1. Purpose of Report

To advise Members considering an Application submitted to the Council by Stoke Park Club Limited ("The Applicant") in respect of Stoke Park Club, Stoke Poges Golf Club, Park Road, Stoke Poges, Buckinghamshire SL2 4PG ("the Premises") in relation to which Relevant Representations have been received.

2. Links to Council Policy Objectives

- 2.1 Licensing contributes to the Council's aims of planning for a thriving and sustainable South Bucks and helping to provide a clean and decent district where there is pride in and ownership of our surroundings and public space. Efficient and effective licensing arrangements link to the Councils main aim to create safer and stronger communities.
- 2.2 The Council's Licensing Policy helps achieve the Community Plan objectives of reducing crime and fear of crime, a prosperous place to live and work and a pleasant and healthy environment.

3. Background

- 3.1 The Premises consists of a purpose built large Country Club and Mansion House offering 5 star accommodation. The Premises includes a Championship Golf Course, Championship Tennis Courts, Conference Facilities, Spa and fitness facilities, Restaurants and Wedding Receptions. The Premises is situated within 350 acres of parkland and garden. A location plan is attached to this report marked "Appendix 1".
- 3.2 The Premises currently has the benefit of a Premises Licence numbered 05/00398/LAPRE which was granted on 24th November 2005 pursuant to Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 there being no objections received under delegated authority A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached marked "Appendix 2".

4. The Application

4.1. This application is for a variation to the existing Premises Licence following alterations to the Ground Floor of the Licensed Premises and also to request additional licensable activities/permissions. (A copy of the Application is attached to this Report marked "Appendix 3").

7. Licensing Officer's Observations

- 7.1 The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives having regard to the Council's adopted Licensing Policy, National Guidance <u>and</u> all of the Relevant Representations received and the evidence it will hear at the Hearing.
- 7.2 The Relevant Representations raise the follows issues:

7.2.1 Noise:

Concerns have been raised in relation to the variation submitted for Live Music and Recorded Music. In particular the concerns relate to the 6 special event days, application for music until 4.00am, the Christmas Eve and New Years Eve extension application for music until 4.00am and the application to increase the standard hours for the premises until 2.00am. There are concerns that the music from these events will carry across the grounds from the clubhouse of the premises and cause a disturbance to local residents in their properties.

One objector informs us of an incident in the past whereby they were disturbed and when trying to contact the premises were told a manager was unavailable. Concerns have also been raised in relation to external events held at the premises such as events held in marquees and temporary bars located within the golf course. Again it is believed any music held outdoors within the grounds of the premises will cause unacceptable nuisance to neighbouring residents.

A further objection letter details problems that have been experienced in the past with the premises over a period of 12 years. The objector details the worst period being approximately 5 years ago when being regularly kept awake in the summer months by music. We are informed that over the last three years the problem has seemed to have disappeared however it is believed this is because the current licence works well.

Concerns have been raised in relation to local resident's sleep being disturbed as and when people leave the premises after functions some of which will finish at 2.00am, some at 4.00am.

A question has been raised by one objector as to why adult people cannot go round a golf course without alcoholic refreshment and has raised concerns with any temporary bars being located near the 10th, 11th, 19th greens and the 11th, 14th and 20th tees, which are adjacent to their residential property. A further objector raises questions in relation to supervision of the temporary bars within the grounds and minors obtaining alcohol.

Comment:

Whilst a number of concerns have been raised by residents in relation to the application for extended hours inside the premises and for music to be permitted in the grounds of the premises I can confirm that since the Licence has been in place in 2005 we have received no complaints into the Licensing Department relating to disturbances and potential breaches of Licence restrictions or management problems at the premises. I note from the Environmental Health Officers report that initially concerns were raised however the Officer now feels that the agreed amended conditions to be imposed on the Licence should adequately address any problems that may arise. Should Members be minded to grant the application and complaints are then received into the Licensing Department of noise disturbances I can confirm Officers will undertake evening visits to the premises and ensure the Licence conditions are being complied with. Conditions contained within the schedule of this report should address the concerns raised by local residents.

7.2.2 Traffic

Concerns have been outlined in relation to an increase in traffic in particular along North Drive between the hours of midnight and 5.00am when residents are attempting to sleep.

Comment:

Whilst a number of the objection letters that we have received make reference to an increase in traffic unfortunately this is a matter which will be dealt with under separate legislation by the Highways Department and by the Planning Team. I can confirm that when the premises were originally assessed as to its suitability for use as a commercial premises, consultation would have been undertaken by the planning department. As we can see from the consultation that has taken place with the planning authority No objection to the application has been received however the planning authority have requested an informative to be placed upon the licence in relation to ensuring the necessary planning applications/permissions are in place. Please see a copy of the correspondence received attached to this report marked "Appendix 7". Section 13.64 - 13.68 of the DCMS guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 seeks to set out clearly the approach that should be taken in relation to applications that are received before the relevant planning permissions have been sought or granted.

7.2.3 Fireworks

Concerns have been raised by one objector in particular in relation to fireworks held within the premises. We are informed that they are held very late at night and early morning during week and weekend periods. We are informed that this has been a cause of complaint to Stoke Park Club by residents in the past.

Comment:

Unfortunately Firework displays are not regulated by the Licensing Act 2003 therefore this is not a matter in which the Licensing Team or the Licensing Sub - Committee can consider or assist upon. The Fireworks Regulations 2004 prohibit the use of fireworks at night between the hours of 11pm and 7am however there are certain exemptions for festivals such as New Years Eve, Bonfire Night, Chinese New Year and Diwali. These regulations are enforced by the Police and there is a penalty of up to £5,000 or 6 months in prison for breach of curfew. The noise from fireworks can also be deemed a statutory nuisance under Part III of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 therefore should residents have concerns relating to noise disturbance from Firework Displays or any Health and Safety issues arising from these displays I would strongly advise that contact is made with the Environmental Health Team at the Council Offices who may be able to assist under separate legislative powers.

7.2.8 Consultation of application

Concerns have been raised as to why the notification of this application was not sent to all properties in the SL2 4PG postcode. It is felt that it is unacceptable for properties to be excluded from the notification process.

Comment:

I can confirm that the Licensing Act 2003 sets out the formal procedure for Local Authorities when receiving licensing applications. Unfortunately within the Act there is no requirement

for Local Authorities to notify local residents of Licensing applications however there is a statutory requirement for a Public notice to be displayed at the entrance to the premises and a Public Notice to also be displayed in a local newspaper that circulates the vicinity of the premises. The application must also be displayed on the Council's website for public viewing. The Licensing Sub -Committee in 2007 when reviewing their Licensing Policy decided that to ensure local residents were kept informed of licensing applications that arose in their areas the Licensing Team would go above and beyond the requirement of the Act and notify local Parish Councils so that the application may be discussed at parish meetings and to also send a brief written letter to nearby neighbouring residential properties informing them that there is an application available for viewing at the Council Offices. In relation to this application I can confirm that I have posted 111 letters to local residents, all properties of which we considered immediately surrounded the premises.

7.3 Details of the variations to the Premises Licence sought under this application:

Comment:

7.3.1 Provision of regulated entertainment:

Live music: The Applicant is applying to vary the current permissions contained within the Premises Licence. The Applicant has stated in the application form that it will consist of live music such as an individual playing an instrument to diners a piano/singer or will consist of instruments played at a wedding reception. The premises is currently permitted to hold Live Music within certain areas of the Licensed premises and also outside on The Terrace and on The Lawn Adjacent to the Club House. Due to the alterations that have taken place at the premises the applicants are now seeking to licence the whole ground floor of the premises for this activity and the grounds of the premises. The applicants are also seeking to extend the hours currently permitted for this activity therefore the application will constitute an increase by 2 hours at the end of the licensed session on Saturday evenings and Sunday evenings. And an increase by 1 hour at the start of the licensed session on a Sunday for Standard Days and Timings. For special event days an additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Monday - Friday. An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Saturday or Sunday. An additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session New Years Eve and Christmas Eve if falls on a Monday - Friday. An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

- Recorded music: The Applicant is applying to vary the current permissions contained within the Premises Licence. The Applicant has stated in the application form that it will consist of Recorded music such as the playing of CD's during diners or within the lounge bar or any music played at wedding functions/parties. The premises is currently permitted to hold Recorded Music within certain areas of the Licensed premises however due to the alterations that have taken place at the premises the applicants are now seeking to licence the whole ground floor of the premises for this activity and the external grounds of the premises. The applicants are also seeking to extend the hours currently permitted for this activity therefore the application will constitute an increase by an Additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session on Sunday evenings. An additional 1 hour at the start of the licensed session on a Sunday for Standard Days and Timings. For special event days an additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Monday -Saturday. An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Sunday. An additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session New Years Eve and Christmas Eve if falls on a Monday - Saturday An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if falls on a Sunday.
- **Performances of dance:** This is a <u>new</u> licensable activity. The Applicant has stated in the application form that it will consist of an individual singing and performing with a piano during diners at a sit down meal or dancers at a party. I can confirm any Live performance of dance to an audience is licensable under the Licensing Act 2003.

7.3.2 Provision of entertainment facilities:

making music: The Applicant is applying to vary the current permissions contained within the Premises Licence. The Applicant has stated in the application form that it will consist of occasions whereby the premises may provide or arrange for the hire of a DJ or entertainment on behalf of hirers i.e. at a wedding reception held in a function room. The premises is currently licensed for this activity within certain areas of the Licensed premises however due to the alterations that have taken place at the premises the applicants are now seeking to licence the whole ground floor of the premises for this activity and the external grounds of the premises. The applicants are also seeking to extend the hours currently permitted for this activity therefore the application will constitute an increase by an additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session on Sunday evenings. An additional 1 hour at the start of the licensed session on a Sunday for Standard Days and Timings. For special event days an additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Monday - Saturday. An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Sunday. An additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session New Years Eve and Christmas Eve if falls on a Monday - Saturday An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if falls on a Sunday.

dancing: The Applicant is applying to vary the current permissions contained within the Premises Licence. The Applicant has stated in the application form that the premises has a number of function rooms available for hire for parties and wedding receptions. The premises also is able to provide marquees in the grounds / lawn areas. The premises is currently licensed for this activity within certain areas of the Licensed premises however due to the alterations that have taken place at the premises the applicants are now seeking to licence the whole ground floor of the premises for this activity and the external grounds of the premises. The applicants are also seeking to extend the hours currently permitted for this activity therefore the application will constitute an increase by an additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session on Sunday evenings. An additional 1 hour at the start of the licensed session on a Sunday for Standard Days and Timings. For special event days an additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Monday - Saturday. An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Sunday. An additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session New Years Eve and Christmas Eve if falls on a Monday - Saturday An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if falls on a Sunday.

7.3.3 Provision of Late Night Refreshment: The Applicant is applying to vary the current permissions contained within the Premises Licence. The Applicant has stated in the application form that the premises may serve hot drinks and refreshments after 11.00pm or hot drinks/snacks from the bar areas. Hot refreshments are also to be served by way of room service. The premises is currently licensed for this activity within certain areas of the Licensed premises however due to the alterations that have taken place at the premises the applicants are now seeking to licence the whole ground floor of the premises for this activity and the external grounds of the premises. The applicants are also seeking to extend the hours currently permitted for this activity therefore the application will constitute an increase by an additional 3 hours at the end of the licensed session on Monday - Saturday evenings, an additional 5 hours at the end of the licensed session on Sunday evenings.

7.3.4 Supply of alcohol: The Applicant is applying to vary the current permissions contained within the Premises Licence. The premises is currently licensed for this activity within certain areas of the Licensed premises however due to the alterations that have taken place at the premises the applicants are now seeking to

licence the whole ground floor of the premises for this activity with the exception of the Chapel. The applicants are also seeking permission to set up temporary bars as and when required for special functions within the grounds of the licensed premises and permission to set up temporary bars within the Golf Course 1st hole, 14^{TH} Hole, 10^{TH} Hole, 16^{TH} Hole and putting green when required for special functions. The application as submitted will constitute an increase by an Additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session on Sunday evenings for Standard Timings. For special event days an additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Monday - Saturday. An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if held on a Sunday. An additional 2 hours at the end of the licensed session if falls on a Monday - Saturday An additional 4 hours at the end of the licensed session if falls on a Sunday.

7.3.5: Hours premises are open to the public: The Applicant is applying to vary the current permissions for opening hours. The application is seeking to reduce the opening hours of the premises by 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours in the morning Monday - Saturday and reduce by 30 minutes at the end of the day. A further reduction in the opening hours of the premises by 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours in the morning on Sunday but an increase by 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours at the end of the day. For special event days and New Years/Christmas Eve again a reduction in the opening hours of the premises by 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours in the morning, an increase by 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours on a Sunday - Saturday at the end of the day and by 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours on a Sunday. The premises will however remain open 24 hours for residents of the hotel.

8. Resources, Risk and Other Implications

- 8.1 **Resource:** The only resource implications to date have been officer time however if the applicant/a relevant party who has made representations appeals against the decision of the Licensing Sub Committee -this would result in legal fees to defend the appeal and further costs if we should loose the appeal and therefore have to pay the applicant/a relevant party's costs.
- 8.2 Human Rights: The Licensing Sub - Committee's decision regarding this application will have Human Rights implications in respect of both the Applicant and Relevant Representatives including local residents, which also need to be considered equally and fairly so that the decision is proportionate and the right balance is met. The referral of this matter to the Licensing Sub - Committee is laid down in the Licensing Act 2003 and is also in accordance with Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998, the right to a fair hearing, which is an absolute right. The Applicant and the Relevant Representatives have been notified of the Hearing and invited to make representations. A statutory right of appeal to the Magistrates Court and the right (if it arises) to challenge the Sub-Committee's decision by way of Judicial Review to the High Court also ensure a fair hearing to both the Applicant and the Relevant Representatives.

- 8.3 Article 8 and Article 1 of the First Protocol the right to respect for private/family life and peaceful enjoyment of property/possessions (including Licences) also need to be considered. "Interested Parties" including local residents have a right to respect for their private and family life and their home. They are entitled not to be disturbed by unreasonable noise and/or nuisance. However, this is a qualified right and has to be balanced against the rights of others including the rights of businesses in the area to operate.
- 8.4 Article 14 of the Human Rights Act 1998 the right to freedom from discrimination, which is an absolute right also needs to be considered. The human rights provided under the Human Rights Act 1998 must not be subject to discrimination under various headings, including race, national or social origins, association with a national minority group, or other status.
- 8.5 Interference with these rights is acceptable within the terms of the Act if it safeguards the rights of others, is legitimate, proportionate and balanced in that there is a need to find a fair balance between the protection of individual rights and the interests of the community at large other than rights under Article 6 and 14 which are absolute rights and can not be interfered with.
- 8.6 Therefore if Members refuse to grant the application for a variation to the Premises Licence in whole or in part or grant it subject to Conditions this will be a breach of the rights of the Applicant <u>unless</u> such refusal (in full or part) is and/or the conditions imposed are proportionate and can be justified, on balance, by being outweighed by the rights of the community at large to peaceful enjoyment of their property/possessions. Any restriction placed upon the Premises Licence must not go beyond what is strictly necessary to achieve its legitimate purpose in order to mitigate the interference with the community at large's enjoyment of their property/possessions.
- 8.7 By taking into consideration all the material considerations relating to this application and balancing the interests/rights of all parties involved it is considered that the Sub-Committees decision will be both proportionate and justified having had regard to the Human Rights Act 1998.

9. Determination by the Licensing Sub-Committee

- 9.1 This is a matter for the Licensing Sub-Committee to determine in the light of the above and any other material considerations.
- 9.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee having had regard to all of these matters must take one of the following steps, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives:
 - 9.2.1 Grant the application in full or in part subject to any Conditions to be attached to the Premises Licence (which

modify, or add to or vary the Conditions already imposed on it) which are consistent with the Operating Schedule and which are considered necessary and proportionate for the promotion of the four licensing objectives in response to relevant representations received and any relevant Mandatory Conditions. (On a "without prejudice" basis, a draft list of suggested conditions is attached to this Report marked "The Schedule").

9.2.2 Reject the Variation Application.

The Sub-Committee may also vary the Premises Licence subject to different conditions for different parts of the Premises or the different licensable activities if this is considered necessary to promote the four licensing objectives and in response to the representations received.

- 9.3 The Committee is asked to note that:
 - 9.3.1 It may not reject the whole or part of the application or modify or add to or vary the existing conditions merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be **necessary** in order to promote the four licensing objectives and be in response to the representations received and full reasons must be given for the Sub-Committees decision.
 - 9.3.2 any modification or variation to conditions, or any additional conditions to be added to the Premises Licence must be as a result of the <u>effect of the variation</u> if granted on the promotion of the four licensing objectives.

THE SCHEDULE

Existing Mandatory Conditions - to remain on the Premises Licence.

1 Mandatory Condition1

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended .

2 Mandatory Condition 2

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Without prejudice draft list of suggested new Special Conditions and Informatives.

- 1. A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times at the Licensed Premises
- 2. All instances of crime and disorder at the Licensed Premises and also instances of crime and disorder in the vicinity of the Licensed Premises that come to the attention of the Management will be reported to the police and a record of the incident will be kept in an incident logbook. The incident logbook will include dates and times of incidents, the person witnessing the incident, the results and action taken and will be made available for inspection to an authorised officer of South Bucks District Council and/or the Police when requested.
- 3. A CCTV system will be installed, maintained and operated at the Licensed Premises for the duration of all licensable activities. The recordings from the system whether installed in digital or other format will be retained for a period of 28 days and stored during that time in a suitable and secure facility and will be made available to South Bucks District Council and/or the Police when requested. A sign advising patrons that CCTV is in operation will be positioned in a prominent position on the Licensed Premises.
- 4. Adequate lighting including external lighting and external security lighting will be installed and maintained at the Licensed Premises and working during all licensable activities. This lighting will be subject to the prior written approval of the South Bucks District Council's Environmental Health Officers in order to avoid any nuisance to local residents.
- 5. A fully licensed designated taxi company will be used to ensure the safety of staff and customers to and from the Licensed Premises. Customers will be verbally advised of which company to use and reminded by signs erected on the Licensed Premises. A notice will be displayed inside the Licensed Premises requesting staff and patrons to advise drivers not to use their vehicle horns.
- 6. Clear legible notices shall be erected on the Licensed Premises requesting customers, patrons and staff to keep noise to a minimum and respect local residents privacy when entering and leaving the Licensed Premises and to advise customers, patrons and staff to park legally and considerately.
- 7. All reasonable steps will be taken to ensure that people leaving the Licensed Premises do so in an orderly manner and do not in any way cause annoyance to residents and people passing by the Licensed Premises.
- 8. If the Regulated Entertainment includes a Disc Jockey, an announcement will be made at the end of the licensed session requesting patrons/customers to leave the Licensed Premises and the vicinity of the Licensed Premises quietly to keep noise to a minimum and to respect local residents' privacy.

- 9. Any music/Live music/commentary generated during regulated entertainment will not be played at a level where it is audible beyond the perimeter of the Licensed Premises with residential properties.
- 10. Noise monitoring patrols of the Licensed Premises with residential properties will take place at least hourly after 10pm each evening of the noise generated from the Licensed Premises on every occasion when any Regulated Entertainment is being offered at the Licensed Premises. Immediate steps will be taken to reduce the level of noise and make the necessary adjustments to ensure noise is not heard beyond the perimeter of the Licensed Premises.
- 11. A recognised proof of age policy will be enforced at the Licensed Premises at all times by the Management in relation to all potential purchasers who appear to be under the age of 21 years of age and will be in the form of photographic identification and a copy of the Proof of Age policy will be displayed in a prominent position in the Licensed Premises.
- 12. No sales of alcohol will be permitted by persons under the age of 18.





The recordings from the system whether installed in digital or other format will be retained for a period of 28 days and stored during that time in a suitable and secure facility and will be made available to South Bucks District Council and/or the Police when requested. A sign advising patrons that CCTV is in operation will be positioned in a prominent position on the Licensed Premises.

Adequate lighting including external lighting and external security lighting will be installed and maintained at the Licensed Premises and working during all licensable activities. This lighting will be subject to the prior written approval of the South Bucks District Council's Environmental Health Officers in order to avoid any nuisance to local residents.

A fully licensed designated taxi company will be used to ensure the safety of staff and customers to and from the Licensed Premises. Customers will be verbally advised of which company to use and reminded by signs erected on the Licensed Premises. A notice will be displayed inside the Licensed Premises requesting staff and patrons to advise drivers not to use their vehicle horns.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Stoke Park Limited Safeguarding Children Policy February 2009

The welfare of children is paramount and should any Stoke Park staff, parent or visitor have concerns for a child's welfare they should speak to the Duty Manager and follow the reporting procedures in conjunction with the Local Safeguarding Children Board to ensure the children are safeguarded from harm.

An effective child protection policy and procedure is vital, not only for the safety of all the children within the care of Stoke Park staff, but also for the safety and support of all Stoke Park staff. It is therefore essential that all staff familiarise themselves with this policy. We all have a responsibility to make sure that children are within a safe and secure environment.

Stoke Park staff have the responsibility to protect all children whatever their beliefs or abilities. Children have the right to grow up unharmed, to have the opportunity to develop fully and have their basic needs met. They should be respected in body and mind, their wellbeing ensured and their personal dignity guaranteed. It is the duty of all staff to take all the necessary steps to ensure child welfare.

Statutory Agencies (i.e. Education, Health, Social Services, Probation, Police, NSPCC and Housing) work together using Local Safeguarding Children Board Procedures. The Local Safeguarding Children Board has representatives from all the above agencies and promotes and monitors the procedures. Whilst we are not a statutory agency we aim to work in a way, which provides the same level of protection to children in our care.

Stoke Park staff will be trained in issues relating to child protection and should know how to recognise and respond to potential indicators of abuse or neglect. If a child is injured in any way whilst in the care of Stoke Park staff, then we will always report to the parents / guardians or carers on how the incident occurred. If the injury is serious we will notify parents / guardians or carers immediately and get the necessary medical treatment.

Stoke Park staff will be able to respond appropriately to:

- Significant changes in children's behaviour
- Deterioration in their general well-being
- Unexplained bruising, marks or signs of possible abuse
- Neglect
- The comments children make which give cause for concern

If a child arrives in the care of Stoke Park staff with any injury, it is expected that the parents / guardians or carers will tell us about it. Our policy is to ask all parents / guardians or carers in any event and make a note on the existing injuries form as most childhood injuries are a normal part of growing up. It is important that staff and parents / guardians or carers communicate openly about this.

It is possible that Stoke Park staff maybe the first to become aware of signs of physical, emotional or sexual abuse in children. Stoke Park staff should be aware of behavioural and physical indicators that may draw attention to the possibility of abuse.

The Duty Manager is the nominated member of the Stoke Park staff responsible for child protection and welfare issues. It is the duty of all Stoke Park staff to report any suspicions or evidence of abuse to the Duty Manager. The Duty Manager will follow the processes outlined in 'What to do if you are worried a child is being abused' published by the DOH (Safeguarding children).

The Human Resources Department will obtain and regularly update contact details and procedures provided by Local Safeguarding Child Board.

Guidelines on appropriate behaviour.

- Always work in an open environment, avoiding private or unobserved situations. Maintain a safe and appropriate distance when communication with children / young people.
- Ensure that you are polite and courteous at all times and use only appropriate behaviour and language.
- When providing service and assistance to children / young people, only communicate the relevant information within the relevant amount of time
- It is an offence for a member of staff at the premises to allow knowingly a child / young person to purchase or consume alcohol at Stoke Park (licensing Act 2003). It is the responsibility of all Staff to report any such offenses or incidents to their line manager or Duty Manager immediately.
- Treat all children / young people equally, and with respect and dignity. Always put the welfare and safety of each child / young person first.
- Ensure that if any form of manual / physical contact is required, it is provided openly and courteously with agreement and possible assistance from the parent or carer. If in doubt, contact the Duty Manager
- All staff must ensure, where possible, that they are not alone with a child / young person for any length of time. If you find yourself in this position, you must request the assistance of another staff member as soon as practically possible.
- If a child / young person is involved in an accident, follow accident reporting procedures and request the assistance of another member of staff as soon as possible.

Guidelines on appropriate touching.

- Attempt to keep all contact in public preferably in view of another member of staff.
- Touching should be initiated by the child and they have the right to decide how much physical contact they have.
- Where possible, attempt to keep physical contact as side by side.
- Avoid any physical activity/ contact that could be misleading as sexually stimulating to the adult or child.
- Stoke Park staff should feel able to point out to each other anything that may be misunderstood
- Any concerns should be reported to the most senior manager on duty and, or Human Resources Manager

Guidelines on procedures when dealing with Child Abuse

Allegation against a staff member by another staff member, parent, guardian or carer.

- Following an allegation against a staff member the disclosure will be treated in the same way as any other disclosure and according to standard company procedures.
- Duty Manager will be contacted immediately and obtain written statements from the complainant on the same day.

- * The Duty Manager will lialse with the most senior manager on duty and, or Human Resources Manager together deciding the appropriate course of action. The staff member of which the allegation is made against will be suspended, on full pay, during the investigation and standard disciplinary procedures will follow.
- A full report must be submitted by the Duty manager to the Managing Director and Human Resources Department

Allegation from member or guest against another member or guest.

- Immediately inform the Duty manager
- The Manager or Duty Manager will liaise with the most senior manager on duty and, or Human Resources Manager together deciding the appropriate course of action.
- At this point the Police will be called to take over.
- A full report must be submitted by the Duty manager to the Managing Director and Human Resources Department

Observed behaviour or incidents involving a staff member or another adult.

- Behaviour by an adult or staff member may be observed which causes concerns. It is the responsibility and duty of all staff of Stoke Park to bring this to the immediate attention of their Manager or Duty Manager.
- A record sheet will need to be completed by the Manager or Duty Manager
- The Manager or Duty Manager will liaise with the most senior manager on duty and, or Human Resources Manager together deciding the appropriate course of action.

Observed behaviour or incidents involving the setting Manager.

 If any concerns are raised in relation to Child Protection matters and a member of the Management team, report these concerns immediately to the Duty Manager or most senior manager on duty.




- If any staff member sees or has reported to a lost child / young person, report to the Duty Manager immediately.

- It is the responsibility of each staff member where possible to locate parents / quardians or carers.



I am in receipt of your letter of 15 October 2009, and wish to make a formal objection to this application based upon the licensing objective of Prevention of Public Nuisance, in particular, noise pollution.

As you know, Stoke Park Club have applied for an extension to their permitted hours for regulated entertainment until 4am on 6 occasions a year, plus Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, and until 2am on 7 nights of the week. My objection is on the grounds of causing a public nuisance due to noise from live music, recorded music, dancing and loudspeaker systems carrying to my property which is less than 700 metres across the golf course from their clubhouse, as the crow flies. On an occasion when I experienced persistent and excessive noise late at night from one of their events in the past, via a loudspeaker system, I complained to them at the time without success – the duty manager was 'unavailable'. I then complained to the local police who, while sympathetic, advised me to contact the Environmental Health Department at South Bucks District Council, however I received no response to my email. I am concerned that local residents will be expected to tolerate noise throughout the night until 4am in the morning on 8 occasions in the year, and until 2am every single day of the year, at the discretion of the club.

Additionally, my objection on the same grounds of causing a public nuisance of noise extends to their request to hold regulated entertainment (live music, recorded music and dancing) **outdoors**. I consider that the noise level from events held in marquees and at temporary bars on selected areas of the golf course would be sufficiently high to cause an unacceptable public nuisance under any circumstances – there is no physical barrier to the noise carrying across the grass to my property – it will be like having the event at the bottom of my garden! In conjunction with a request to extend licensing until 4am on 8 occasions and 2am on every day of the year, I consider local residents would suffer considerable stress and disturbance which is incompatible with our right to live in quiet enjoyment of a residential area.

I hope my objections will be taken into consideration with regard to this application -I live on a residential development at Park Lawn of approximately 35 dwellings, many occupied by elderly residents who may feel unable to make a formal representation themselves.

I refer to your letter dated 15 October 2009 in respect of the Variation Application which was not sent to me in the first instance but which was passed to me by a neighbour.

STOKE PARK CLUB, PARK ROAD, STOKE POGES, SL2 4PG

In particular I wish to object to the Non-standard timing extensions for Regulated Entertainment to 2am and 4am.

A: There is no reason to predict that this application will lead to a reduction in crime and disorder. It is reasonable to predict a contrary tendency and on this I base my first objection.

B: There is no reason to predict that this application will lead to any improvement in the public safety and I therefore submit that this objective is not fulfilled by granting any extension.

C: On the issue of Public Nulsance I submit that this license extension will result in a significant increase in road traffic along North Drive between the hours of midnight and 5am when residents are attempting to sleep. Sadly, while the majority of vehicles that use Stoke Park are opulently silent, there exists a significant minority which is flamboyantly noisy. It only takes one of these to wreck a night's sleep. Similarly there will inevitably, from the indoor AND outdoor nature of this licensing request, be an increase in both light and noise pollution coming directly from the club itself to cause public nuisance throughout the early hours and not just at closing time. Six extensions in a year to 2 am would be barely tolerable. A nightly extension to 2 am PLUS 6 further extensions per annum to 4 am will plainly destroy the peace and quiet of this residential area.

D: There is no reason to predict that this application will lead to any increase in the level of protection of children and I therefore submit that this element of the objectives also lies unfulfilled.

I therefore object to the extension of licensing hours in that they betray every single objective of the licensing laws as established in the Licensing Act of 2003.

I would also request that any licensing or planning requests relating to Post Code SL2 4PG be circulated to ALL addresses sharing this postcode. It is totally unacceptable that we should be excluded from the notifiable addresses particularly as we are the ONLY property in the postcode with direct line of sight from our windows to Stoke Park Club! I attach an explanatory map.

Dear Sir,

I have received a letter from South Bucks Council concerning an application to vary the premises license of Stoke Park Club.

I have lived at Park Lawn, which borders Stoke Park Club, for 12 years and we have had varying problems with noise from the Club over that time. The noise from the Club was at it's worst about 5 years ago when we were regularly kept awake at night during the summer months by extremely loud music from the club. My flat is about 200- 300 yds from the clubhouse itself, and for music to keep me awake after midnight you can only imagine the noise level at the club itself. For the last three years, the noise problem has largely disappeared, I assume due to regulations put in place by the Council. We do hear occasional noise, but this always disappears after midnight. In the past we were subject to sleep destroying noise until 3 or 4 in the morning, mainly at weekends.

I would not wish to spoil the pleasure of others, but I consider it unacceptable that partygoers should be allowed to destroy my sleep.

I consider that the current restrictions are good for the neighbourhood and they should remain in place.

You are no doubt aware that we have a mountain of legislation from Europe which is designed to protect the "Human Rights" of us all. I consider it my human right to a good night's sleep. I would urge you to retain the current noise restrictions for Stoke Park Club.

Perhaps you would suggest to Stoke Park Club that they might like to open a night club on a remote Scottish Island. I'm sure there would be no shortage of people willing to destroy their hearing in an extremely noisy environment such as practised by Stoke Park Club in the past.

As for now, I think the world has changed, and extreme noise generated by clubs like Stoke Park at antisocial hours has become unacceptable.

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

I refer to your letter dated 15 October 2009 and write on behalf of my wife and myself to object formally to three of the variations for which application has been made.

Our property is on the eastern boundary of the golf course and we are particularly affected whenever loud music is played at Stoke Park Club whether it be during the day, as occasionally happens, or late at night - particularly in the summer months - as the prevailing wind largely sends the sound in our direction. Whilst this is accepted at the moment because, when it does occur at night, by and large there is no annoyance or inconvenience caused to us after midnight.

The proposals that music is to be permitted until 2.00am indoors and outdoors and at Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve and on 6 further separate occasions during the year for special events until 4.00am would considerably increase the anti-social inconvenience based on the noise levels we have experienced in the past, particularly if we should happen to have visitors at those times and during the summer months.

I note that it is proposed that noise monitoring patrols will take place from 10.00pm each evening to ensure that noise is not heard beyond the perimeter of the Licensed Premises but it is impossible to see how these can be effective unless all the residents properties bordering the area are physically visited.

I wish to object to the application for the following reasons:

I don't believe it reasonable to be playing music and allowing dancing outdoors until 2am as standard and definitely not until 4am up to 8 times per year. Neither is it safe to have temporary bars dotted around the golf course where they cannot be fully supervised and where minors could obtain alcohol.

Noise levels and light pollution will increase under the plans and longer hours will encourage more drinking and the likelihood of drink driving.

The plans show no consideration for the neighbours either. We currently can hear public announcement systems and music from the club to the level where I can tell the name of the piece of music being played. Once doors are opened and people spill outside, noise levels rise and with the prospect of marquees and music until later into the night on random occasions, I think the committee should consider this generally a nuisance to a quiet village.

I believe that allowing the Club Carte Blanche to pick and choose when they organise these outdoor events also flies in the face of public safety since the police, for example are geared up for events at Christmas and New Year, but these events could be midweek and any time, so who is to say if and when the licensing regulations can be checked.

Stoke Park claim to check the grounds to see whether noise is travelling but if this happens, the noise has never abated before the end of an event, there has always been noise created, particularly at the end of the event as drivers speed away along Park Road.

With regard to the specific issues raised by Stoke Park:

- CCTV cameras cannot be used at the temporary bars dotted near neighbours, so this is a big issue, particularly if it were late at night
- Even if incidents in the vicinity are reported to the police, this creates nuisance for the neighbours and extra work for the police and late night

drinking will inevitably cause this – we do hear drunks shouting or singing as they leave the club now and this can only worsen

- This village chooses not to have street lighting and the Club is going to install more external lighting which will not necessarily aid crime prevention and will disturb neighbours
- Vehicles do use horns late at night, they do rev their engines and drunks sing and shout out of car windows, and no matter what the Club says to visitors, they cannot and do not control this. No staff members come to the exit onto Park Road to discourage this and it is not the responsibility of taxi drivers (if they are used) to try to calm their drunken passengers. I don't consider that the Club does use reasonable measures to calm their guests – we often see our guests out onto the main road
- Stoke Park already breaks the promise they make that "Any music/Live music/commentary generated during regulated entertainment will not be played at a level where it can be heard/it is audible beyond the perimeter of the Licensed Premises" – I can tell you the artist and name of pieces of music they play at times and can clearly hear announcements during the Boodles Tennis tournament
- Stoke Park promises to patrol the premises after 10pm to make sure noise does not travel. If this currently takes place, there is little evidence of it and the alteration to the licence is going to actively encourage outdoor drinking, music and dancing until far later into the night which can only disturb the neighbours for longer than it already does

The request clearly does not consider the nuisance of noise, extra traffic and light disturbance to the neighbouring properties or the fact that in a quiet village more late nights event that could occur on any night of the working week will disturb neighbouring families. Safety factors around underage or excess drinking are not clearly addressed – particularly with regard to outdoor temporary bars since the licensed person cannot possibly oversee so many areas spread across this large property. And no consideration of how noise travels in the quiet of night has been considered – it will be the judgement of a patrol person to decide what is acceptable and that is not fair on the neighbours. There is also only passing comment on the safety of staff or young people who might be dotted around at temporary bars and out of sight of the main building. I also think that Stoke Park should consider having security staff right along to the main road (Park Road) to discourage revving cars, shouting, singing etc. More late night drinking will inevitably cause issues for the local police (another burden for the local tax payer) – and there is no mention of extra security personnel for these events.

I do not believe that an open licence for "up to 6 events" on top of Christmas and New Year events for the late hours requested (up to 4am) and including outdoor music, dancing, drinking etc. is reasonable at these premises.
