## CHILTERN & SOUTH BUCKS JOINT COMMITTEE (JC)

A Key Decision is defined as:

- Decisions likely to result in the Council incurring expenditure which is, or the making of savings which are, significant having regard to the Council's budget for the service or function to which the Decision relates; or
- To be significant in terms of its effects on communities living or working in an area comprising two or more wards or electoral divisions in the area of the Council

Each of the constituent local authorities provides the following definition of a Key Decision, as detailed in the Constitution.

### **Chiltern District Council**

A 'Key' Decision is any decision taken in relation to a function that is the responsibility of the Cabinet and which is likely to:

- result in expenditure (or the making of savings) over £30,000 and / or
- have a significant impact on the community in two (or more) district wards. and
- relates to the development and approval of the Budget; or
- relates to the development, approval and review of the Policy Framework, or
- is otherwise outside the Budget and Policy Framework.

### South Bucks District Council

A Key Decision being defined as a decision which has income or expenditure effect of £5,000 or more where the sum has not already been budgeted.

- Each item considered will have a report; appendices will be included (as appropriate). Regulation 9(1g) allows that other documents relevant to the item may be submitted to the decision-maker. Subject to prohibition or restriction on their disclosure, this information will be published on the Council website <u>Chiltern District Council & South Bucks District Council</u> usually 5 working-days before the date of the meeting. Paper copies may be requested (charges will apply) using the contact details below.

- 4 The public can be excluded for an item of business on the grounds that it involves the likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in Part I of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972. The relevant paragraph numbers and descriptions are as follows:

Paragraph 2	Information which is likely to reveal the identity of an individual		
Paragraph 3	Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information)		
Paragraph 4	Information relating to any consultations or negotiations, or contemplated consultations or negotiations, in connection with any labour relations matter arising between the authority or a Minister of the Crown and employees of, or office holders under, the authority		
Paragraph 5	Information in respect of which a claim to legal professional privilege could be maintained in legal proceedings		
Paragraph 6	<ul> <li>Information which reveals that the authority proposes:</li> <li>(a) to give under any enactment a notice under or by virtue of which requirements are imposed on a person; or</li> <li>(b) to make an order or direction under any enactment</li> </ul>		
Paragraph 7	Information relating to any action taken or to be taken in connection with the prevention, investigation or prosecution of crime		

Part II of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972 requires that information falling into paragraphs 1-7 above is exempt information if and so long, as in all the circumstances of the case, the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information. Nothing in the Regulations authorises or requires a local authority to disclose to the public or make available for public inspection any document or part of a document if, in the opinion of the proper officer, that document or part of a document information.
