#### 1 Apologies

Apologies were received from Cllr S Lambert.

#### 2 Minutes

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 2 December 2021 were agreed as a correct record.

#### 3 Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

#### 4 Buckinghamshire Electoral Review

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) had begun a consultation on the second stage of the electoral review of Buckinghamshire Council. The LGBCE was seeking views on a pattern of wards that should apply from the 2025 local election. This followed the previous consultation on 'council size' by the LGBCE, which was now minded to recommend a membership of 98 councillors. The consultation ran until 4 April (with Full Council approval scheduled for 27 April). However the Commission would like to see a draft proposal by 4 April. The Electoral Review Working Group were asked to develop a response to the consultation, making a recommendation to the Standards and General Purposes Sub-Committee as to a preferred pattern of wards, which had been arranged for 17 March 2022. Members were informed that they were also welcome to provide comments to the LGBCE individually as well as through the Electoral Review Working Group.

The Principal Governance Officer reported that the LGBCE had issued guidance on

'How to propose a pattern of wards' which was attached at Annex 1. There were three criteria which a proposal must address:-

- i) Delivering electoral equality for local voters ensuring that each local councillor represents roughly the same number of electors so that the value of a vote is the same regardless of where a person lives in the local authority area.
- ii) Reflecting the interests and identities of local communities establishing electoral arrangements which, as far as possible, maintain local ties and where boundaries were easily identifiable.
- **Promoting effective and convenient local government** ensuring that the new wards can be represented effectively by their elected representative(s), allowed the authority to conduct its business effectively; and adequately reflected the electoral cycle of the council.

Information was also provided on the electorate figures and mapping. The LGBCE had published electorate figures for consultees to use in framing a response. This was supplied to them by the Council. To achieve electoral equality, each councillor must represent roughly the same number of electors. The 2021 electorate for Buckinghamshire is 410,789. Based on a council size of 98, this equated to <u>an average electorate per councillor of 4,521</u>.

The 'electoral variance' in this context was the extent to which any proposed ward would result in a ratio of +/- 10%: i.e. above or below 4,521 electors per councillor. Annex 2 indicated what the electoral variance would be in such a scenario: 7 of the proposed wards would have a variance of either +/- 10%. In such a case, Members would ultimately need to suggest how the wards could be adjusted to achieve an acceptable electoral variance.

The Working Group of the full committee agreed to focus on Buckinghamshire as a whole, rather than become involved in detailed discussions of each individual ward – as there would be further opportunities to address details as part of the next phase of the review.

The LGBCE was invited to deliver briefings to all Buckinghamshire Councillors, and to parish and town councils, on the statutory criteria for a review. These took place on 28 February and 7 March for this Council, and 2 March and 9 March for parish and town councils.

The Electoral Review Working Group of this Committee had met twice, once online (24 February) and once in person (3 March) to work up a set of draft proposals for consideration by this Committee.

The Working Group:-

 had proposed a pattern of 50 wards based, largely, on two member representation for each ward, achieving 98 councillors overall apart from two

- wards where there would be single representation. The list of proposed wards and their names was attached at Annex 1 of the report. An interactive map was available.
- had been mindful that 'one size' does not fit all. As a new unitary authority, it
  was important that the pattern of wards supports communities and provides
  the best possible reflection of community identity and effective government.
  This had resulted in a proposal that included a mix of one- and two member
  representation per ward.
- had commented that the review represented an opportunity to provide a stable basis for electoral representation following a period of considerable structural change in local governance across Buckinghamshire. In framing its proposals, the Working Group had not thought it necessary to disregard existing ward arrangements where these already reflected good community identity. Equally it did not simply follow existing structures as an easy rule. Rather, each ward had been proposed based on the best balance of the three statutory criteria.
- was aware that there were a small number of areas where further detailed work on certain boundaries was potentially necessary to achieve better community identity. The Group was recommending that the Council engaged with the LGBCE, and stakeholders, on these proposals, with a view to working them up in more detail, particularly in the next phase of the consultation.

During discussion the following comments were made by a Member:-

- In terms of next steps the Member wanted to make sure that there
  would be opportunity at the next stage to make changes and that by
  agreeing to this first stage, this would not restrict suggestions later in the
  process. Given that there was time before early April it would be helpful
  to look at wards in more detail now to provide reassurance. This should
  be undertaken by the Working Group and recorded.
- On Recommendation 2, the Member referred to what extent do the powers of delegation extend to the Service Director for Legal and Democratic Services, "in consultation with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Committee..."? The Member expressed concerned that this recommendation enabled material changes to the draft submission without further recourse to the Electoral Review Working Group.
- On Recommendation 4, the Member asked who would determine if it
  was necessary for the Electoral Review Working Group to meet at further
  stages of the Review process? A preference would be to include this in
  the delegated authority to the Service Director for Legal and Democratic
  Services and notified to the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the
  Committee.
- On Paragraph 1.4, the Member asked whether the Ward Pattern proposed in the draft submission attached to the report reflect the output from the two Electoral Review Working Group meetings or was the output subsequently amended without further review by that Group?

 On Paragraph 4.5, it stated that further detailed work was necessary on certain boundaries to achieve better community identity. The Member asked whether a list could be provided of those areas identified to Group Leaders or to Members more widely.

The Chairman responded on process saying that the Council knew there was going to be a second phase of consultation which should commence in July which would look at that detailed work. Phase 1 related to submitting a broad warding pattern. The second phase would be based on proposals from the Local Government Boundary Commission for England once it had reviewed submissions and made its own local investigations. This was why it was important to put something forward at this stage so that the Council had an input before the Boundary Commission arrived at its own proposal, and to give the Council the opportunity to shape it. In terms of Recommendation 4 the Working Group would continue to operate and would start to look at detailed work now before the second phase of the consultation. He referred to concerns about changes made to the proposal after the Working Group had met which was to Booker, Cressex and Castlefield. The reason for this was because of the volume of data being scrutinised; when the revised figures had been put into the spreadsheet there was a higher variance than expected so the Chairman had requested that two streets be moved into another ward based in the interest of electoral equality. These kind of issues needed to be looked at in more detail in the second stage.

The Principal Governance Officer reported that in terms of the delegation to the Service Director this was purely on presentational issues to send to the Boundary Commission and there would not be any additional changes. He also added further reasons why it would be helpful for the Working Group to meet: if the Boundary Commission came back with any questions where issues had been raised in the consultation by local bodies; and then during the next consultative phase which would run from 5 July to 12 September 2022. The proposal then may be based on the Council's submission or it could be a different proposal; in either case the Working Group would be well placed to examine the detail and make recommendations as to the Council's response.

The Member asked if any further changes could be made before April, however the Chairman reported that if anything was changed it would have to be considered by a further meeting of the Standards and General Purposes Committee and there was not enough time for amendments. The Chairman offered to provide briefings to Members, if requested during the remaining phases to ensure an open and transparent process.

Following this discussion some further points were made:-

 A Member made reference to the point that a comment had been made that the Boundary Commission were minded to agree 98 councillors which some Members were not happy with. This Committee had recommended 120 councillors which they felt was more representative of workload and would attract more candidates to stand for election as councillors, particularly those who work. He also expressed concern that the Boundary Commission were skilled at numbers but obviously needed to rely on the consultation to listen to local communities. In response it was noted that the Boundary Commission had made a decision on 98 councillors following an extended consultation period. This was now a given criteria. Any proposal from the Council that suggested anything other than a minor difference would likely be set aside by the Boundary Commission as it was not compliant with the parameters they have set for the consultation. If a good case was put forward then the Boundary Commission may consider increasing the number e.g. to 99 councillors.

- The Member also expressed concern about the 48 two member wards, and the two single member wards, and commented that there could be more areas that were better suited to one or three member wards and hoped that there would be flexibility to address this in the second stage. In response it was noted that in the second stage if the Commission was minded to follow the Council's proposal, then further revision may be possible. This was why the proposal noted that there were some areas such as Wycombe and Aylesbury that Members may wish to flag up and work on further with the Boundary Commission.
- A Member commented that the role of the councillor was an evolving one and there were now alternative ways of working. He supported the proposal and the basic parameters that had been set out. The majority of wards would work well with the two councillor model and where not, other alternative proposals could be put forward in discussion with local communities.
- A Member emphasised that it was important to put forward a good case to the Boundary Commission based on a balance of the criteria.
- Once a final decision had been made by the Commission, there was no right of appeal.

The Chairman thanked the officer team for providing detailed support at short notice and also thanked Members for their constructive comments and support.

The following recommendations were proposed by Cllr B Chapple, seconded by Cllr S Chokkar and were agreed by the Committee, with two abstentions.

#### **RECOMMENDED to Full Council that:-**

- (1) the draft submission be approved, in principle, to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England on a future pattern of wards for Buckinghamshire Council based on the approach in paragraph 4 and Annex 1 of the report; and
- (2) the finalising of the draft submission, based on this proposal, be delegated to the Service Director for Legal and Democratic Services, in consultation with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Committee and in liaison as necessary with the Commission; and

- (3) the proposal be endorsed as the basis of the Council's formal submission, at this Stage of the Electoral Review process; and
- (4) the Electoral Review Working Group of this Committee continues to meet as necessary, to consider any ongoing liaison with, or proposals from, the Commission at further stages of the Review process.

#### Reason for decision:

The Committee has oversight of Member Code of Conduct Complaints both for this Council and for parish and town councils. The report provides an annual review of the complaints received during 2021/22 and of the effectiveness of the arrangements for handling them. The report addresses concerns and queries raised by the Committee during the year.

#### 1. Executive summary

1.1 This report provides the Committee with a review of the Member Code of Conduct complaints received during 2021/22. It also outlines the effectiveness of the procedure and addresses concerns from members previously as regards greater transparency and as to timeframes.

#### 2. Review of Complaints and Procedure

- 2.1 During the year, the Committee asked for greater transparency about the timeliness and nature of member code of conduct complaints. This report therefore addresses four points:
  - A) An outline of complaints closed differentiating between those for this Council and those relating to parish/town councils; and including an indication of the nature and outcome of each.
  - B) An indication of the time taken to address the complaints throughout the year mindful of the Committee's concerns about achieving a more proportionate and timely approach
  - C) Current complaints
  - D) A review of the procedure itself with an indication of the planned action if the Committee agrees.

#### 2.3 Closed Complaints

- 2.2 Appendices 1 and 2 set out the complaints received and concluded in 2021/22: appendix 1 relates to Buckinghamshire Council; appendix 2 to parish and town councils. It will be clear from these that the Council received more complaints about parish/town councils than about its own members.
- 2.3 In the appendices, an indication is given of:
  - Time taken from start to finish
  - b) The aspect of the Code of Conduct which the complainant alleged had been breached
  - c) The stage of the process at which the complaint was resolved
- 2.4 From this, the following headlines are clear.
- 2.5 Only one **breach** of the Code was formally found; and the **average time** taken to complete a case is shown below:

- 2.6 The Committee noted in the Autumn that complaints had not always moved on, during the year, as swiftly as envisaged within the procedures. Partly this was due to resourcing, which was supplemented early in the New Year. It was also noted that the earliest stages of the process are important. There is an essential element of information exchange at these stages: clarifying the complaint, ensuring that the person complained about has an opportunity to respond; and the complainant then being asked if they are satisfied or not.
- 2.7 As explained in paragraph 2.18 below, it is proposed to review the timeframes within the Council's procedures against other authorities' practice.
- 2.8 **Stage concluded**: Other than one town council complaint (raised by seven complainants and not included in the following table), which reached Stage 3, all other complaints were concluded at either Initial Assessment or Stage 1.

2.9 **Code allegations:** The most alleged breach was against the principle of 'Respect'; that is, that a councillor failed to demonstrate respect to an individual or to the community. Some complaints raised more than one Code principle.

#### 2.10 Current complaints

- 2.11 Only eight complaints are currently live, all relating to parish and town councils. Seven of these allegations relate to one parish councillor, over four separate matters. They are necessarily being taken together and are currently at Stage 2.
- 2.12 The eighth is an outstanding matter from 2021/22 which will shortly be concluded within Stage 1.

#### 2.13 The process and actions for 2022/23

- 2.14 This Council's procedures include an initial assessment and then three formal stages. This is set out as a flowchart in appendix 3, together with an indication of the timeframes at each stage. The process consists of:
  - a) An initial assessment to determine whether a councillor was acting as a councillor at the time of the alleged breach; and whether if proven, the matter would amount to a breach of the Code.

- b) Stage One the subject member is asked to comment along with any suggestion to resolve the complaint (if appropriate)
- Stage Two the Monitoring Officer or Deputy Monitoring Officer determines if an informal resolution is possible or whether an investigation should take place
- d) Stage Three formal investigation, with a report presented to a meeting of the Hearing Sub-Committee of this Committee, if necessary.
- 2.15 During 2021/22, it is significant that only one issue was dealt with at Stage 3. That complaint was not only complex but was also contested.
- 2.16 It is encouraging that all other complaints were resolved at either the Initial Assessment stage or Stage One.
- 2.17 It is important that procedures are proportionate. It's therefore intended to carry out a benchmarking exercise against a range of other authorities' procedures to identify if there are changes that could be made to timeframes or the approach generally. The outcome of that review will be reported to the next meeting of the Committee.
- 2.18 Given the number of complaints relating to parish and town councils, the Monitoring Officer will also be liaising with the Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes Association of Local Councils to explore what training could usefully be offered to members of parish and town councils, and their clerks, about code of conduct matters.

#### 3. Other options considered

3.1 This report is an annual review of member code of conduct complaints and the arrangements for dealing with them. There are no alternative means of addressing this other than a report to this Committee which has oversight for member ethical governance.

#### 4. Legal and financial implications

- 4.1 There are no direct financial implications arising from this report.
- 4.2 Under the Localism Act 2011, Buckinghamshire Council has a duty to investigate complaints that a councillor of this Council or of a parish and town council may have breached the Code. This report gives feedback to the Committee on the activity undertaken by the Council in fulfilment of that duty.

#### 5. Next steps and review

5.1 A report will be made to the next meeting of the Committee with an update on current, and any new complaints. An update will also be given on the proposed benchmarking exercise about the stages of our process and the timeframes of them.




#### **Buckinghamshire Council – Councillor Complaints Process**

Recommendations: The Committees is recommended:-

1. To note and endorse the proposed changes to the Constitution as set out in Appendix 1;

subject to any changes proposed, to recommend that Full Council adopt the proposed changes;

3. to recommend to Full Council the appropriate delegations to the Monitoring Officer, in consultation with the Members' Constitutional Working Group, to finalise the textual changes to the constitution following approval of the principles

as set out in Appendix 1.

**Reason for decision:** To give effect to proposed updates to the Council's

Constitution to allow for better and more transparent

decision-making.

#### 1. Content of report

1.1 Under s9P Local Government Act 2000 the Council is required to prepare and keep up to date a Constitution containing the standing orders of the Council and such

other information as is required or is desirable. Buckinghamshire Council's Constitution was effective as from 1 April 2020 and is regularly reviewed to ensure the Council's operation is properly supported and governed by the Constitution. The last review took place in April 2021.

- 1.2 Oversight of the Constitution is shared between the Audit and Governance Committee and the Standards and General Purposes Committee. The power to change the Constitution is reserved to full Council via recommendation from the Standards and General Purposes Committee. The Monitoring Officer also has delegated authority to make amendments to ensure the Council conducts itself lawfully, and minor amendments where appropriate.
- 1.3 A Constitution Members Working Group consisting of the Chairmen and Vice-chairmen of both the Audit and Governance Committee and the Standards and General Purposes Committee has met a number of times to consider proposed changes and provide initial comments to help inform the review of the Constitution as required by full Council. Feedback from appropriate members and officers to the proposals has also been obtained.
- 1.4 The Committee will note that within Appendix 1 the changes are set out in principle to allow drafting of the proposed changes to take account of member feedback, further legal input or ensure other affected parts of the Constitution can be amended accordingly. It is therefore recommended that the Monitoring Officer determines the final wording of the in-principle proposals and any associated/incidental amendments with the approval of the Constitution Working Group, and to then change the Constitution accordingly together with any other necessary incidental amendments.
- 1.5 On the 22 March 2022 the Audit & Governance Committee considered the proposed changes to the Constitution as outlined in Appendix 1 and approved them. They made a number of suggestions to improve on the reasons for the changes proposed which have been incorporated into the Appendix to this report.

#### 2. Other options considered

2.1 The proposed changes are considered desirable to allow the Council to operate more effectively, however amendments could also be delayed to allow greater feedback on the proposed changes.

#### 3. Legal and financial implications

3.1 None except as set out in the body of the report.

#### 4. Corporate implications

4.1 The effectiveness of the Constitution is central to the operation of the Council as a whole and supports transparency, governance and good decision making. Reviews to ensure the Constitution is fit for purpose and effective should be undertaken regularly.

#### 5. Local councillors & community boards consultation & views

5.1 The Constitution will be updated on the Council's website and will be communicated to members and officers when appropriate to ensure the correct procedures are being used.

#### 6. Communication, engagement & further consultation

#### 7. Next steps and review

7.1 Changes to the Constitution will require the approval of Full Council. A paper outlining the proposed changes will be presented to the Council meeting scheduled for the 27 April 2022.

# Buckinghamshire Council Electoral Review 2022 DRAFT Response to Consultation on Pattern of Wards

- The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is undertaking an electoral review of Buckinghamshire Council. This submission is the Council's draft response to the Commission's consultation on the pattern of wards to apply from the 2025 council elections.
- 2. Our response has taken into account the Commission's <u>published criteria</u> for achieving a pattern of wards:
  - Electoral equality
  - Community identity
  - Effective local government
- 3. We have taken into account the Commission's recommendation of 98 councillors as the target 'council size'. As such, we have followed the councillor-elector ratio of one councillor per 4,521 electors, based on the projected 2027 electorate published by the Commission.

#### Our draft proposal

A pattern of 50 wards – comprising two one-member and 48 two-member wards. The list of proposed wards and their names is attached at **Annex 1.** 

**Annex 2** items the changes and the variances. **Annex 3** maps the proposals in PDF. An interactive version is here.

- 4. The Council has been very mindful that 'one size' does not fit all. It has been important to us, in recommending a pattern of wards, that our recommendations should involve a pattern of representation suited to our communities.
- 5. In framing our proposals, we have not simply followed existing structures as an easy rule. We have sought to ensure our proposals reflect, and promote, community identity. Neither have we have we thought it necessary simply to disregard existing ward arrangements if there have been good reasons to build on them.
- 6. In our view, the review represents an opportunity to provide a stable basis for electoral representation after a period of considerable structural change for Buckinghamshire's local governance. As a new unitary authority, it is important that the pattern of wards meets the needs of our communities and provides the best possible reflection of community identity and effective government.
- 7. We are a member-led authority which sees our democratic relationship with the electorate and local communities as pivotal to Buckinghamshire's future. This perspective has been important to us from the outset; for example as expressed through our 16 innovative community boards, which provide action-based local forums where

- our elected members meet regularly with parish and town councils, community groups and local stakeholders to identify key local priorities.
- 8. Our proposals are consistent with sustaining this effective, community-based commitment to local governance.
- 9. The proposals were worked up by a cross-party Electoral Review Working Group of the Standards & General Purposes Committee of Buckinghamshire Council. The Group met twice over February and March, making a recommendation to the Committee on 17 March, which was approved, with no votes against. With the agreement of the Commission, our Full Council will formally consider the proposal on 27 April, for final submission.

#### Draft proposals – further work

- 10. This is the Council's draft submission, which gives the broad proposal that the Council wishes to make. We are conscious that several areas still require attention, and we will work on these prior to Full Council and would also value working closely with the Commission.
- 11. We are conscious that the areas around Wycombe and Aylesbury require additional attention to ensure a sound balance of the three criteria: for example, while the draft proposals around Wycombe provide good electoral equality, we would like to explore the potential for increasing yet further the degree of community identity.
- 12. Also, while 96% our ward proposals achieve electoral equality within +/- 10% of the target figure, seven wards require further attention, five of these only marginally so. Our draft proposal for Aston Clinton and Weston Turville reflects community identity but requires further work to bring a better balance of electoral variance.
- 13. Our Electoral Review Working Group will continue to meet to explore further options for these areas. We would particularly value working closely with the Commission during its own fact-finding phase to explore those options. We would welcome such dialogue now, following our submission, and throughout the next formal consultation period.
- 14. We will articulate our submission further. However, we wanted the Commission to see, in draft form, the direction of the Council's thinking and aspiration.



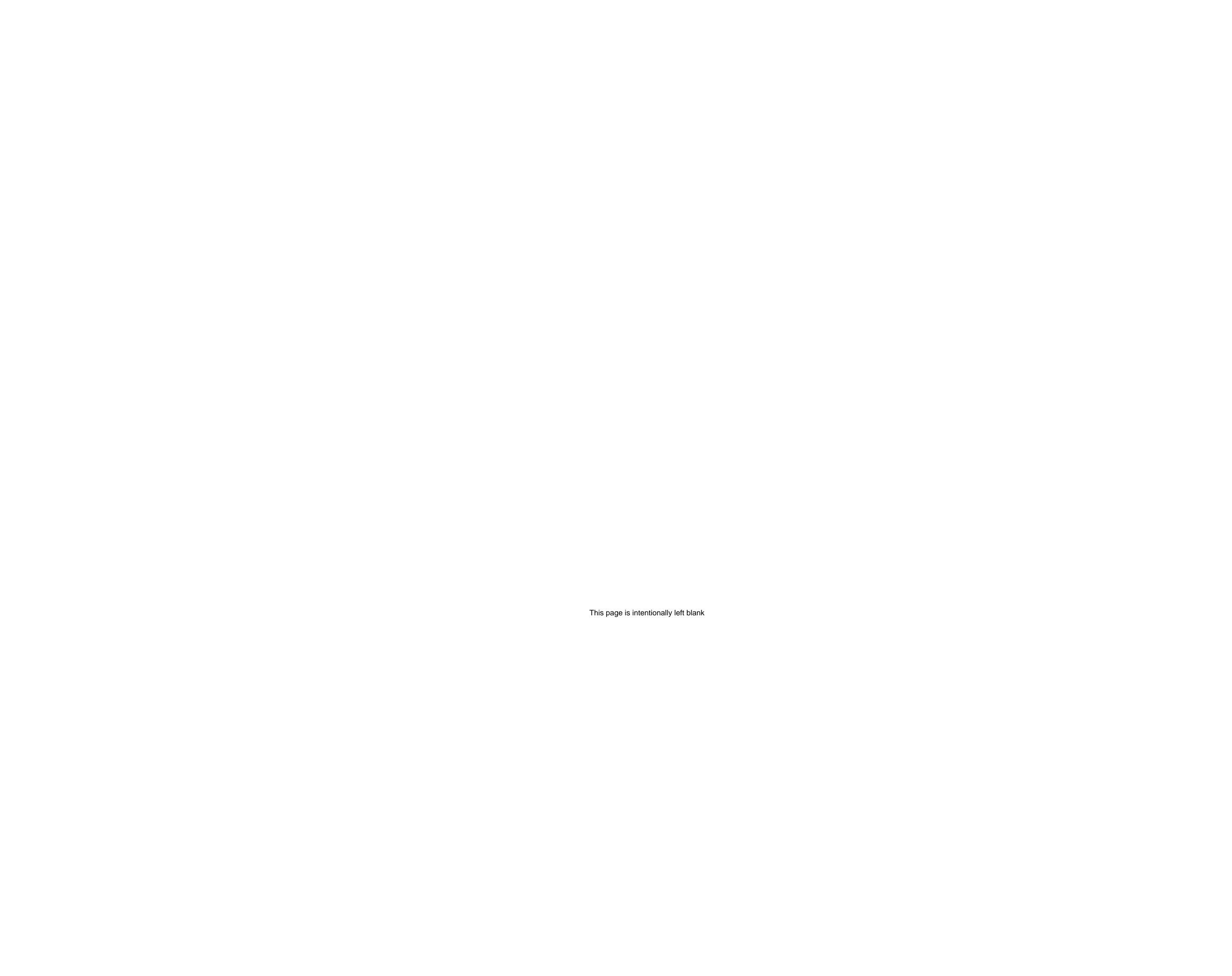
