Notes:

- John O’Keeffe was leading on the CCTV installation for Gerrards Cross, with 27 cameras coming on board
 - A license would be needed for each person required to see the footage
 - There is a conversation being had around who would take over the costs to run the signal of the cameras from Gerrards Cross to TVP.
 - There would also be a monitoring charge for this
 - John estimated that each static, fixed camera would cost £200
 - John estimated that 10 cameras might suffice for Chalfont St Peter
- Anthony Shinner expressed that the main interests of Chalfont St Peter in terms of this sub-group was around anti-social behaviour and CCTV.
 - There was to be some upgrading of the current 2 CCTV cameras by the former Chiltern District Council, and an addition of a third camera.
 - The Neighbourhood Action Group (NAG) would be next meeting on the 16th September at 6pm, via Zoom, and the sub-group would be more than welcome to attend.
- It was found that both Gerrards Cross and Chalfont St Peter have a lot of similarities in terms of their Community Safety priorities
- The Quietway
 - At a meeting of the Gerrards Cross Town Council on Monday 7th September, it was agreed it would be preferable to remove it
 - All agreed that this should have no bearing on the outcome of the quietway within Chalfont St Peter.
- Parking
 - It was shared that the free parking in CSP was paid for by the Parish Council
- Reporting Issues
 - There was frustration at the length of time it takes to get through on 101
 - Suggestion of trying to find a non-crime link or email address for reporting purposes
 - Also a suggestion that a more user-friendly way of reporting multiples crimes was needed
- Public Space Protection Orders
 - Noted that there was one at the park next to Robertswood School, and that this had been worth the work it took to put it in place.
