- 3. authority be delegated to the Head of Environment to progress the decision of the Acting Chief Executive and Director of Services, including negotiating and concluding the final terms of any necessary documentation.

**Reasons for Urgency:** Under Rule 12.2 of the Council's Overview and Scrutiny Procedure Rules the Chairman of Services Overview Committee agreed to urgent implementation of the Cabinet's decision without the call-in procedure applying because implementation was required as a matter of urgency in order to comply with procurement timescales. A delay in implementation would prejudice the Council's interests.
