



## Chesham Community Board Funding – Summary from the Funding working group

This update provides a summary of the applications received, the amounts requested and the comments and recommendations of the group to be considered and agreed by the board.

The group met on the 8th March to consider the fourth round of funding applications received. VAS – Following the higher than previously anticipated costings, a meeting took place with TfB. The discussion was productive and TfB have agreed to get back to the board with the revised PID for the 4 VAS. It was highlighted that PIDs are not quotes.

NB - each Community Board can allocate a maximum of 50% of its Community Area Priorities Fund towards transport / highways projects.

Please note that Highways/Transport schemes offering 50% match funding will be prioritised by TfB.
