1. Purpose of Report

To advise Members considering an Application submitted to the Council by Dair House School Trust Ltd ("The Applicant") in respect of Dair House School at Beaconsfield Road, Farnham Royal, Bucks SL2 3BY("the Premises") in relation to which Relevant Representations have been received.

2. Links to Council Policy Objectives

- 2.1 Licensing contributes to the Council's aims of planning for a thriving and sustainable South Bucks and helping to provide a clean and decent district where there is pride in and ownership of our surroundings and public space. Efficient and effective licensing arrangements link to the Councils main aim to create safer and stronger communities.
- 2.2 The Council's Licensing Policy helps achieve the Community Plan objectives of reducing crime and fear of crime, a prosperous place to live and work and a pleasant and healthy environment.

3. Background

The Premises consists of a school building with 3 floors containing a number of classrooms, a reception area, a nursery, a hall/gymnasium and external playing fields. The Premises is situated in the main residential part of Farnham Royal. A location plan is attached to this report marked "Appendix 1".

4. The Application

- 4.1. This application is for a new Premises Licence (a copy of the Application is attached to this Report marked "Appendix 2").
- 4.2 The Premises is a new premises to be licensed and therefore requires a new Premises Licence.

7. Licensing Officer's Observations

- 7.1 The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives having regard to the Council's adopted Licensing Policy, National Guidance <u>and</u> all of the Relevant Representations received and the evidence it will hear at the Hearing.
- 7.2 The Relevant Representations raise the follows issues:

7.2.1 Noise:

Concerns are raised in relation to the application for outdoor events held at the premises. The objectors feel that the outdoor events are likely to be used mainly in the summer months when resident's doors and windows are open and that loud music and karaoke in marquees outside until midnight will not be acceptable. A number of objectors have requested that the activities applied for be limited to 11.00pm and the application for events outside be reconsidered.

The objectors have indicated that they have experienced excessive noise levels from the premises in the past from events such as disco's and live bands especially in the summer months and believe that the conditions put forward will not prevent noise form the premises. One objector in particular informs us that a formal complaint had to be logged with the Environmental Health Team in relation to an event held at the premises this year and a further

objector informs us due to disturbances has had to write to the headmaster.

Concerns have been raised in relation to noise form people returning to their cars, smoking outside the premises and the increased activities at the premises. Objectors are concerned that should the licence be granted and the premises be permitted to hire out their facilities to anybody, events will be held so frequently that the disturbance to local residents will be unbearable. We are informed this will impact on quality of life for local residents such as disturbances of sleep and enjoyment of properties.

Comment:

Concerns have been raised by residents in relation to this application and I can confirm that the Environmental Health Team have received complaints into their department for investigation in relation to disturbances. I note from the Environmental Health Officers report that initially concerns were raised however the Officer now feels that the agreed amended conditions to be imposed on the Licence should adequately address any problems that may arise. Should Members be minded to grant the application and further complaints are then received into the Licensing Department of noise disturbances I can confirm Officers will undertake daytime and evening visits to the premises to ensure that any Licence conditions are being complied with. Members may also be minded that should a licence be refused the applicants are permitted to apply for temporary licenses (for a maximum of up to 12 per year) to be held either indoor or outdoors at the premises. These temporary licenses are not subject to consultation with the environmental health team or local residents and are granted if the Thames Valley Police do not raise any concerns relating to crime and disorder. Members may also be minded that these temporary licences do not contain any conditions for example noise monitoring conditions or time restrictions. Should Members be minded to grant any permissions for activities at the premises on a full licence then conditions such as noise monitoring patrols or time restrictions must be complied with giving tighter control over the premises. Conditions contained within the schedule of this report should address the concerns raised by local residents. Robust management of the premises along with enforcement by officers of the District Council should address any issues raised.

7.2.2 Increased Crime:

Concerns have been raised by the objectors regarding the application for sale of alcohol and an increase in Drink Driving from the premises. Concerns have also been raised in relation to the potential increase in crime in the vicinity. We are informed that the area already suffers from crime and it is feared the increase in activity in the area will attract further crime.

Comment:

I can confirm that formal consultation has been undertaken with the Thames Valley Police in relation to any concerns this application

would have regarding crime and disorder at or in the vicinity of the premises. I can confirm no objection has been received or information relating to existing crime problems within the area. Suitable conditions suggested within the schedule of this report should seek to address the objectors concerns.

7.2.3 Child protection:

It is felt that the application for supply of alcohol 10.00 - 23.00 Mondays to Sundays is inappropriate at a premises where a high number of children are present. It is felt that the application for sale of alcohol from a school should be rejected or limited to occasional special events. We are informed that the school is for the education of children between 3 and 11 yrs old and an application for alcohol astounds them.

Comment:

I can confirm that should a licence be granted for this premises a nominated individual is named on the licence as a person who is responsible for all sales/supplies of alcohol that take place at the premises. This individual has attended formal training and passed an exam on licensing laws and is vetted by the Licensing team to ensure they are suitable for the role. I also note from the application the school have in place a proof of age policy to ensure no persons under the age of 21 are permitted alcohol without photographic identification. Additional conditions suggested within the schedule of this report should seek to address the objectors concerns along with robust management of any events that take place.

7.2.4 Management of Premises

Concerns have been raised in relation to who will be managing events held at the premises especially during the summer months when the school is closed and who will be responsible for complying with the licence conditions.

Comment:

As best practice the District Council would expect the applicants to work with local residents by keeping them informed of any large events that are due to take place at the premises providing details such as a name and contact number of who will be managing those events should problems arise. Conditions suggested within the schedule of this report should eek to address the objectors concerns.

7.2.5 Fireworks

Concerns have been raised by one objector in relation to fireworks held within the premises.

Comment:

Unfortunately Firework displays are not regulated by the Licensing Act 2003 therefore this is not a matter in which the Licensing Team or the Licensing Sub - Committee can consider or assist upon. The Fireworks Regulations 2004 prohibit the use of fireworks at night between the hours of 11pm and 7am however there are certain exemptions for festivals such as New Years Eve, Bonfire Night, Chinese New Year and Diwali. These regulations are enforced by the

Police and there is a penalty of up to £5,000 or 6 months in prison for breach of curfew. The noise from fireworks can also be deemed a statutory nuisance under Part III of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 therefore should residents have concerns relating to noise disturbance from Firework Displays or any Health and Safety issues arising from these displays I would strongly advise that contact is made with the Environmental Health Team at the Council Offices who may be able to assist under separate legislative powers.

7.2.6 Traffic/Parking

Concerns have been outlined in relation to the proposed activities and the potential for an increase in traffic and parking. We are informed that the premises already has parking problems especially in Fairfield Lane whereby cars are already blocking residents access and parking irresponsibly.

Comment:

Whilst a number of the objection letters that we have received make reference to an increase in traffic and parking unfortunately this is a matter which will be dealt with under separate legislation by the Highways Department and by the Planning Team. I can confirm that when the premises were originally assessed as to its suitability for use, consultation would have been undertaken by the planning department. As we can see from the further consultation that has taken place with the planning authority in relation to this application and the proposed activity No objection has been received. Conditions suggested within the schedule of this report and robust management of the premises should help to reduce the concerns the residents have.

7.3 Details of the Premises Licence sought under this application:

Comment:

7.3.1 Provision of regulated entertainment:

- Plays: The applicants are applying for this licensable activity
 to take place both indoors and outdoors. The Applicants have
 stated in the application form that it will consist of the
 performance of plays at Drama Festivals, School Plays,
 Nativities and open-air theatre which is held in the grounds
 of the school during the summer months. I can confirm under
 the Licensing Act 2003 any performance of a play to an
 audience is classed as a licensable activity.
- Films: The Applicants have applied for this licensable activity to take place indoors only. The Applicants have stated in the application form that it will consist of the showing of DVD's and videos to children, films, the showing of films at race nights or any corporate events held at the premises. I can confirm the showing of films or pre-recorded television is licensable under the Licensing Act 2003. Films for the purposes of information or education however would not be considered a licensable activity.

- Indoor sporting events: The applicants are applying for this licensable activity to take place indoors only. The Applicants have stated in the application form that it will consist of Kickboxing, Gymnastics, Judo and Fencing demonstrations and competitions. I can confirm under the Licensing Act 2003 any indoor sporting events at which there are spectators present this would be considered a licensable activity. I can confirm lessons would not be considered a licensable activity however tournaments and competitions would.
- Live music: The Applicants have applied for this licensable activity to take place both indoors and outdoors. The Applicants have stated in the application form that it will consist of Live Music played at any PTA events that are held at the premises, Live Music played at any birthday and wedding parties held at the premises, Live Music played at end of term performances by the children any orchestra & choir events held at the premises. I can confirm under the Licensing Act 2003 any performance of Live Music held at the premises would be considered a licensable activity and therefore require a licence. The applicants have confirmed in their application that all Live Music to be held outdoors would be restricted to 10 occasions per year.
- Recorded music: The Applicants are applying for this activity to take place both indoors and outdoors. The Applicants have stated in the application form that it will consist of Recorded Music played at any children's parties, wedding parties and any fundraising events held at the premises. I can confirm under the Licensing Act 2003 any recorded music played at events at the premises would be considered a licensable activity and therefore require a licence. The applicants have confirmed in their application that all recorded music to be held outdoors would be restricted to 10 occasions per year.
- Performances of dance: The Applicants have applied for this licensable activity to take place indoors only. The Applicants have stated in the application form that it will consist of events such as Ballet and Ballroom Dancing evenings held at the premises. I can confirm under the Licensing Act 2003 any performance of dance to an audience held at the premises would be considered a licensable activity and therefore require a licence.
- Anything of a similar description to that falling within (e), (f) or (g): The Applicants are applying to cover any additional activity that will take place at the premises that is of a similar description to those listed above. The Applicants have stated in the application form that it could consist of amplified voice at events such as Quiz Nights, Race Nights, Auctions, Barn Dances, Bingo, Sports Days, and Football Tournaments. The applicants have applied for this activity to cover both for indoor events and outdoor events.

7.3.2 Provision of entertainment facilities:

- Making music: The Applicants have applied for this licensable activity to take place both indoors and outdoors. The Applicants have stated in the application form that it will consist of the hire of equipment for functions held at the premises such as microphones, amplifiers, speakers, karaoke Machine, or instruments all provided for use at sports days, football tournaments, quiz nights, bingo nights, race nights. I can confirm under the Licensing Act 2003 any provision of equipment made available for use by hirers at the premises would require a licence.
- Dancing: The Applicants have applied for this licensable activity to take place both indoors and outdoors. The Applicants have stated in the application form that it will consist of the provision of a dance floor area for functions held at the premises. One within the premises within the main hall and one within a marquee in the grounds of the premises for outdoor events. I can confirm under the Licensing Act 2003 any provision of facilities such as a hall/marquee made available for use by hirers at the premises would require a licence. The applicants have confirmed in their application that all events to be held outdoors would be restricted to 10 occasions per year.
- **7.3.3 Supply of alcohol:** The Applicants have applied for the provision of the supply of alcohol at events held at the premises. I can confirm the applicants have not applied for off sales therefore no alcohol would be permitted to be taken away from the premises by people attending functions/events. I can confirm that all sales/supply of alcohol is a licensable activity under the Licensing Act 2003 and would therefore require a licence. I can confirm however alcohol given away free at events/functions is not licensable under the act.
- **7.3.4:** Hours premises are open to the public: The Applicants have applied for permission for the premises to be open to the public attending functions/events from 8.00 01.00 Monday Sunday.

8. Resources, Risk and Other Implications

- 8.1 Resource: The only resource implications to date have been officer time however if the applicant/a relevant party who has made representations appeals against the decision of the Licensing Sub Committee -this would result in legal fees to defend the appeal and further costs if we should loose the appeal and therefore have to pay the applicant/a relevant party's costs.
- 8.2 **Human Rights:** The Licensing Sub Committee's decision regarding this application will have Human Rights implications in respect of both the Applicant and Relevant Representatives including local residents, which also need to be considered equally and fairly so

that the decision is proportionate and the right balance is met. The referral of this matter to the Sub - Committee is laid down in the Licensing Act 2003 and is also in accordance with Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998, the right to a fair hearing, which is an absolute right. The Applicant and the Relevant Representatives have been notified of the Hearing and invited to make representations. A statutory right of appeal to the Magistrates Court and the right (if it arises) to challenge the Sub-Committee's decision by way of Judicial Review to the High Court also ensure a fair hearing to both the Applicant and the Relevant Representatives.

- 8.3 Article 8 and Article 1 of the First Protocol the right to respect for private/family life and peaceful enjoyment of property/possessions (including Licences) also need to be considered. "Interested Parties" including local residents have a right to respect for their private and family life and their home. They are entitled not to be disturbed by unreasonable noise and/or nuisance. However, this is a qualified right and has to be balanced against the rights of others including the rights of businesses in the area to operate.
- 8.4 Article 14 of the Human Rights Act 1998 the right to freedom from discrimination, which is an absolute right also needs to be considered. The human rights provided under the Human Rights Act 1998 must not be subject to discrimination under various headings, including race, national or social origins, association with a national minority group, or other status.
- 8.5 Interference with these rights is acceptable within the terms of the Act if it safeguards the rights of others, is legitimate, proportionate and balanced in that there is a need to find a fair balance between the protection of individual rights and the interests of the community at large other than rights under Article 6 and 14 which are absolute rights and can not be interfered with.
- 8.6 Therefore if Members refuse to grant the application for the Premises Licence in whole or part or grant it subject to Conditions this will be a breach of the rights of the Applicant <u>unless</u> such refusal (in full or part) is and/or the conditions imposed are proportionate and can be justified, on balance, by being outweighed by the rights of the community at large to peaceful enjoyment of their property/possessions. Any restriction placed upon the Premises Licence must not go beyond what is strictly necessary to achieve its legitimate purpose in order to mitigate the interference with the community at large's enjoyment of their property/possessions.
- 8.7 By taking into consideration all the material considerations relating to this application and balancing the interests/rights of all parties involved it is considered that the Licensing Sub-Committees decision will be both proportionate and justified having had regard to the Human Rights Act 1998.

9. Determination by the Licensing Sub-Committee

- 9.1 This is a matter for the Licensing Sub-Committee to determine in the light of the above and any other material considerations.
- 9.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee having had regard to all of these matters must take such of the following steps, as it considers necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives:
 - 9.2.1 Grant the Premises Licence subject to any conditions, which are consistent with the Operating Schedule and which are considered necessary and proportionate for the promotion of the four licensing objectives in response to relevant representations received and any relevant Mandatory Conditions. (On a "without prejudice" basis, a draft list of suggested conditions is attached to this Report marked "The Schedule").
 - 9.2.2 Exclude from the scope of the Premises Licence granted under Para 9.2.1 above any of the licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - 9.2.3 Refuse to specify a person in the Premises Licence granted under Para 9.2.1 as the premises supervisor
 - 9.2.4 Reject the whole of the Application.

The Sub-Committee may also grant the Premises Licence subject to different conditions for different parts of the Premises or the different licensable activities if this is considered necessary to promote the four licensing objectives and in response to the representations received).

9.3 The Committee is asked to note that it may not reject the whole or part of the application or attach conditions (except any Mandatory Conditions) - merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be **necessary** in order to promote the 4 licensing objectives and be in response to the representations received and full reasons must be given for the Sub-Committees decision.

THE SCHEDULE

<u>Mandatory Conditions to be imposed on the Premises Licence if the Application</u> is granted in full/part

1 Mandatory Condition 1

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2 Mandatory Condition 2

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3 Mandatory Condition 3

No films of any description will be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable BBFC/Local Authority Certification.

Without prejudice draft list of suggested conditions and Informatives

- 1. All windows and doors of the Licensed Premises will not be fixed open during all times Regulated Entertainment is taking place and will not be left open at any time thereafter until the end of that licensed session save for access and egress to and from the Licensed Premises.
- 2. Noise monitoring patrols at the external boundaries with neighbouring residential property of the Licensed Premises will take place at least hourly of the noise generated from the Licensed Premises, on every occasion when Regulated Entertainment is being offered at the Licensed Premises. Immediate steps will be taken to make the necessary adjustments to ensure noise is not heard beyond the perimeter of the Licensed Premises.
- 3. A written record will be made of the assessments made in accordance with special condition (2) in a logbook kept for this purpose and will include dates and times of assessments, the person making them, the results and action taken. Such records will be made available for inspection on demand by an authorised officer of South Bucks District Council.
- 4. The provision of Live and Recorded music and the Provision of facilities for dancing outdoors is to be limited to 10 occasions per year.
- 5. All users/hirers of the Licensed Premises will be informed in writing of the conditions attached to the Licence and the consequences should these Conditions be breached.
- 6. A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times at the Licensed Premises

- 7. Adequate lighting including external lighting and external security lighting will be installed and maintained at the Licensed Premises and working during all licensable activities.
- 8. All reasonable steps will be taken to ensure that people leaving the Licensed Premises do so in an orderly manner and do not in any way cause annoyance to residents and people passing by the Licensed Premises.
- 9. Details of the Premises Licensee and/or nominated deputy including their immediate contact telephone numbers will be displayed at the entrance of the Licensed Premises during evening events which include regulated entertainment.
- 10. A recognised proof of age policy will be enforced at the Licensed Premises at all times by the Management in relation to all potential purchasers who appear to be under the age of 21 years of age and will be in the form of photographic identification and a copy of the Proof of Age policy will be displayed in a prominent position in the Licensed Premises.
- 11. Advertising materials in the form of posters will be displayed within the Licensed Premises to work towards educating customers of the dangers of drink/driving and car crime/crime generally.
- 12. Customers will be prevented from taking alcoholic or other drinks from the Licensed Premises at all times.
- 13. 

Thank you for your application, which was received by this department on the 27th October 2009.

Further to the above application, please find hereunder my comments made in my capacity as the Responsible Authority in respect of the enforcement of Health α Safety and Environmental Health matters.

Whilst there is obvious potential for increased adverse impact upon the local environment and community from the change in both type and quantity of usage of the premises, such impact cannot at this stage be readily identified or assessed.

The degree of impact is directly dependant upon the level of diligence exercised by the supervisors of the premises through appropriate management control. This must be reflected in the steps you intend to take in order to promote the four licensing objectives of the Act, namely:

- The prevention of Crime and Disorder;
- Public Safety:
- The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
- The Protection of Children from Harm.

I am putting forward a recommendation to the Licensing Department that this application in its current format is refused on the grounds that the operating schedule should include further measures to control noise due to the potential impact internal and external regulated entertainment may have on neighbouring residents.

To fulfil the Licensing Objective the Prevention of Public Nuisance the applicant must demonstrate how they intend to manage any noise they create and I would like to see your operating schedule incorporate the following specific noise monitoring and control measures:

Specific Noise Monitoring and Control Measures:

- All windows and doors of the Licensed Premises will not be fixed open during all times Regulated Entertainment is taking place and will not be left open at any time thereafter until the end of that licensed session save for access and egress to and from the Licensed Premises.
- 2. Noise monitoring patrols at the external boundaries with neighbouring residential property of the Licensed Premises will take place at least hourly of the noise generated from the Licensed Premises, on every occasion when Regulated Entertainment is being offered at the Licensed Premises. Immediate steps will be taken to make the necessary adjustments to ensure noise is not heard beyond the perimeter of the Licensed Premises.

I would also draw your attention to the following Risk Factors/Activities and Suggested Control Measures outlined below, and would urge you also to incorporate those you find appropriate into your Operating Schedule, in order that you may more readily meet the objectives set out within the Act.

Risk Factors/Activities	Suggested Control Measures
Sound amplification systems and entertainment in general.	Measures to keep windows and doors closed - NB: for health and safety reasons ensure the premises are properly ventilated and access to emergency exits is not restricted. Provision of acoustically treated ventilation/air conditioning - allowing windows and doors to be closed. Use of a sound-lobby (with two sets of self-closing doors) at the entrance / exit of premises. Provision of sound insulation to emergency exit doors and extractor fans. Ensure speakers are kept within the premises and are not positioned near to openings such as doors or windows. Introduce measures to ensure music is not played outside the premises as a means of attracting custom. Ensure sound amplification systems are played through a sound-limiting device. Ensure use of anti-vibration mountings for speakers.
Ventilation, air-conditioning units, chiller-units and similar.	Introduce measures to ensure sound insulation to ventilation ductwork and outlets.
Noise from the handling of barrels, kegs, cylinders and bottles	Use of rubber matting and handling aids for the movement of barrels, cylinders, bottles etc. No removal of waste and bottles etc. late at night.

Vehicles, including those belonging to customers, taxis, and delivery vehicles	Ensure a designated taxi firm is used for staff and customers and discourage taxi drivers from using the vehicle horn to attract attention when collecting passengers. Arrange for all deliveries to be made at reasonable times.
Customers both inside and outside premises	Use signs to advise patrons and staff to be quiet when leaving premises.
Outdoor play areas and beer gardens	Provide solid fencing/barriers around car parking, play areas and beer gardens etc. The use of outdoor areas should only be at reasonable times.
Odour from waste and bottle store areas	Ensure sealed waste bins used are big enough to hold all waste and can be (and are) thoroughly cleaned. Ensure a reputable licensed waste carrier collects waste on a regular basis. Screen waste storage areas from sight and make sure the area can be properly cleaned and has adequate drainage. Determine and employ a regular cleaning programme for all storage areas and waste bins.
Odour from blocked and inadequately vented drainage systems	Ensure food waste is not put into the drainage system. Provide a grease-trap to the drainage outlet from kitchens. Regularly clean grease-traps and drainage systems. Ensure the head of the drainage system is vented at a high level using a vent stack.
Odour and noise from late night takeaways	Ensure the relevant planning controls have not been breached. Ensure odour does not build up through the use of products such as extractor fans. Display appropriate signs to encourage people to quickly disperse from the area to minimise nuisance and disturbance.
With extended drinking hours, and possible increased alcohol consumption, the potential for antisocial behaviour is much greater	Provide clean and accessible toilet facilities for use of customers. Through the use of suitable posters inside the premises and on litterbins, and through the provision of litterbins where appropriate, encourage customers to dispose of litter responsibly. Arrange for the area around the premises to be cleared of litter and fouling on a regular basis, and always at the close of business. Mobile traders - ensure they provide suitable waste bins and remove waste for proper disposal.

Outdoor lighting Introduce appropriate measures to prevent the 'overlighting' of an area. Use lighting with an appropriate output for the particular application, especially when selecting tungsten or halogenlight units. Ensure lighting beams are aimed away from sensitive areas or premises. Use properly designed screens, baffles, hoods and louvres in order to control the direction and spread of lighting beams. Turn off lighting when no longer required, and use timed automatic cut-offs where appropriate. Be aware of possible safety issues that may arise from the use of such equipment. Ensure any lights that are activated by photoelectric cells

If you agree to the suggested conditions before the end of the consultation period I will withdraw my representation.

The school already has existing rights to carry out events without permission and under normal circumstances these functions are carried out on a regular basis without untoward disruption to the neighbours. I therefore can see no reasonable grounds for this application unless the intended use is to hire out the premises to others outside the schools" use with more extensive use of the recently purchased marquee i.e. wedding receptions, promotion of bands/musical groups, anniversaries, birthday parties etc. My understanding is that a significant individual within the hierarchy of the school is the proprietor of an events company and the intention may be to include Dair House School as an attractive venue for functions that have no obvious link with the school thereby bringing into question the need to apply for planning permission for mixed use as opposed to, as it is currently, a school.

The A355 is already a very dangerous road and increased traffic would inevitably increase the risk of accidents particularly by those who might abuse the drink driving laws leaving what could effectively be a licensed premises.

In conclusion, I feel there is nothing wrong with the existing entertainment rights which causes little disturbance. To grant extended permission such has been applied for must therefore give rise to alternative motive/business pursuits.

With reference to the above-mentioned application, I wish my objections to be noted as follows:

In the application document, page I, Making Music Facilities are described as 'microphones, amplifier, karaoke machine, speakers etc to be used both inside and out'. This amount of noise to be heard all day and evening, even in the week and on Sundays, would be totally unreasonable and excessive for neighbouring residents. The Council should refuse this.

The supply of alcohol continuously from 10.00-23.00 Mondays to Sundays is totally inappropriate for a school where one would expect a high proportion of children to be present; its supply at a school should be prevented if at all possible and therefore it should not be allowed under this proposed premises licence. Only on a very occasional basis should a special licence be sought, as at present.

The school owns a very large field which is adjacent to it. The Council should require this to be used for parking when an event takes place – otherwise Fairfield Lane will be used for dangerous parking which will be exacerbated by the continuous provision of alcohol as proposed. The Head of the school has in the past actually advised parents to park in Fairfield Lane and when asked to request parents to refrain from parking on the pavements has declined to do so.

I hope you will consider my objections along with any others received from residents who were initially invited to respond (I was obliged to request a copy of the application). I see no reason for the Council to have assumed that my views are not relevant as I would suffer from the same noise and inconvenience as anybody else in the road.

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My main interest is in protecting my local area as much as possible and trying to stem the continuous 'whittling away' of its pleasant nature which has been happening over the last few years. I also see no reason why the Council should allow a private school to subsidise the children's parents by 'making life hell' for local residents.

Having read this application I wish to register my objection on the grounds of public nuisance and outline the following concerns;

- Live and recorded music would be permitted for the hours of 09.00 to 00.00 seven days a
 week, which could result in as many a 30 hours of continuous music in a weekend.
- I believe that outdoor live and recorded music being permitted on as many
 as 10 occasions a year is excessive considering both the applicant and the British climate
 which makes such events only really practical between June and September and as such
 would potentially be run as often as every other weekend during this period which is wholly
 unacceptable.
- When considering that these outdoor events are most likely held during the summer months
 when the school is closed I have strong concerns over who would be responsible for their
 organisation and management and as such ensure that they remain within the terms of any
 granted license.
 - With concerns over proper accountable management of these events by Dair House I can not help but consider the bleakest picture where I have visions of pleasant summer evenings in the garden spoilt by loud karaoke or dancing which is again wholly unacceptable in what is a quiet and peaceful area.
- It is also my understanding that should the license be granted and the school for what ever
 reason decide to move that the license remains with the property and as such could then be
 considered commercially attractive as a venue for a night club, or any venue providing adult
 entertainment with a formal alcohol license applicable seven days a week.

I believe that this application has been made with tittle if any thought for the local community, the potential infringement of our privacy due to our proximity to the school grounds and likely reduction in quality of life due to the provision of outdoor music is just not acceptable. Further to this any negative impact of such events held by the school on its neighbours may well be reflected by a devaluation of property prices in the immediate vicinity.

We have lived quite happily alongside Dair House School since it opened but now have grave reservations that should this ficense be granted that this will no longer be possible, and one wonders what further demands may be made in the future.

We are in receipt of your notice in respect of the above application and wish to object to a number of the proposals. Our house is situated immediately to the south of Dair House School and next to its grounds.

We wish to object to the application as submitted for it provides for music and entertainment of various types every day from 09.00 until late evening with the facility to supply alcohol on the premises. Our grounds of objection arise primarily from the noise causing a public nuisance and the resultant disturbance this will cause in a residential area.

The school is for the education of children between the ages of 3 and 11 years old and to see an application for the supply of alcohol on such premises from 10.00 to 23.00 seven days a week astounds us.

Our detailed comments on the application are as follows:

Plays (indoor): Monday to Sunday 09.00 – 22.00 acceptable provided sound is reduced so as not to cause a nuisance.

Plays (outdoors): Monday to Sunday 09.00 - 22.00 acceptable provided sound is reduced so as not to cause a nuisance and the number of occasions held is limited.

Films (indoors): Monday to Sunday 09.00 – 22.00 acceptable provided sound is reduced so as not to eause a nuisance.

Indoor Sporting Events: Monday to Sunday 09.00 - 18.00 no objection.

Live Music (indoor) Monday to Sunday 09.00 – 23.00 we object due to the misance of noise and the number hours and days requested. Provided the sound is kept at a level not to cause a misance between the hours of 09.00 -18.00 this would be acceptable but after 18.00 – 23.00 the occasions they may be held should be limited in number.

- Live Music (outdoor) Monday to Sunday 09.00 23.00 we object due to the nuisance of noise and the number of hours and days requested. Provided the sound is kept at a level not to cause a nuisance between the hours of 09.00 -18.00 this would be acceptable but after 18.00 to 23.00 the occasions they may be held should be limited in number.
- Recorded Music (indoor) Monday to Sunday 09.00 00.00 we object due to the nuisance of noise and the number of hours and days requested. Provided the sound is kept at a level not to cause a misance between the hours of 09.00 -18.00 this would be acceptable but after 18.00 to 00.00 the occasions they may be held should be limited in number.
 - Earlier this year the school had an indoor dance that did not finish until 01.00 and the noise level was so high not only could we clearly hear the boom of the bass and the drums but we could even identify the songs being played within our house. We were about to report the matter when to music stopped.
- Recorded Music (outdoor) Monday to Sunday 09.00 00.00 we object due to the nuisance of noise and the number of hours and days requested. Provided the sound is kept at a level not to cause a nuisance between the hours of 09.00 -18.00 this would be acceptable but after 18.00 to 00.00 the occasions they may be held should be limited in number.
- Performances of Dance (indoors): Monday to Sunday 09.00 -22.00 we object due to the nuisance of noise and the number of hours and days requested. Provided the sound is kept at a level not to cause a nuisance between the hours of 09.00 -18.00 this would be acceptable but after 18.00 to 22.00 the occasions they may be held is limited in number.
- Entertainment of a similar description to Live or recorded music (indoors & Outdoors): Monday to Sunday 09.00 22.00 our objection is the same as that for live and recorded music (indoor & outdoor) stated above.
- Provision of facilities for making music (indoor & outdoor Monday to Sunday 09.00 00.00 Our objection is the same as that for live and recorded music (indoor & outdoor) stated above.
- Provision of facilities for dancing (indoors & outdoors): Monday to Sunday 09.00 00.00 our objection is the same as that for performances of dance (indoors) as above and live and recorded music (indoor & outdoor) stated above.
- Supply of alcohol (on the premises): Monday to Sunday 10.00 + 23.00, (we thought Dair House was a school for children 3 to 1 years old). We object on the grounds that it will add to disorder; public safety through inebriation, causing a public nuisance through additional noise and the bringing of children into direct contact with alcohol does not protect them.
- Opening hours: Monday to Sunday 08.00 01.00 will cause us a nuisance through noise, at present this only occurs on a very few exceptional occasions.
- Live Music, Recorded Music and the Provision of facilities for dancing outdoors, to this should be added outdoor plays. We assume the request for the limit of 10 is inclusive of all these outdoor events. If this assumption is correct, then it is natural for us to assume they will take place during the summer term which in effect means that every weekend during the summer term we will suffer from exceptional noise nuisance and inconvenience. This is unreasonable and we consider that the limit should be reduced by half to 5 occasions.
- We also believe it reasonable to request that all indoor events covering live music, recorded music, dancing and plays taking place after 18.00 -00.00 be limited to 10 occasions per calendar year, plus on New Years Eve an additional event lasting until 01.00 on New Year day.

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The application seems to imply that Dair House School wishes to move into the realms of Public Hire with events taking place at their convenience without consideration of their close neighbours. Our experience shows that even when a school social event (such as a disco dance) is put on the noise in our house causes a missance and prevents us sleeping. We would also point out that our house is double glazed and we have cavity wall insulation throughout and this does not prevent the penetration of the music. Smokers do congregate outside and as the evening progresses and alcohol is consumed the noise becomes greater.

We consider it reasonable to continue with the pattern of noise as in the past but object strongly to the possibility of every evening becoming a nuisance through noise pollution.

We leave others to consider the increase in traffic movements on the busy Beaconsfield Road (A355).

We appreciate the licensing authority giving due consideration to our objections.

I refer to the above application. We have lived close to the school for many years with no problems but recently they have expanded and bought more land and we are now already subjected to far more noise nuisance, as there are children's activities not only during term time, but also during weekends, holidays, after school and at half-term. In September I wrote to the headmaster to complain about an evening event held in a marquee, when we were kept awake until nearly 2 am. by very loud music.

Re the list of items applied for, we would have no objection to any of these activities taking place indoors, with the proviso that there is adequate sound proofing, but would hope you will not grant permission for any outdoor activities, such as music, live or recorded, dancing or any other entertainment causing noise.

This is a quiet residential area and we, along with many of our neighbours, like to enjoy our gardens in good weather, neither do we want to sit indoors with all the doors and windows closed to try and keep out the loud music. I note that the application is for ten outdoor events per calendar year. I assume that it is not intended to hold these ten events during the winter months, so we would be driven from our gardens on at least ten occasions during the summer.

- Recorded music (indoors and outdoors) 09.00-00.00
- Provision of facilities for making music (indoors and outdoors) 09.00-00.00
- Entertainment of a similar description to Live or recorded music (indoors and outdoors) 09.00 22.00
- Supply of alcohol on the premises 10.00-23.00
- Opening hours Monday to Sunday 08.00-01.00

All of this relates to Monday through to Sunday!!

The permit request limiting certain activities to 10 occasions seems to have been worded particularly badly and because of this will create loopholes. Does this refer to live music and recorded music played outside or does it just refer to dancing outside? What about entertainment of a similar description to live or recorded music? There seems to be no limit to that.

Early on this year, on a Saturday, there was a live band; either at Dair House or the sports ground and it went on well past 11.00 and in the middle of summer we had to have the windows closed and then could just about hear the television.

Effectively this would enable the school to rent out its facilities to anybody and for them to play music inside at any time between 9.00 on a Monday morning to 00.00 on Sunday, without limitation. Due to the proximity of many homes to the school, I think this could create excessive noise in what is a relatively quiet neighbourhood.

I believe that my points above should prevent the planning application going through on the grounds of public nuisance.

Our house is located to the south of Dair House School and is one property removed from the school and its grounds.

We are concerned by the fact that the proposed uses for the school site under the licence will include music/entertainment events throughout the day, on any day of the week without restriction and until late very late at night. We have 2 young children and believe that such a licence will result in unrestricted public nuisance caused by noise, particularly in the evening and late at night, unnecessary disturbance in a quiet residential area and increased exposure to a risk of anti-social behaviour (including crime and disorder) and risk to public safety.

As with many of our neighbours, we are also surprised that a school with an intake of children between the ages of 3 and 11 years old seeks to obtain a

 - adequate provision is made for immediate response by the school (through a nominated officer appointed to 'police' events) so as to control and/or limit noise if there are complaints of unacceptable noise levels causing disturbance and/or nuisance to local residents
- Recorded Music (outdoor) Monday to Sunday 09.00 00.00 we object due to the likely public nuisance of noise and the number days and proposed hours. Acceptable provided that
 - the sound is kept at a level not to cause a nuisance between the hours of 09.00 -18.00
 - from 18.00 limited to 23.00 and the occasions they may be held should be limited in number and restricted to Fridays and Saturdays only and
 - adequate provision is made for immediate response by the school (through a nominated officer appointed to 'police' events) so as to control and/or limit noise if there are complaints of unacceptable noise levels causing disturbance and/or nuisance to local residents
- Performances of Dance (indoors): Monday to Sunday 09.00 -22.00 we object due to the likely public nuisance of noise and the number days and proposed hours. Acceptable provided that
 - the sound is kept at a level not to cause a nuisance between the hours of 09.00 -18.00

- from 18.00 to 22.00 the number of occasions they may be held should be limited in number
- adequate provision is made for immediate response by the school (through a nominated officer appointed to 'police' events) so as to control and/or limit noise if there are complaints of unacceptable noise levels causing disturbance and/or nuisance to local residents
- Entertainment of a similar description to Live or recorded music (Indoors & Outdoors): Monday to Sunday 09.00 – 22.00
 - Please refer to our objections for Live and Recorded music (Indoors & Outdoor) as stated above
- Provision of Facilities for making music (Indoors & Outdoors) Monday to Sunday 09.00 – 00.00
 - Please refer to our objections for Live and Recorded music (Indoors & Outdoors) stated above
- Provision of facilities for dancing (indoors & outdoors): Monday to Sunday 09.00 00.00
 - Please refer to our objections for Performances of Dance (Indoors) and Live and Recorded Music (Indoors & Outdoors) stated above
- Supply of alcohol (on the premises): Monday to Sunday 10.00 23.00 we object on the grounds that if will
 - increase the risk of crime and public disorder
 - increase the risk of anti-social behaviour
 - pose a risk to public safety
 - cause a public nuisance through additional noise
- Opening hours: Monday to Sunday 08.00 01.00 will cause a public nuisance through increased noise and traffic which at present is restricted to a few exceptional and generally acceptable occasions
- Live Music, Recorded Music and the Provision of facilities for dancing outdoors: to be limited to 10 occasions per calendar year. It is assumed that the majority of these events will be scheduled during the summer months, if this is the case then we object on the grounds that
 - the proposed events will take place during the whole of summer which would suggest that practically every weekend during

- summer will involve an event of some kind resulting in noise nuisance and inconvenience limiting/restricting our ability to enjoy the pleasure of our own property in peace.
- This is unreasonable and we believe that the limit should be reduced to 5 occasions.
- We also believe that Plays (Outdoors) should be included within this restriction as there will inevitably be audience noise.
- We also believe it reasonable to request that all indoor events covering live music, recorded music, dancing and plays taking place between 18.00 and 00.00 be limited to 10 occasions per calendar year.

General Comments

The application seems to imply that Dair House School wishes to move into the realms of public hire with events taking place at their convenience without consideration of their close neighbours. We have on previous, albeit rare occasions, been aware of outdoor events at the school involving music which has carried into our house to the extent that lyries of songs have been clearly audible despite closed windows making it difficult to sleep. During the summer months it is not unusual to keep windows open and the situation can only be made worse with an increase with private commercial events for which the school is not directly responsible.

Allowing the school to allow its premises to be used on a commercial basis will, in our opinion, only serve to increase the risk of noise disturbance, public nuisance, alcohol fuelled anti-social behaviour and public disorder and increase in traffic movements on the already busy Beaconsfield Road (A355).

We trust District Council and the Licensing Unit will give due consideration to the objections we have raised.
