

The Haddenham and Thame Greenway and Haddenham to Aylesbury Greenway schemes form part of a wider aspiration to provide safe walking and cycling connections between Thame-Haddenham-Aylesbury. Haddenham and Thame Greenway

In partnership with Oxfordshire County Council and Sustrans, Buckinghamshire Council officers are investigating an aspirational off-road walking and cycling route between Haddenham and Thame Parkway Rail Station and Thame, referred to as the Haddenham and Thame Greenway.

Background work on the scheme continues to be progressed. An online public survey was recently conducted to understand current travel behaviours and the potential benefits of the scheme. The survey attracted a total of 2012 responses with 94% of respondents stating that they would use an off-road if one was delivered. Haddenham to Aylesbury Greenway

An off-road route walking and cycling route connecting Haddenham and Aylesbury (via the existing Pebble Way in Stone) is being investigated by Buckinghamshire Council and Greenways and Cycleroutes, who led on the successful Waddesdon Greenway. A first section of the Haddenham to Aylesbury route (Green Lane) was delivered in 2018 and background work on the remaining sections is being progressed.
