Reasons for the Panel's Decision

In making their decision, the Panel considered the Application and written representations in support of and against the application.

The Panel also took account of the legislative provisions and the Street Trading Policy for the legacy Chiltern area and the factors to be considered including public safety; public order; the avoidance of public nuisance and the highway.

In particular, the Panel noted para 4.14 of the Policy and applying the Policy refused the Application for Consent for the following reasons:

- a. A significant effect on road safety would arise either from the siting of the trading activity itself, or from customers visiting or leaving the site;
- b. Whilst noting that competition issues are not a consideration, there is already adequate like provision in the immediate vicinity of the site to be used for street trading purposes.
- c. There is a conflict with Traffic Orders and waiting restrictions.
- d. The trading unit would obstruct the safe passage of users of the footway or carriageway.
