5 Fees and Charges

(a) DECISION:

The Joint Committee received a report which asked Members to determine the fees and charges to come into effect from 1 April 2019.

RESOLVED:

That the fees and charges as shown in Appendix 1 and in particular the level of the main adult cremation fee of £630 for both crematoria be approved.

(b) REASON FOR DECISION:

The Joint Committee were mindful of the longer term funding requirements of the Capital Programme and future strategic developments when agreeing the fee level. Taking both these factors into account and the fact that Chilterns Crematorium basic fee was lower than most of the surrounding crematoria, an increase of 5.8% to £630 was therefore the minimum increase recommended.

6 **Crematorium Staffing**

(a) DECISION:

The Committee considered a report which sought approval for an additional full time clerical assistant.

The office is the most sensitive part of the business in terms of the direct impact of increases in workload and staffing levels have not changed for over a decade. It would be an advantage to the overall running of the business to appoint an additional full time clerical assistant as the office has been working near to capacity for some time for two reasons; the additional workload from the new crematorium and the new death certification system being delayed which would have resulted in the number of documents having to be processed in the office being reduced.

To not appoint additional staff.
