Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)

Aylesbury Vale District Council ("the Council") in accordance with section 82 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 ("the 2007 Act"), has undertaken a community governance review and made recommendations dated 12th December 2018.

The Council has decided to give effect to those recommendations and, in accordance with section 93 of the 2007 Act, has consulted with the local government electors and other interested persons and has had regard to the need to secure that community governance reflects the identities and interests of the community and is effective and convenient:

The Council, in accordance with section 100 of the 2007 Act, has had regard to guidance issued under that section:

The Council makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 86, 98(3), 98(4) and 240(10) of the 2007 Act.

Citation and commencement

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Aylesbury Vale (Reorganisation of Community Governance) Order 2019.
(2) This Order comes into force:-
 - (a) for the purpose of proceedings preliminary or relating to the election of councillors, on the day after it is made;
 - (b) for all other purposes, the Order comes into force on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2020.

Interpretation

2. In this Order -

- “district” means the district of Aylesbury Vale;
- “existing” means existing on the date this Order is made;
- “map” means the map marked “Map referred to in the Aylesbury Vale (Reorganisation of Community Governance) Order 2019” and deposited in accordance with Section 96(4) of the 2007 Act: and any reference to a numbered sheet is a reference to the sheet of the map which bears that number;
- “new ward” means the wards constituted by article 4;
- “ordinary day of election of councillors” has the meaning given by section 37 of the Representation of the People Act 1983 as amended by “The Districts of Aylesbury Vale, Chiltern, South Bucks and Wycombe (Changes to Years of Elections) Order 2018 (2018 No. 1355)”.
- “registration officer” means an officer appointed for the purpose of, and in accordance with, section 8 of the Representation of the People Act 1983.

Effect of Order

3. This Order has effect subject to any agreement under section 99 (agreements about incidental matters) of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 relevant to any provision of this Order.

Constitution of wards for the parish of Berton with Broughton

4. (1) New warding arrangements outlined with a red line on the map, shall be constituted for the parish of Berton with Broughton.
- (2) The name of the new wards will be Berton, Kingsbrook, Oldhams Meadow and Broughton Hamlet.

Number of parish councillors for the parish of Bierton with Broughton

5. The number of councillors to be elected for the parish of Bierton with Broughton shall be 12, and as follows:-

Bierton Ward: 7 councillors
Kingsbrook Ward: 3 councillors
Oldhams Meadow: 1 councillor
Broughton Hamlet: 1 councillor

Number of parish councillors for the parish of Berryfields

6. The number of councillors to be elected for the parish of Berryfields shall be varied from 12 to 10.

Number of parish councillors for the parish of Mentmore

7. The number of councillors to be elected for the parish of Mentmore shall be varied from 5 to 7.

Number of parish councillors for the parish of Pitstone

8. The number of councillors to be elected for the parish of Pitstone shall be varied from 10 to 11.

Electoral register

9. The registration officer of the district shall make such rearrangement of, or adaption of, the register of local government electors as may be necessary for the purposes of, and in consequence of, this Order.

Order date

10. This Order is in accordance with article 1(2) for the purposes of the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) (England) Regulations 2008.

EXPLANATORY NOTE
(This is not part of the Order)

This Order gives effect to recommendations made by Aylesbury Vale District Council for the alteration of warding arrangements for the parish of Bierton with Broughton, and changes to the number of councillors elected at Bierton with Broughton, Berryfields, Mentmore and Pitstone Parish Councils.

The new warding arrangements for the parish of Bierton with Broughton will have effect from 1 April 2020. The electoral agreements apply in respect of parish elections to be held on and after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2020.

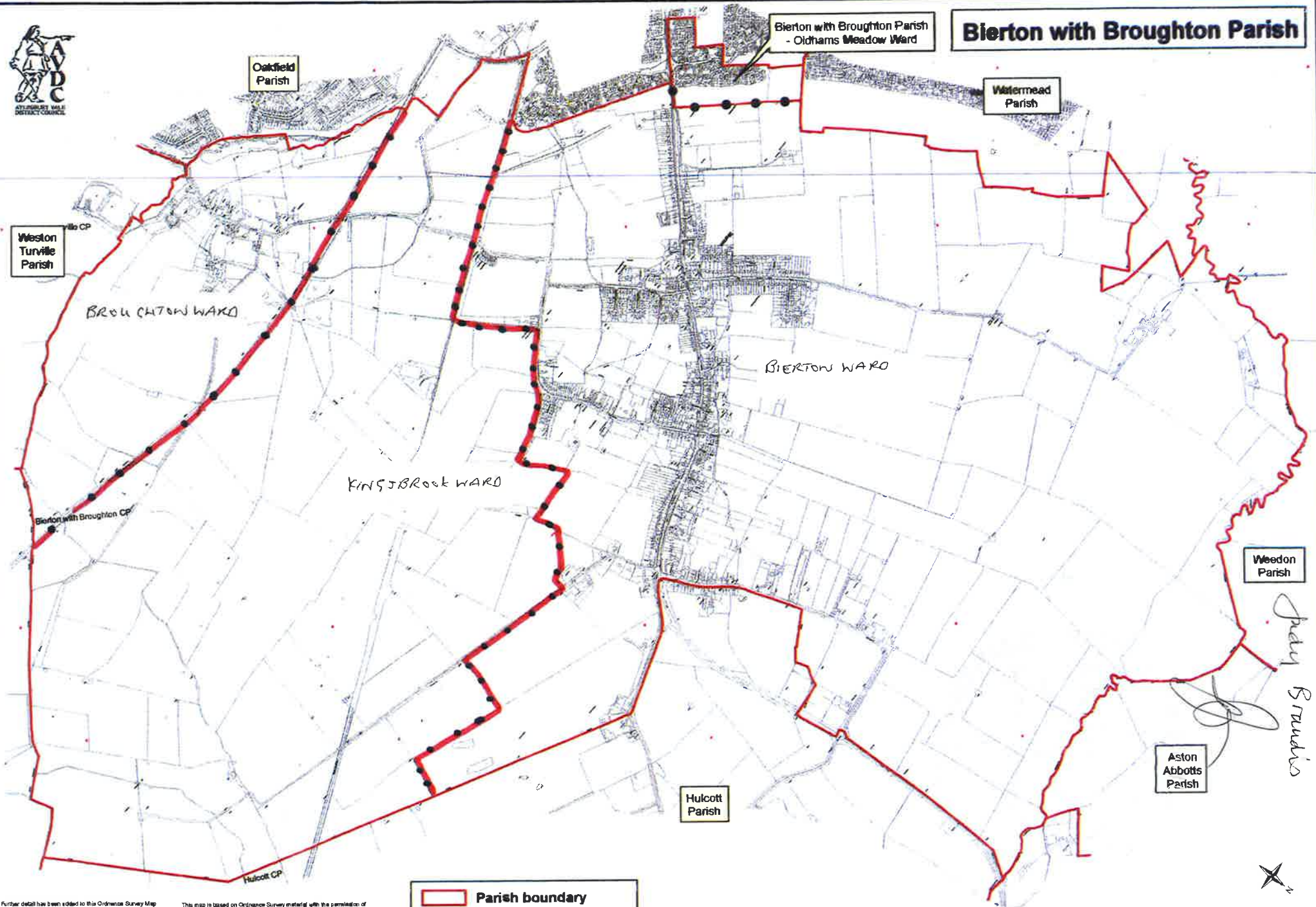
Article 4 specifies the new warding arrangements in the parish of Bierton with Broughton.

Article 9 obliges the Electoral Registration Officer to make any necessary amendments to the electoral register to reflect the new electoral arrangements.
