Decision

Approval to make the Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) as set out in this report.

Reasons for the decision

1. The scheme aims to control the competing demands for the available parking space whilst preventing obstructive parking to improve both road safety and the environment for local residents and others by introducing “No Waiting At Any Time/No Loading At Any Time”, “Disabled Badge Holders Only” and Limited Waiting 20 Mins No Return 1 Hour Mon-Sat 10am to 4pm” restrictions on Hannon Road, Aylesbury.
2. The parking and waiting order is to be made in conjunction with the Buckinghamshire Countywide consolidation order for all Traffic Regulation Orders. This is due to be advertised on 6th November 2020 with a programmed final decision date/operational date of 19th February 2020.
3. Funding for the consultation and implementation was secured from Section 106 funds.
4. The additional income received from penalty charge notices will support Buckinghamshire Council in providing regular patrols in the town of Aylesbury.

Authority to take this decision

Council scheme of delegation contained within the Councils constitution.

Other options available, and their pros and cons

Not to proceed with the proposed changes may result in access for the emergency services being blocked and would not address the issues raised by and residents and businesses in this location.

To partially implement the proposed changes, would only partly address the issues raised by residents and businesses of the area.

Feedback from Consultation

- 1 These measures were advertised and promoted locally through a Statutory Consultation process carried out between Friday the 22nd November 2019 and Sunday the 15th December 2019 in accordance with the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 ("the TRO Regulations") copies of the Statutory Consultation Documents can be found in the appendices below.
- 2 The Police, Fire and Rescue Service and Ambulance Service were made aware of the consultation. No response has been received for the proposal as advertised.
- 3 Details of the proposed scheme were placed on the authorities' web site (see appendix 3) and notices were placed on site informing the public of the formal statutory consultation and the road names and locations affected and how they could obtain more information and provide feedback. The draft notice was also advertised in the local press.
- 4 The area falls in the Aylesbury West ward and the councillors for this ward have been contacted with details of this consultation and comments were received from Cllr S Lambert, who supports the scheme as advertised, no other comments were received from the other ward councillors.
- 5 From the public one submission was received supporting the scheme and no objections from the public or the Town Council.
