valley Police, Bucks County Council Highways Department, and the local Parish/Town Council on all street trading consent applications, as well as its own Environmental Health.
- 3 During this period of consultation an objection was received from Chesham Town Council (*Appendix 6.2*) and an Officer from Environmental Health has also submitted comments for Members' information, although he has made it clear this is not a formal objection (*Appendix 6.3*).
- 4 Mr Mohammed is a trader with Chesham Market every Wednesday. If he is successful with his application he has indicated that he intends to use the same mobile food van he uses for the Market day.

#### Legal Position.

5 Street trading consents are issued under the provisions of Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. The Act contains adoptive provisions relating to street trading. The provisions

were adopted by this Council in 1984. (Environmental Health Committee decision).

- 6 When objections are received it is necessary to hold a hearing of the full Licensing and Regulation Committee to determine the application.
- 7 The Council may grant consent, with any conditions considered to be reasonably necessary, and in particular include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street or danger to persons using it, and to prevent nuisance or annoyance (whether to persons using the street or otherwise).
- 8 The Council may stipulate the exact location on the consent street that the applicant may trade from, and the times or periods which he may so trade.
- 9 Members may:
  - Grant the consent as applied for,
  - Grant the consent subject to additional conditions and/or restrictions, (see paragraphs 6 and 7 above.
  - Refuse the application.
- 10 The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 does not provide provision to refuse an application due to planning issues. Should planning consent be required this would be a matter for the Planning Authority.
- 11 Members are advised that there is no right of appeal against the refusal to grant a Street Trading Consent. However, as there is no right of appeal the applicant has a right to seek judicial review. As a judicial review is largely about the decision making process, it is essential that the applicant fully understands the reasons for the Members' decision.



#### Application for Street Trading Consent – High Street, Chesham

Thank you for your recent letter in respect of a street trading application for a mobile food stall in Chesham High Street on Monday, Tuesday and Thursdays.

I am assuming that, as Wednesdays and Saturdays are not requested, this mobile franchise is the one that currently sells Indian food on market days already and is suitably licensed to do so. I have liaised with the local ward Member and, while we agree that this franchise can be argued to be an enhancement to the market on Wednesdays and Saturdays, we are not in favour generally of the principle of a mobile catering trader operating up to six days a week. We are very keen to see the High Street shops and retail outlets fully occupied and, bearing in mind the business rates many premises selling refreshments have to pay; this would seem unhealthy and unfair competition that would have a negative effect on town centre sustainability. We also note that the trader's operating address is outside of the town and, indeed, county so there is not even an argument that we would be supporting a local business and local employment. Moreover, by allowing this, we are concerned this would set a precedent to allow a whole range of mobile outlets in the town centre with a similar negative effect on local businesses.

Should the consent be granted, I would point out that one of the businesses selling clothes has vigorously complained that the odours from such mobile franchises have lingered on his stock during summer months, so location ought to be considered and a condition of consent, in light of this.

#### Dear Jackie

I refer to the application (ref. 11/000639/STREET) made by Mr Khushi Mohammed to trade in the High Street, Chesham between the hours of 09.00-17.00 on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. I have no objection to this application in principle, however would like to make the follow comments:

Three complaints of noise have been received concerning noise from market traders between 2006-2008. Therefore I would recommend that the mobile trailer is located at a position in the High Street away from residential properties to reduce the likelihood of noise/odour complaints. I am aware that Mr Mohammed currently trades in the High Street, Chesham and Wednesday's during market day. The current position where he trades has not received complaints from residents or businesses therefore this may be a suitable location for trading on these additional weekdays.
